Artificial Intelligence (AI) has been transforming healthcare delivery and holds great promise in helping medical professionals gain key insights and improve health outcomes. A deep need exists for AI to address healthcare problems such as chronic illness, workforce shortages and hospital readmissions. It has gained certain maturity, even in India, and is not anymore at infancy stage.

The challenge now is to make healthcare delivery and infrastructure smarter with the objective of making the same more cost efficient, i.e., more affordable for the end consumers or patients.

- Al broke new grounds in the pharma and healthcare domains in 2022, and is expected to very soon become evidence-based technology, providing healthcare professionals better care facilities and improving their business performance.
- Data advancement will enable feeding large amounts to machine learning (ML) models, to simulate large numbers of people with diseases, for better performance of hypothesis. This will make research more accurate, scalable, and an economically feasible replacement for real-world records in order to generate large training datasets and reduce restrictions with the use of sensitive data.
- Using AI to improve data quality could create a virtuous cycle for technology to improve exponentially.
