This initiative, following the success of the inaugural edition held from May 19<sup>th</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2024, focused on promoting responsible ocean tourism while offering participants an exclusive opportunity to explore the region's rich marine biodiversity. The Chamber designed the initiative to not only provide an adventurous experience but also emphasize conservation, awareness, and local community engagement.

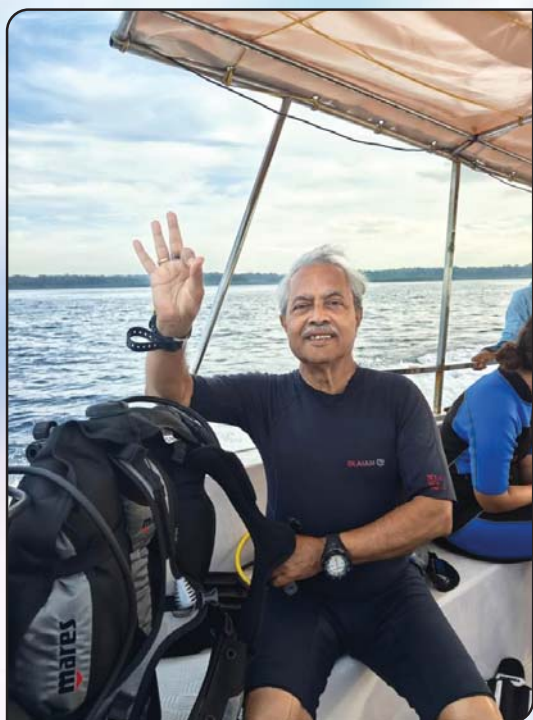
The initiative attracted a diverse range of participants, including professional divers, adventure enthusiasts, marine conservationists, and tourism industry stakeholders. Over five days, attendees enjoyed guided diving sessions led by internationally certified dive instructors, exploring vibrant coral reefs, colorful marine life, and historic shipwreck sites such as Elephant Beach, The Wall, Seduction Point, and Dixon's Pinnacle.

This edition placed a strong emphasis on marine conservation and sustainability, partnering with local diving operators, marine biologists, and environmental organizations to conduct awareness sessions on coral reef preservation, responsible

diving practices, and the impacts of climate change on marine ecosystems. The Chamber collaborated with Dive India to offer diving courses during the programme, ensuring that participants received the best training from a renowned and trusted diving operator. Participants were encouraged to follow eco-friendly diving protocols, ensuring minimal impact on the marine environment.

A notable feature of this edition was the active involvement of Mr. B.B. ## ANNUAL SHIPPING & LOGISTICS CONCLAVE 2025

The National Committee of Shipping and Logistics of The Bengal Chamber of Commerce & Industry (BCC&I) successfully hosted the Annual Shipping and Logistics Conclave 2025 – Northeast Edition on January 28, 2025. This high-impact conclave brought together key industry stakeholders, policymakers, and experts to discuss the challenges, opportunities, and advancements in shipping and logistics within the Northeast region. This conclave served as an important platform to foster collaboration, spark innovation, and drive strategic policy discussions aimed at enhancing connectivity, accelerating economic growth, and strengthening India's position in the global supply chain.

The conclave commenced with the ceremonial lighting of the lamp by the Hon'ble Minister, Shri Santanu Thakur, Minister of State for Ports, Shipping, and Waterways, Government of India, along with other distinguished dignitaries. This was followed by the Inaugural Session, which focused on the experiences, challenges, and advantages of utilizing ports for EXIM (Export-Import) activities. The Welcome Address was delivered by **Mr. Debashis Dutta**, Chairperson of the National Shipping and Logistics Committee, BCC&I. He emphasized how BCC&I can take the lead in drafting a comprehensive plan for the North East's growth. Through our National Shipping and Logistics Committee, the focus is on enhancing connectivity, promoting sustainable infrastructure, and unlocking trade and investment opportunities, positioning the North East as a key player in India's maritime and logistics ecosystem. Subsequently, **Mr. Subhodip Ghosh**, Director General, BCC&I, presented a special address outlining the Chamber's activities, achievements, and the journey of the National Shipping and Logistics Committee. The session also featured special addresses by Guest of Honours, including **Mr. Bhaskar Jyoti Phukan**, Managing Director, Numaligarh Refinery Limited; **Mr. Yogpal Singh**, Director - Corporate Affairs, Subcontinent, DP World; **Mr. Singaram Sittarasu**, Marketing Advisor, Syama Prasad Mookerjee Port; and **Mr. Prabin Bora**, Director, Inland Waterways Authority of India.

The Hon'ble Minister Shri Santanu Thakur, Minister of State for Ports, Shipping, and Waterways, Government of India, graced the **BCC&I Annual Shipping and Logistics Conclave** as the **Chief Guest**. He emphasized that under the visionary leadership of Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, India stands at a **pivotal moment**, particularly for **Northeast India**, a region rich in **untapped potential** and **strategic significance**. Highlighting the **growing momentum of multimodal connectivity**, he underscored the transformative impact of the **PM Gati Shakti National Master Plan** and the **National Logistics Policy**. Stressing the Northeast's **critical role as India's gateway to Southeast Asia**, he pointed to its **proximity to Bhutan, Bangladesh, Myanmar, and China**,

making it a key **economic corridor**. He cited **transformative projects** such as the **Kaladan Multimodal Transit Transport Project** and the **India-Myanmar-Thailand Trilateral Highway** as major enablers of **trade and connectivity with ASEAN nations**, fostering **new economic opportunities**. Additionally, he highlighted the **Jalvahak Scheme** as a crucial initiative for **enhancing regional connectivity and sustainable logistics**, stating that it plays a vital role in **integrating waterways with multimodal logistics solutions**, reducing **transportation costs**, and promoting **eco-friendly trade**, particularly in **Northeast India**, where waterways remain vastly **underutilized**.

**Mr. Shantanu Verma**, Member, National Shipping and Logistics Committee, BCC&I and Chief Procurement Logistics, Tata Steel Ltd, summed up the inaugural session of the conclave and highlighted the key discussions. He noted the **strategic advantage of Northeast India's proximity to international borders**, positioning it as a vital gateway to the **Asian market**. He emphasized the need to **enhance waterways connectivity**, leveraging riverine routes to enable **cost-effective and sustainable cargo movement**. He also stressed the importance of **green logistics initiatives**, which not only reduce transportation costs but also contribute to **environmental sustainability**. In addition, **Mr. Verma** pointed out the **underutilization of regional ports**, noting that improving port infrastructure and accessibility could **significantly cut shipping costs and transit times**. He further highlighted the necessity of **policy interventions, industry collaboration, and investment** to transform **Northeast India into a highly efficient logistics hub**, fostering **stronger trade ties and boosting economic growth in the region**.

The conclave highlighted the topics :

- **Logistical viability of transporting goods to and from North East India**
- **Exploring feasibility and potential benefits of establishing a Multimodal Logistics Park & Allied Infrastructure**
- **Promoting International Trade and Employment for the Seven Sisters**

### Technical Session I : Focus Bengal – Logistical viability of transporting goods to and from North East India

The session was moderated by **Mr. Surajit Sarkar**, CEO, GIR Logistics Pvt. Ltd. The eminent panelists for this session were **Mr. S. K. Barua**, CEO, Northeast Gas Distribution Company, **Mr. Amit Dhawan**, Senior General Manager, CJ Darcl Logistics, **Mr. Jagadeesh Kunchey**, EVP-Supply Chain & Logistics, ITC



Limited, **Mr. Sudip Kumar Dey**, Hon. Secretary, Federation of Freight Forwarders.

The session highlighted the crucial role of the **Inland Waterways Authority of India (IWAI)** in enhancing cargo movement, the significance of **road transport infrastructure**, and the potential of **hydroelectric projects** in improving connectivity. The discussion also addressed the **challenging climatic conditions** of the Northeast, which impact logistics, and proposed **greater reliance on coastal shipping** to reduce dependency on road transport. In addition, the session emphasized containerization as a key solution for streamlining cargo handling and ensuring cost-effective, seamless transportation across the region.

#### **Technical Session II : Exploring feasibility and potential benefits of establishing a Multimodal Logistics Park & Allied Infrastructure**

The session was moderated by **Mr. Adhip Nath Palchaudhuri**, CMD, Balmer Lawrie & Co. Ltd. The eminent panelists for this session were **Mr. Sunil Kumar Singh**, VP, Star Cement Ltd., **Mr. Pramod Kumar Srivastava**, MD, Allied ICD Services Ltd., **Mr. Larsing Ming D Sawyan**, MD, Centre Point Group, **Capt. Chandergupt Mehta**, CEO, Luba Marine.

The session emphasized on the need to optimize **coastal infrastructure** for seamless transportation and stronger **market linkages**. The session highlighted the region's **strategic role in global supply chains**, particularly in key industries like **pharmaceuticals and textiles**, and its potential for **economic transformation** through integrated logistics solutions. Discussions focused on the development of **Special Economic Zones (SEZs)** and the alignment of industries with **port connectivity** to drive investment and implement government-led **development schemes**. The session also addressed the role of **green hydrogen initiatives** in fostering sustainable logistics and enhancing the region's competitiveness in **multimodal transportation**. Experts shared insights on policy frameworks and infrastructural advancements needed to position the Northeast as a **gateway for international trade and logistics growth**.

#### **Technical Session III : Promoting International Trade and Employment for the Seven Sisters**

The session was moderated by **Capt. Ravi Dey**, Maritime Consultant, SeaTec UK Ltd. The eminent panelists were - **Ms. Ishita Chattopadhyay**, MD & CEO, Confidence Shipping Co. Pvt. Ltd., **Ms. Hasina Kharbhih**, Founder MD, Impulse NGO Network, **Mr. S. Hajara**, Director, Apeejay Shipping Ltd., **Mr. Jayanta Goswami**, GM (Marketing), Numaligarh Refinery Ltd.

The discussion focused on **strengthening trade linkages** with neighboring countries such as **Bangladesh, Bhutan, Myanmar, and ASEAN nations**, leveraging **waterways, road, and rail connectivity** to ensure smoother **cargo movement**. The panel highlighted the **crucial role of policy support, infrastructure development, and trade facilitation measures** in positioning Northeast India as a key logistics and commerce hub. Additionally, the conversation explored **job creation opportunities** in sectors like **shipping, manufacturing, and agro-based industries**, emphasizing the need for **skill development and capacity building** to empower **local communities** and drive **economic growth** in the region.

**Mr. S. Hajara**, Advisor, Shipping and Logistics Committee, BCC&I, delivered insightful **closing remarks**, emphasizing the **vital role of shipping and logistics** in driving **India's economic growth**. He highlighted the sector's **significant contribution to employment generation**, stressing the need for continued investment in **infrastructure, policy reforms, and skill development**. Mr. Hajara reiterated the importance of **strengthening multimodal connectivity**, leveraging **ports, waterways, and road networks** to enhance **trade efficiency** and position India as a global logistics hub.

**POSH Workshop was organized on 31<sup>st</sup> January 2025, Friday by The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry premises for raising awareness on the scope of the The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 (POSH Act) among the members and stakeholders.**

The Workshop was curated to provide a **POSH Foundation Course for the workforce, irrespective of gender or position, to ensure everyone with clear understanding the POSH rights under the Act**, which protects employees from sexual harassment at the work place.

Around **25 participants joined from various organisations** like Bengal Gas Company Limited, Eveready, International

The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry (BCC&I), in association with PwC has organized a Special Session on "Dynamics of the Semiconductor Industry and Opportunities for Bengal" on 4th February 2025. The session was held at the PwC Office premises, Salt Lake Sector V, Kolkata. West Bengal. The speaker of the session was Mr. Jitendra Chaddah, Managing Director & Country Head, Global Foundries India, and Vice President, GFES (Fab Operations). The session highlighted the significance of the semiconductor industry, which is the fastest-growing industry globally, and its growth potential in different phases of its development. Mr. Chaddah emphasized that the industry is expected to grow exponentially in the next 15 years, potentially becoming a trillion-dollar industry.

The discussion centered around four primary ways to contribute to the semiconductor industry :

1. Design phase : Companies like Intel and AMD are already working in India to design semiconductors.
2. High-end manufacturing : This aspect requires significant investment and expertise.
3. IMS (assembly of devices) : This stage involves the assembly and testing of semiconductor devices.
4. Supply chain : Working in the segment of Supply Chain does not require much CAPEX.

The semiconductor industry requires high-grade materials

although the materials are available for other industries but are not of the same grade as required by the semiconductor Industry.

Mr. Chaddah stressed that India needs to focus on developing its resources, investments, and talent pool to capitalize on the opportunities in the semiconductor industry. He also emphasized the importance of academia-industry collaboration and government support through incentives.

The session concluded with a discussion on the future prospects of the semiconductor industry, including the rise of physical AI, quantum computing, and the need for India to develop its own design companies and file IPs. The attendees also explored ways to attract investments and talent to Bengal, including the availability of a talent pool, attractive incentives, strong academia-industry collaboration, and a favorable business environment.

The special session provided valuable insights into the dynamics of the semiconductor industry and its potential opportunities for Bengal. It emphasized the need for collaborative efforts among industry stakeholders, academia, and government to develop a robust semiconductor ecosystem in the region.

Delhi-based Think Tank, Centre for Responsible Business (CRB), partnered the Session.

**The objective of the Session was to :**

- **Showcase West Bengal’s potentials in the space of climate change through work done by :**
  - Large-scale industries, PSUs and MSMEs in West Bengal working in this area.
  - Start-ups in West Bengal with innovative products and services, especially technology solutions, in climate change actions
- **Initiatives in West Bengal with innovative funding**
- **Bringing him investors, multilateral agencies and financiers.**

Speakers at the session included experts from the UK who are working on innovative financial models for net zero transition, AI in electric mobility, energy storage, building resilience and on nature-based solutions along with private sector from India, PSUs, Multilateral Agencies, Think Tanks, Investors, Start Ups, Technology Providers, Industry Bodies among others.

**Smt. Choten Dhendup Lama, IAS**, Principal Secretary, Department of Tribal Development, Government of West Bengal presided over at the Session.

Smt. Lama addressed on creating an ecosystem where components, products, and by products retain value as much as possible. This also reduces greenhouse gas emissions and improves energy security.

In the face of growing environmental crisis all over the world with increasing inequality, the Government of West Bengal believes in including development of extended

producer responsibility and responsible supply chain, supporting technical innovation to enhance resource circularity, bringing more women in economic engagements and developing sustainable local communities.

**Mr. Arnab Basu**, President, The Bengal Chamber of Commerce & Industry (BCC&I) and **Dr. Meera Mitra**, Member Governing Body, Centre for Responsible Business (CRB) commenced the Session.

Mr. Basu emphasised on **financial models, technology adaptations, and skilling to support climate actions and create sustainable pathways**. He highlighted **partnerships and collaborations, in line with SDG 17, are needed to achieve the United Nations’ Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)**. **Promoting climate investments is key to driving sustainable transitions and ensuring resilience in the economy. Merging climate actions with livelihood generation, youth and women empowerment, and local economic development are needed to ensure holistic progress.**

Dr. Mitra observed unified visions and approaches of various stakeholders were needed towards sustainability. From India’s standpoint, she pointed out two key leverage points :

- The growing investments focused on social inclusion and the protection of natural resources.
- The challenge was not just in customized production but the need for quicker outcomes, as many sectors could not afford to wait for long-term results.

She noted that India has 6.33 million Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs), employing over 10 billion workers. **She emphasized that West Bengal ranks among the top two states in terms of MSME development. She also highlighted that the state has 453 MSME clusters spread across 23 districts.**

Dr. Fleming spoke about a new partnership between the UK and West Bengal for knowledge exchange on **green budgeting tools**. This initiative is part of the larger India-UK Economic Cooperation Programme aimed at driving long-term, inclusive, and sustainable economic growth.

He announced that the UK government would bring a delegation of **8 UK Electric Vehicle companies** to West Bengal for partnerships. These companies will pioneer innovations in **shared micro-mobility**, and a Knowledge Exchange Workshop is scheduled for March 2025.

He highlighted **three nature-based carbon projects** in the districts of Birbhum and Jalpaiguri, which will benefit **70,000+ farmers** and mobilize **\$40 million** in investments over the next three years. These projects aim to create **carbon offsets of over 50 million tonnes** in the next decade. He also mentioned the ongoing **blue carbon project** in the Sundarbans, which secured **\$25 million** from a major climate fund.

He announced that **British International Investment (BII)** has invested **INR 205 crore (USD 24 million)** in **Magpet Polymers Pvt. Ltd.**, India's first PET circular enterprise, contributing to sustainable plastic waste management. This project is expected to reduce emissions by **51,000 metric tonnes of CO2 per year** and positively impact the livelihoods of **10,000+ waste pickers** in West Bengal and the Northeast.

He also shared updates on **Green Enco Ltd**, a UK company that has successfully deployed its solar plant optimization solution, **pvAPM**, in partnership with organizations like Vikram Solar and IPCL in India. This reflects growing collaboration in clean energy and net-zero transitions.

**Mr. Mitchell Theaker** spoke about collaborations in India, in other parts of the Country, with Welsh Government in electric mobility, battery power, renewable energy and other areas of Sustainability.

**Mr. Vineet Sikka**, Managing Director- Distribution, CESC Ltd. delivered the Industry Address.

Mr. Sikka emphasized the importance of following the targets set by **COP 26 and COP 21** for transitioning to **non-fossil fuel energy**. He also noted that the **power demand is expected to rise by 7% or more**, with the energy sector contributing **20-25%** to the overall emissions basket. He advocated for a stronger focus on **green energy**. He mentioned that there would be a **\$40 trillion investment**

in India's power sector and emphasized the goal of achieving **1000 GW of renewable energy by 2050**. He also discussed the need to explore **carbon capture and storage**.

**Mr. Subhodip Ghosh**, Director General, BCC&I made a presentation on the Chamber's climate action initiative in Sundarbans, planting mangroves. **BCC&I is the first Chamber of Commerce in the country which has been executing Carbon Credit projects and bringing green investments to the state of West Bengal. BCC&I has been executing two carbon credit projects in two blocks (Sagar and Kultali) of Sundarbans in South 24 Pgs since last one and half years with private investments.**

Justifying the theme of the Conclave which is India's Potential in Global Trade, the Conclave through its various sessions had discussions that revolved around "achieving India's export target of \$2 trillion dollar by 2030" and how the key enablers and the facilitators of India's International Trade would play a role in it.

It has been an honour for us to have the august presence of our Guest of Honour Shri Tarun Sharma, DMD, India Exim Bank and also Ms. Aarti Pandey, Deputy General Manager, ECGC Ltd. as our Special Guest at the Opening Session.

The Indian government has implemented several policy measures to enhance trade competitiveness. In the 2025-26 budget, personal income tax rates were reduced to boost

middle-class spending, and initiatives were introduced to strengthen rural infrastructure and manufacturing. Additionally, import duties on key components for mobile phone production were removed to promote local manufacturing, benefiting companies like Apple and Xiaomi. India holds a 3.9% share of the global textiles and apparel trade.

The Federation of Indian Export Organisations (FIEO) forecasts that India's merchandise exports will reach \$500-510 billion in FY25, rebounding from a 3% contraction in the previous fiscal year. Services exports are estimated to contribute an additional \$390-400 billion, bringing total exports to approximately \$890-910 billion. Key drivers of this growth include technology-driven sectors such as electronics, machinery, pharmaceuticals, and medical equipment, as well

as traditional labor-intensive industries like apparel, footwear, and gems & jewelry.

Furthermore, India is engaging the private sector in space exploration, aiming to enhance its strategic capabilities and compete globally. The government plans to transition the production of launch vehicles to private start-ups, with the goal of making India a leader in small satellite exports, projecting a business opportunity worth \$4-5 billion.

Despite these positive developments, challenges persist. Global uncertainties, such as geopolitical tensions and trade protectionism, may impact export growth. Additionally, the European Union's green regulations, including the Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism (CBAM), could increase export costs and complicate free trade negotiations. Domestically, issues like high import duties on components, the need for improved logistics networks, and shortages in skilled labour must be addressed to maintain competitiveness.

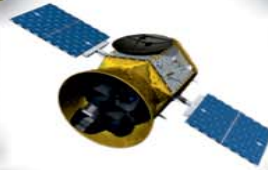

The Bengal Chamber of Commerce & Industry (BCC&I) organized "**Minerals, Mining and Metals Conclave: Facilitating the Journey towards the World's Third-Largest Economy**" on **10<sup>th</sup> February 2025** at India Habitat Centre, New Delhi.

This high-profile Conclave was organized by the 'Metals' and 'Minerals & Mining' National Committees of the BCC&I. The Metals National Committee is Chaired by **Mr. Nagendra Nath Sinha**, Former Secretary, Ministry of Steel, Government of India. The committee is also led by **Mr. D. K. Sen**, Former L&T Board Member & Advisor to CMD for Development Projects, L&T Ltd. and **Mr. Subodh Pandey**, VP, Technology and New Materials Business, Tata Steel Ltd. The Minerals and Mining National Committee is mentored by **Mr. Rana Som**, Former CMD, NMDC and **Mr. Tuhin Mukherjee**, Advisor – Mineral Resource & Mining, Aditya Birla Management Corporation Pvt. Ltd. The Committee is chaired by **Mr. A K Jha**, Former Chairman, Coal India Ltd. and Co- Chaired by **Mr. Subhra Mukherjee**, Group CHRO and Group Admin Head, Captain Steel Ltd.

**Mr. Arnab Basu**, President, BCC&I and Advisory Leader, PricewaterhouseCoopers Pvt. Ltd. delivered the Welcome Address and **Mr. Rana Som**, Mentor, Minerals & Mining National Committee, BCC&I and Former CMD, NMDC delivered the Opening Address. Shri Sandeep Poundrik, IAS, Secretary, Ministry of Steel, Government of India was the Chief Guest.

**Shri Sandeep Poundrik** in his address mentioned that India does not anticipate a significant impact from US announcement of a 25% tariff on steel and aluminium imports. Shri Poundrik said that the domestic market remains strong and that India's steel exports to US are minimal. He stated that India produced 145 million tonnes of steel last year, of which 95,000 tonnes was exported to the US. So, it does not affect much if out of 145 million tonnes, India is not able to export 95,000 tonnes. Shri Poundrik said that India's domestic demand is on the rise and noted that the steel industry may find it difficult to even meet the local needs in the coming years. He said that India is one of the major economies in the world experiencing such a fast pace of growth. In contrast, economies like the USA, Europe, and China are either stagnating or witnessing a decline in consumption. This is largely because these countries have

already achieved a high level of development and their focus is now on replacing infrastructure rather than building new ones.

On the other hand, as a developing nation, the Indian Government is actively pushing for infrastructure growth. The real estate sector has been booming over the past two to three years and with a growing middle class. As a result, consumption is steadily growing, with this year's growth surpassing 10%. In FY 2024-25, our consumption growth is projected to be more than 11%. Taking a conservative approach of 8% annual growth till 2030, we will need a steel production capacity of 300 million tons to meet the demand. By that time, India will likely have this capacity. However, meeting this huge demand of over 300 MT will require more raw materials than we currently supply. Achieving this target is not easy. While iron ore availability is there, ramping up production to meet this demand presents a significant challenge that our industry will need to address. Similarly, the issue of coking coal is pressing. We currently import most of our coking coal. Unfortunately, domestic coking coal production is not increasing fast enough. Other critical materials like manganese, limestone and dolomite are also imported, and it is expected that imports will rise further. These are challenges in the mining sector that must be addressed.

Shri Poundrik further mentioned that India still operates at a smaller level of automation in mining. Increasing automation is essential to improving productivity and safety in the mining sector. Additionally, digital technologies, such as AI and machine learning, will help optimize exploration and increase production.

Regarding scrap, Shri Poundrik said that we need to focus on generating our own scrap, as we currently import over 50% of the scrap consumed in the steel industry. The rising trend of countries restricting scrap exports to promote green steel will put pressure on India to become self-sufficient in scrap generation. To address this, we must develop better policies to encourage the recycling and collection of scrap.

Shri Poundrik said that as a country, we are doing well in the steel sector, and achieving a capacity of 300 MT by 2030 is not a problem. However, we face several challenges, example, ensuring raw material availability, expanding specialty steel production (which is still heavily imported), addressing environmental concerns and leveraging new technologies like AI and Machine Learning. If we fail to adopt these advancements, we risk falling behind. But with the vision and efficiency of our industry, he said that he is confident that India will overcome these challenges.

Shri Nagendra Sinha, Chairperson, Metals National Committee, BCC&I and Former Secretary, Ministry of Steel, Government of India thanked Shri Sandeep Poundrik, IAS, Secretary, Ministry of Steel, Government of India for his Keynote Address and delivered the Concluding Remarks.

The Opening session was followed by an Experts Roundtable on "Indian Minerals and Mining sectors : What Lies Beneath, What Lies Ahead". The speakers were **Mr. B Prabhakaran**, Managing Director, Thriveni Earthmovers Pvt. Ltd; **Mr. Sunil Pandey**, VP, Corporate Affairs, JSW Steel Ltd.; **Mr. Sitansu Nandi**, Head-Sales (Surface Mining), Gainwell Commosales Private Limited and **Mr. Vinod Kumar**, Partner & Leader - Manufacturing Sector, PwC in India. The session was moderated by **Mr. Rana Som**, Mentor, Minerals & Mining National Committee, BCC&I and Former CMD, NMDC. The Session focused on ensuring the availability of raw materials, De-Carbonization and sustainability factors in Mining, strategies for more and faster exploration, technology Integration, import dependency and role of private investment and FDI in mining.

The Valedictory Session was addressed by **Mr. Sanjay Kumar Singh**, Executive Director - Strategy and External Relations, JSPL and **Shri A K Jha**, Chairman National Committee on Minerals and Mining, BCC&I and Former Chairman, Coal India and Former Chairman, Jindal Power. The session was moderated by **Mr. Arnab Chakraborty**, Director, The Bengal Chamber of Commerce & Industry. The theme of the Valedictory Session was "Power Play: Indian Coal Mining in the era of Green Energy." The deliberations focused on the evolving landscape of coal mining in the context of sustainable and green energy transitions, eco-friendly mining technologies, adoption of mine reclamation and afforestation projects, coal gasification, clean coal technologies (CCUS - Carbon Capture, Utilization, and Storage) and its impact on Coal Industry.

The Conclave was attended by around 150 delegates from the mining and metals sector comprising of both private and public sector companies, key industry leaders, policymakers and experts. The Conclave also received widespread media coverage.

## WELLNESS MEDITATION SESSION

The Wellness & Community Committee of the Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry organized its first-ever Wellness Meditation Session in association with The Art of Living on Saturday, 15<sup>th</sup> February 2025, from 8:00 AM to 9:30 AM at the Chamber premises.

A total of 25 participants attended the session from well-known organizations such as B. D. Memorial Jr. School, SPK Jain Futuristic Academy, Indus Valley World School Tata Steel Downstream Products Limited and Woodlands Multispeciality Hospital Limited among others.

The session began with Dr. Ratna Sinha, Mentor, Wellness and Communities Committee, BCC&I, Former VP HRM at Tata Metaliks Limited, congratulating everyone for attending on a Saturday morning. She emphasized the importance of mental well-being in the workplace, especially in today's stressful, target-driven work environment, where employees often have limited time to complete their tasks. She explained how meditation can help reduce stress, improve productivity, and enhance work performance.

The session began with the welcome address by Ratna Sinha. Following the introduction, Ms Sohini Chakraborty, Manager - Client Partnerships at Vyakti Vikas Kendra India (Art of Living) introduced the session coordinator, Mr. Anup Agarwal, an engineer from BITS Pilani and an MBA graduate from XLRI Jamshedpur. With over two decades of experience at ICICI, Cognizant, and HSBC, Mr. Agarwal is a long-time practitioner and faculty member of The Art of Living. He conducts stress management and leadership workshops for business professionals and is passionate about fostering healthier workplace cultures for increased productivity and personal fulfilment.

Mr. Agarwal began the session by asking participants to pat themselves on the shoulder as a gesture of self-appreciation

for attending. He then encouraged them to swap seats and greet the person next to them with a smile. He demonstrated the importance of maintaining both energy and focus for better work performance, explaining that if either energy or focus is low, tasks may remain incomplete or flawed, leading to reduced productivity.

He then led participants through several exercises. First, they gently tapped their head, forehead, and neck with both hands. Then, they used their fingers to slowly massage the forehead, temples, and areas around the eyes.

During the session, a participant asked about the difference between Sadhana and meditation. Mr. Agarwal explained that meditation is a part of Sadhana. He elaborated that the word Sadhana comes from "Sa" (self) and "Dhana" (wealth), meaning "one's own wealth." He emphasized that regular meditation, ideally practiced on an empty stomach, can bring meaningful benefits if incorporated into daily life.

He then guided participants through breathing exercises, including the alternate nostril breathing technique. They placed their index and middle fingers on their forehead while using their thumb to close one nostril, inhaling through the other, then switching nostrils to exhale. This process was repeated six times, followed by a short relaxation period to experience warmth and calmness from within.

Next, he instructed participants to close their eyes, smile, and become aware of their surroundings, sounds, and bodily sensations from head to toe. He then led them through deep breathing exercises and a final activity, in which participants brought their fists near their shoulders, raised their arms while inhaling, and then lowered them while exhaling. This exercise was repeated several times before they were instructed to rest, regain normal breathing, and slowly open their eyes.

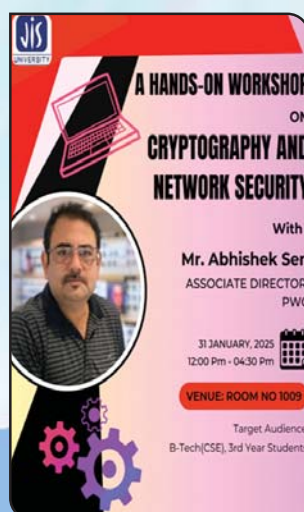


### Students of B. Tech CSE showcased their innovative science models at Science fair
