BUSINESS DELEGATION TO BHUTAN

12TH - 14TH MAY, 2015, THIMPHU

The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry organized a Business Delegation to Thimphu, Bhutan in association with The Bhutan Chamber of Commerce and Industry on 12th and 13th May 2015. Some meetings continued till 14th May.

It was a nineteen-member delegation led by Dr. Alok Roy, President, The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry including three members from the Chamber Secretariat.

The delegation visited His Excellency Tshering Tobgay, Hon'ble Prime Minister of Bhutan on 13th May. The Hon'ble Prime Minister received the delegation very warmly. He observed that India is not only the closest neighbour of Bhutan but the most valued partner country as well. He also noted that growth of India and specifically West Bengal is crucial for the growth of Bhutan. He spoke fondly about Bhutan's association with India and West Bengal and that Siliguri is truly the gateway to Bhutan. He made special emphasis on Bhutan's reliance on West Bengal and Assam. He congratulated West Bengal on the success of the Global Bengal Business Summit on 7th and 8th January 2015 that was organized by the Government of West Bengal. Bhutan Chamber of Commerce and Industry participated in it through The Bengal Chamber. The Hon'ble Prime Minister informed the delegation that Smt. Mamata Banerjee, Hon'ble Chief Minister of West Bengal has been invited to Bhutan. Mr. D Karma Tsering Namgyal, Consul General of Bhutan in Kolkata was in touch with the Hon'ble Chief Minister's office. The Hon'ble Prime Minister individually interacted with some of the delegates including Mr. Subrata Dutta, Director, The George Telegraph Group; Mr. Pradip Bhowmick, Partner, KPMG Advisory Services Pvt. Ltd.; Mr. Dhruv Bhalla, Vice President, Srei Infrastructure Finance Limited and Mr. Dibya Sankar Das, Managing Partner and Founder, Dellstar Overseas. Mr. Bhalla mentioned that his company, Srei, would be delighted to work with the Royal Government of Bhutan in the space of IT solutions and services for rural development. The Hon'ble Prime Minister mentioned to Mr. Subrata Dutta that vocational training would be a sector with great prospects in Bhutan.

The Hon'ble Prime Minister was invited to launch the Confederation of Eastern Chambers of Commerce and Industry (CECCI), spearheaded by The Bengal Chamber to bring the Chambers of Commerce in the 'East' (spanning the Eastern and North Eastern States and those from the eastern neighbours of India) together and create a common platform for the greater benefit of the common membership and industry and business at large. The forum would be utilized for B2B networking, communicating with the local Governments, experience / best practices sharing and even for addressing day-to-day operational issues faced by the cross-section of the membership who might need a helping hand from Partner Chambers while transacting business in neighbouring States and/or Countries. The Hon'ble Prime Minister indicated that Kolkata would be an ideal venue to organize such a programme. He also mentioned that he thought about Kolkata not because he had special connection with West Bengal as he had studied in Darjeeling but that he believed that the city had the potential to connect the 'East'.

Ms. Nina Tshering La, Counsellor, Embassy of India in Thimphu, Bhutan accompanied the delegation in the meeting.

The delegation also visited His Excellency Lyonpo Norbu Wangchuk, Hon'ble Minister of Economic Affairs, Royal Government of Bhutan on 13th May 2015. The Hon'ble Minister shared his thoughts with the delegates. He highlighted that India-Bhutan relationship is at its peak. The cooperation has set a standard for the entire world. The foundation stone of the 600MW Kholongchu Hydro- electric project, a joint venture between India and Bhutan was laid by Shri Narendra Modi, Hon'ble Prime Minister of India. Bhutan and India now produce the cheapest and cleanest energy, said the Minister. Geographically, Bhutan is the best place for setting up such projects. The good governance of the Royal Government of Bhutan made it possible for it to be accomplished in record time. He observed that the people in Bhutan have a close affinity towards the people of West Bengal, Bhutan's closest neighbour. The two countries share a Free Trade Agreement. The focus sectors of Bhutan are Education, Infrastructure, IT, Health, Mining amongst others. Bhutan has a high rate of ease of doing business. The Royal Government of Bhutan is committed to simplifying business processes for entrepreneurs and corporates alike. IT infrastructure and IT applications would play an important role in this procedure. The Minister spoke about this while responding to a query made by KPMG. Mr. Subrata Dutta proposed that George Telegraph would be delighted to be a Partner of the Government in the area of Skill Development. The partnership would ensure that the youth in Bhutan is trained with skills relevant to the industry. He was advised to submit a proposal to the Ministry of Labour and Human Resources. The Minister emphasized the importance of a close connection between the Government and the Industry. Accessibility would play an important role in this regard. The Minister ensured all investors would be provided personalized assistance for business in Bhutan.

The delegates had a lengthy discussion with Ms. Nina Tshering La on the 13th before meeting the Hon'ble Prime Minister and Hon'ble Minister of Economic Affairs. Ms. Nina Tshering La individually interacted with the delegates and advised on their scope of business in Bhutan. She mentioned that she had been in touch with Ms. Angana Guha Roy Chowdhury, Assistant Director, The Bengal Chamber and that she was happy that the Chamber had organized such a high level delegation. The economies of the two countries are well integrated. However, many Indian firms have reservations given the size of the market in Bhutan. The business collaborations are however increasing. There are 16 Indian FDIs in Bhutan.

She shared with the delegation in general and Mr. Subrata Dutta in particular that unemployment is an issue which needs to be addressed in Bhutan. Therefore, skill development and vocational training have great opportunities. Mr. Dutta observed that his Group would also be interested to invest in Bhutan if he had an investing partner. Mr. Dhruv Bhalla commented that he had fruitful discussions during the B2B

Meetings on the previous day. They would be interested in smart grid, financing of equipments and IT services for rural development. Mr. N K Ghosal, Director, NKG & Associates enquired about the scope of IT audit. He was told that this would be of interest to the Government as compliance is an important issue. He was advised to get in touch with the Secretary and Director of Information and Communications Ministry. Mr. Bidyut Majumder of JIS Group of Educational Initiatives was informed that Joint Venture Projects in Education would have great prospects.

The delegates had the B2B Meetings on 12th May. The meeting was attended by Mr. Phub Tshering, Secretary General; Mr. Kesang Wangdi Deputy Secretary General and other senior members of the Bhutan Chamber. Mr. Tshenchok Thinlay, Executive Director, Bhutan Airlines was also present.

The Bengal Chamber is in discussions with Mr. D Karma Tsering Namgyal for organizing a Indo-Bhutan Golf Tournament in

Kolkata where Golfers from Bhutan would participate. It was decided that a return programme would be organized in Bhutan where 20-25 golfers and industry captains would be invited. On this subject, Dr. Alok Roy had a meeting with the Bhutan Chamber and Col. Jambay Dorji, President, Bhutan Shooting Federation.

The programme concluded on 13th May 2015 with an MoU signing between the two Chambers. Mr. Ugen Tsechup Dorji, President, Bhutan Chamber of Commerce and Industry was present in the Concluding Programme and Networking Dinner. He mentioned that Bhutan may be considered as the regional manufacturing hub. There are many areas in which The Bengal Chamber and Bhutan Chamber may work together. Import of vegetables and fruits from Bhutan to India is one such area. Bhutan could be the “vegetable basket” for the region. In fact, the country enjoyed such a climate that seasonal vegetables could be grown all through the year in different locations.

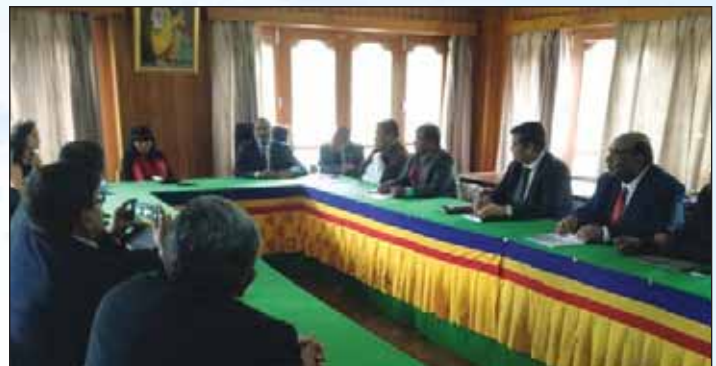

The delegation met Union of Myanmar Federation Chamber of Commerce and Industry (UMFCCI) on 16th May 2016 in Yangon. The delegation was received by Ambassador Tint Swai, Chief Executive Officer. U Mg Mg Myint, Head of Department (IRD), UMFCCI was also present. Ambassador Tint Swai mentioned that Education and Healthcare sectors have immense opportunities in Myanmar. The institutions will have to showcase them well to attract business. Mr. Subhodip Ghosh, Director General Designate proposed whether UMFCCI and BCC&I may formally work together to create a permanent forum for mutual collaborations, information sharing and facilitation to each others' members. A formal proposal will be submitted by BCC&I

The delegation met His Excellency U Ohn Maung, Hon'ble Minister of Hotels and Tourism, The Republic of the Union of Myanmar and Mr. Tint Thwin, Director General, Directorate of Hotels and Tourism, Ministry of Hotels and Tourism, Republic of The Union of Myanmar on 17th May 2016 in Nay Pyi Taw. The Hon'ble Minister expressed his pleasure receiving the delegation. It was the first delegation of this scale he received after taking over. He mentioned about Buddhist pilgrimage shared between India and Myanmar. Bodh Gaya attracts many from Myanmar on account of Buddhist tourism. He also said that there are not that many footfalls from India to Myanmar. With more Indian footfall in Myanmar, people in Myanmar will get the opportunity to interact more with Indians which will further encourage business relationships. Indian investors in tourism sector are also welcome in Myanmar. The other areas, he advised, in which Indian businesses are having opportunities in Myanmar are HR Training (as Myanmar needs capacity building in different sectors); IT including data collection and others; Skill Development especially English Language Training, and Mines and Minerals. The Bengal Chamber will submit a proposal of organizing a Golf Delegation to Myanmar which will be combined with a HR programme and Skill Development including English Language Training.

President mentioned that this will lead to golf tourism from India to Myanmar which will give them exposure to Myanmar as a tourism destination. The Chamber will also submit a proposal to connect Kolkata and Yangon as Sister Cities to promote Buddhist Tourism. The proposal of Myanmar's participation in India International Mega Trade Fair in December 2016 in Kolkata was submitted to the Hon'ble Minister. This will give businesses in Myanmar exposure to the consumers' market in Kolkata and also B2B network of other countries participating in the Fair. The Hon'ble Minister was also invited to the Inauguration. Indo-Myanmar Cultural Programme, on occasion of the International Trade Fair, was also proposed to the Hon'ble Minister. The President informed that The Bengal Chamber would be delighted to offer the platform to promote Myanmar reaching out to Indian Stakeholders.

The delegation met Professor Thet Khaing Win, Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Health, Myanmar on 17th May 2016. Opportunities of promoting medical tourism from Myanmar to India were reiterated. The Permanent Secretary suggested that experts from Indian healthcare sector may also visit Myanmar and work in collaboration with their local counterparts. Medical Education Institutions of both the countries may collaborate. Indian Pharmaceutical organizations may set up factories in Myanmar. The Bengal Chamber proposed whether research may be conducted jointly by both the countries given most diseases are of similar nature due to similar climatic conditions. Funds from International Funding Agencies may also be approached together. Expertise on telemedicine and other technology expertise for providing healthcare to the people in Myanmar may be provided as well. In this context, the Permanent Secretary mentioned that connectivity may be an issue. There is a need to create IT infrastructure, connectivity and security. The Permanent Secretary advised to get in touch with the office of Minister of Transport and Communication in this context.

The delegation split in two groups on 18th May 2016. One group went to Mandalay for B2B Meetings and the other returned to Yangon to meet His Excellency Dr. Than Myint, Union Minister, Ministry of Commerce, The Republic of the Union of Myanmar. The second group also participated in the Dinner hosted by the Embassy of India in Yangon.

The Hon'ble Minister started his speech with the emotional connection people in Myanmar share with Indians. He also referred to the historical connection the two countries share. He mentioned that Myanmar, with the new Government, is opening its market. The country is very keen to retain its good relationship with India and increase trade and commerce. More investments from India are expected. Infrastructure and capacity building are areas Myanmar is focusing on and the Indian companies may value add. The Hon'ble Minister mentioned that his Ministry is responsible for promoting Myanmar's trade with other countries and the Ministry is focusing on increasing exports. In this context, the Hon'ble Minister was apprised about the India International Mega Trade Fair organized by The Bengal Chamber with GS Marketing Associates who were also part of the delegation. The Chamber also apprised the Hon'ble Minister about the International Conference on Pulses in Kolkata, India in commemoration of this year being the International Year of Pulses as declared by the United Nations. The programme is being scheduled towards the end of 2016. The date will be finalized shortly in consultation with the Government of India and Government of West Bengal. The Chamber believes that it would be only be befitting to have

Myanmar as our Partner Country for this programme. The Hon'ble Minister assured that he would look into the matter and his Ministry would evaluate the same discussing with the private sector.

The Delegation participated in a Dinner hosted by the Embassy of India in Yangon on the occasion of Myanmar-India Business Conclave: Forging Partnerships. The Dinner was graced by Ms. Nirmla Sitharaman, Hon'ble Commerce Minister of India; Dr. Than Myint, Union Minister, Ministry of Commerce, The Republic of the Union of Myanmar; Ambassador Gautam Mukhopadhyaya, Indian Embassy in Yangon; Dr. Nandakumar Nagendran, Consul General, Consulate General of India in Mandalay; Smt. Arundhati Bhattacharya, CMD, State Bank of India and other dignitaries. It provided a significant networking session for the delegates with the business community in Myanmar and also with the Indian Diaspora in Myanmar.

Part of the delegation accompanied by one of the Chamber secretariat members visited Mandalay. In Mandalay, the delegation split according to their sectors of interest and one team met members of **Myanmar Construction Entrepreneurs Association**, while the others headed to the Consulate Office in Mandalay for their relevant **B2B with representatives from the health sector**. It has the lowest unemployment rate in Europe with a State Budget surplus and no National Debt.

The Bengal Chamber extended an invitation to San Marino Chamber of Commerce to bring a business delegation to West Bengal. The delegation is expected within a year.

VISIT TO RUSSIA

7TH - 12TH NOVEMBER, 2016

The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry visited Moscow, Russia on invitation from OPORA Russia from 7th to 12th November 2016.

OPORA Russia, Moscow is the regional department of the Russian non-government organization for small and medium entrepreneurs. It works efficiently in a whole range of the areas to execute its key tasks covering representation of the interests of small and medium businesses in Russia and in Moscow. Their goals include the improvement of the existing relevant legislations in Russia, protection of the entrepreneurs' rights and interests and interacting with various authorities with the objective being addressing the issues confronting MSMEs in Russia.

The visit was organized with active support from the Consulate General of the Russian Federation in Kolkata.

Day 2 : 9th November 2016

The following meetings were held on the Day 2: 9th November 2016 : ● Moscow State University Science Park ● Russian Franchise Association (RFA) ● Indian Embassy in Moscow

● **Moscow State University Science Park**

Mr. Vasily Petrechenko, Deputy CEO, Moscow State University Science Park met the Chamber representatives. The meeting commenced with an introduction of the Science Park.

MSU Science Park is the oldest of the operating technoparks in Russia. MSU Science Park provides office and laboratory premises in the centre of Moscow in the close vicinity to the best University in Russia, the Moscow State University. One hundred twenty technological (IT, industrial engineering, medical devices and oil & gas services) companies are the residents of the Science Park.

Residents of the Science Park undertake joint studies with MSU laboratories with the involvement of the University graduates. A number of centres for collective use equipped with the State-of-the-Art equipment are operating at MSU including centres for preclinical trials, nano-materials, materials testing and others.

A Letter of Intent was requested from the Science Park expressing interest of working together following which the two organizations may share details about their projects to identify the suitable one(s).

The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry separately proposed an institutional partnership with the Science Park. The Chamber requested the Science Park to share their updates on various innovations taking place in their eco-system which the Chamber will circulate among their members and stakeholders for match making.

Two of the residents made presentations on their innovations.

LighTiO: It produces coatings for the greenhouses. The same may be used for cars - side mirrors, side windows, head lights and others. The solution may be used for buildings in India with glass walls. This will save resources involved for cleaning the walls. The Chamber mentioned that the proposal may be circulated to its members and stakeholders in the domain of construction.

Naftobioclean: They provide solutions for water treatment for industrial and storm drains. Their usage is in :

- o Airfields and airports
- o Thermal Power Stations
- o Car Parking Areas
- o Others

The solution does not work for arsenic treatment. It may be used for treating water borne effluents from chemical plants and the above mentioned work spaces. The Chamber enquired whether the same may be used for treating water flowing from leather parks. The concerned person indicated that the same was possible but water sample test would provide a better feedback.

The Chamber made an introduction of West Bengal and the activities of the Bengal Chamber. Some other projects were briefly discussed in the IT domain like online portal for private tutors.

● **Russian Franchise Association (RFA)**

The Meeting was held in the office of Baskin Robbins Russia. Dr. Agnessa Osipova, President, Baskin Robbins (Russia) received the Chamber representatives. She is also the President of RFA. She mentioned that the markets of both the countries are developing. There lies significant scope for businesses in both the countries to explore contacts for business enhancement.

The Chamber briefed about the historical linkage shared by West Bengal with Russia and the State's strategic location. The Chamber also mentioned about its stakeholders who

RFA mentioned that a catalogue would be published by them with the details of various franchises. A sample of an existing catalogue was shared. They offered that the publication may also include Indian organizations interested to work in Russian market as franchise holders.

The Chamber representatives were also escorted to a tour in the production centre of Baskin Robbins.

● **Indian Embassy in Moscow**

The Chamber representatives visited the Indian Embassy in Moscow and met Shri Pankaj Saran, Ambassador, Embassy of India in Moscow and Shri K D Dewal, First Secretary (HOC and Commercial), Indian Embassy in Moscow.

The Ambassador received the Chamber representatives very warmly and expressed his great appreciation to the Chamber for visiting Russia. The Chamber briefed the Ambassador about its activities especially about its outreach activities. The Director General mentioned that there had been a steady increase of interest, among the members, to explore the overseas markets.

The Ambassador mentioned that the Economic and Commercial Sections of the Embassy had been strengthened. The Ambassador advised that participating in mega programmes in Russia is a way of exploring participation in the Russian market. The Chamber may explore bringing delegations to participate in such programmes in St. Petersburg and Vladivostok. Some of the focus areas are:

The Embassy offered to provide guidance on sectors of exports from India to Russia. The Ambassador also mentioned that both the countries have to be made aware about business potentiality of each other. The Chamber may play a role to address this gap.

● Discussion and B2B Meeting with FBCCI :

On 15th February 2017, the delegation members had B2B interaction with the members of The Federation of Bangladesh Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FBCCI) at Nitol Centre, Dhaka. The delegation was received by Mr. Abdul Matlub Ahmad, President, FBCCI and Chairman, Nitol-Niloy Group. Before the formal meeting, the delegation members had an informal interaction with the President of FBCCI, briefing him about their sectors of interest and their business purpose in Bangladesh. The Formal B2B meeting was also presided by Mr. Ahmad. The Bengal Chamber Delegation Co-leader Mr. R. N. Lahiri, delivered the opening remarks. In his remarks, he mentioned about the close cultural and demographic similarities that the two countries share and requested the delegate members for their self-

introduction and also requested his colleagues to highlight their objective for the trip. Mr. Abdul Matlub Ahmed, President, FBCCI also spoke in details about the opportunities available in the Sectors that the BCC&I Delegates represented, and arranged for B2B connects for some of the delegates for the next day. ■ Day 2: 16th February 2017: Dhaka

● Participation in the Inauguration of the Indo-Bangla Trade fair:

The Bengal Chamber delegation members participated in the inauguration session of the Indo-Bangla Trade Fair, organized by the India-Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry and Indian High Commission, at 10 a.m. at Pan Pacific SonarGaon Hotel, Dhaka. This was the fourth Indo-Bangla Trade Fair which was inaugurated by the Chief Guest Janab Tofail Ahmed, Hon'ble Minister, Ministry of Commerce, Government of Bangladesh. More than 60 companies representing the sectors of automobiles, processed food, banking, insurance, home appliances, consumer goods, power, paints, electronics and electrical, textiles, cement manufacturing, and lubricants manufacturing exhibited their product lines in the Trade Fair. Shri Harsh Vardhan Shringla, High Commissioner of India, Dhaka; Mr. Abdul Matlub Ahmad, President, FBCCI and Chairman, Nitol-Niloy Group and Mr. Taskeen Ahmed, President, India-Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry were the special guests of this prestigious programme. Mr. Jahangir Bin Alam, Secretary and CEO, India-Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry commenced the session. He said that this Fair was "a landmark event" for the bilateral business relationship between Bangladesh, India and other neighbouring countries. Mr. Taskeen Ahmed, President, India-Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry delivered the opening remarks. Mr. Pankaj Tandon, leader of CII Delegation and Mr. R.N. Lahiri, leader of BCC&I Delegation delivered their respective speeches. Subsequently, The Hon'ble Chief Guest Janab Tofail Ahmed addressed the audience. He said that the objective of this Fair was to bring Bangladesh and India together and to strengthen the bilateral business relationship between these two neighbouring countries. Bangladesh had imported many items from India for domestic industries. Bangladesh and India's two-way trade was \$6.14 billion in 2015-16, though heavily tilted towards India. But in the last two years, Bangladesh's exports to India had seen a huge increase after India allowed duty-free market access in 2015-16. Bangladesh exports to India surged 30.8 percent to \$689.62 million and Indian exports declined by 6.3 percent. Shri Harsh Vardhan Shringla, High Commissioner of India, Dhaka said that this Trade Fair had opened a new era of corporate relationship between Bangladesh and India, and that he was looking forward to having more interactions and exchange. He also said that companies from both India and Bangladesh were exploring "new opportunities" for investing and setting up joint ventures in each other's country. It was a multiproduct Fair with the objective to develop business activities between the two neighbouring countries. Mr. Abhijit Chakravorty, Country Head Bangladesh, State Bank of India addressed the audience. SBI, the largest bank of India, was the Sponsor of this Trade Fair. Mr. Abdul Matlub Ahmad, President, FBCCI and Chairman, Nitol-Niloy

Group delivered the formal vote of thanks. The trade fair was well covered in Bangladesh media and The BCC&I delegation found a prominent mention there.

● Meeting with Shri Harsh Vardhan Shringla, High Commissioner of India, Dhaka :

The delegation members from BCC&I, had an interaction with Shri Harsh Vardhan Shringla, High Commissioner of India, Dhaka at Pan Pacific SonarGaon Hotel at 10:30 a.m on the sidelines of the Trade Fair. At the outset, the delegates introduced themselves, briefing the High Commissioner about their sectors of interest and purpose of visit to Bangladesh. The highlights of Shri Shringla's discourse are as follows:

- ◆ The marketing field in Bangladesh should be focused seriously
- ◆ More investments were required to develop the Chittagong port
- ◆ There would be railway connectivity between Mongla and Khulna Sea port to enrich the opportunities for export and import from both the countries
- ◆ Funding entirely for the development of Ashuganj port
- ◆ Speaking on the occasion, Shri Shringla stressed upon the fact that more and more bilateral interaction and cooperation was needed between Bangladesh and India to strengthen the bilateral business relationships between the two neighbouring nations.

The members of the delegation introduced themselves which was followed by an interactive presentation between the members of the delegation and the Export Promotion Bureau officials. **Bangladesh Export Promotion Bureau, Dhaka**, is a National export Promotion Agency under the Ministry of Commerce, which was recognized by the promulgation of a Presidential Ordinance in 1977 as a semi-autonomous body. The ordinance had been converted into an ACT on 14th July, 2015. **EPB** promotes export and contributes to plan & policies helpful for the private sector. It is administrated by a Board of Management (BOM) comprising 15 (fifteen) members from both public and private sectors. The Hon'ble Minister of Commerce is the ex-officio Chairman of the Board of Management, and Vice-Chairman is the Chief Executive of the Export Promotion

Bureau. EPB is functioning with its head office in Dhaka while three regional offices are located in Chittagong, Rajshahi and Khulna and three branch offices are in Comilla, Sylet and Narayanganj. **EPB** is mainly responsible for

- ♦ Adoption of appropriate policy and programme measures for active promotion of export.
- ♦ Co-ordination of export development activities at various levels.
- ♦ Co-ordination and monitoring of national export performance.
- ♦ Carrying out of promotional activities in product & supply development.
- ♦ Exploration of markets abroad.
- ♦ Collection and dissemination of trade information.
- ♦ Organizing Bangladesh participation in the International trade fairs abroad.
- ♦ Imparting training for HRD on export related issues.
- ♦ Conducting study, surveys, research etc on product development.
- ♦ Issuance of various certificates against export of goods.
- ♦ EPB also assists Ministry of Commerce in formulating export policy of the country.

● **Meeting with Janab Tofail Ahmed, Hon’ble Minister of Commerce, Government of Bangladesh:**

BCC&I Delegation had a meeting with the Hon’ble Commerce Minister of Bangladesh at 12:30 p.m. at his office in the Bangladesh Secretariat. At the outset, he mentioned about his past visit to Bengal and The Bengal Chamber a few years back on the occasion of the Chamber’s annual India International Mega Trade Fair organized in partnership with GS Marketing Associates and subsequently spoke about bilateral trade related figures which is deep and is growing each day. He mentioned that over the years Bangladesh had been importing cotton and threads from India. The Hon’ble Minister highlighted the Government of India’s anti-dumping duty and Minimum Input Price (MIP) on jute products imported from Bangladesh and Nepal. Janab Ahmed also apprised the delegates about the Tariff barrier removal request to the Indian Government that the Bangladesh Government had placed. He assured the Delegation members who were looking for business opportunities in Bangladesh that 100 SEZs were coming up in Bangladesh out of which 3 would be dedicated for Indian businesses.

The leader of the delegation, Mr. Ambarish Dasgupta mentioned that West Bengal had all kinds of similarities with Bangladesh and the objective of bringing such a delegation was to strengthen the existing bilateral relationship between the two countries. Mr. Dasgupta requested the delegation members for their respective self-introductions, which they did and alongside also mentioned about the rationale of their visit. While providing response to the queries of this Multi Sectoral Delegation, The Hon’ble Minister mentioned the Priority Areas for Bangladesh, of which Information Technology was one and informed the delegation that “Digital Bangladesh” was a key focus area. Lots of IT parks were coming up and a realistic output target of USD 1 billion by 2018 and USD 5 billion by 2021 had been set. The other priority areas mentioned by him were Shipping (which provides 10% cash incentive); Leather, for which the target earning was USD 3-4 billion by 2021; Food processing (which offers 20% cash incentive); Jute, which had been a traditional and major exporting item to India (although the recent anti-dumping duty had acted as a dampener); Plastics; Agro Products, etc. Bangladesh was the 4th largest fish producing country in the world and there was a specific focus on the **Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Nepal (BBIN)** Initiative.

● **Meeting with Janab Nasrul Hamid, Hon’ble State Minister, Power Division, Ministry of Power, Energy and Mineral Resources:**

Some of the members of BCC&I Delegation had a meeting with the Hon’ble Power Minister and key officials of the Power Department at 2:00 p.m. in the Bangladesh Secretariat. The delegation members discussed possibilities of the Indian Private Sector companies making a penetration into the Power sector of Bangladesh – be it in generation or distribution of electricity in Bangladesh. The Hon’ble Minister also pointed out that Bangladesh currently was sourcing some of its power requirements from some Indian States. The Delegation members representing the power sector had a very fruitful meeting with the Power Minister focusing on 3 key initiatives:

- ♦ Long term power supply agreement (with a power plant at Haldia)
- ♦ Smart metering at Bangladesh distribution companies and
- ♦ Investment in solar or wind power business.

For Long term PPA, the Bangladesh Power Ministry requested to check on the Indian side as there were some regulatory clearances that were required prior to any project that maybe undertaken on that front.

● **B2B Meetings at the sidelines of the Indo-Bangla Trade Fair :**

◆ **Meeting with Mr. Sabur Khan, Chairman, Daffodil University:**

Mr. Dibya Sankar Das, Managing Partner, Delstar Overseas, Mr. Rafiqul Hasan, Chairman-cum-Managing Director with Mr. Syed A Nabi, Director, Techno Industry and Mr. Rabindranath Lahiri, Director and Vice Chairman, Techno India Batanagar with The Bengal Chamber Secretariat had a meeting with **Mr. Sabur Khan, Chairman of Daffodil University** at 4 p.m. at Pan Pacific SonarGaon Hotel. The focus sectors of this meeting were IT, Skill Development, Engineering, Instrumentation and Automation. Mr. Sabur Khan said that the education system in Bangladesh required further development. The students, after completing their education, did not get better job opportunities due to the lack of skillsets. The Skill Development scheme must be included in the education system to enable the students getting better opportunities in life. In Bangladesh, the engineering streams are, Computer Science, Electrical, Civil, Mechanical, Textile and Telecommunication Engineering. But Instrumentation and Automation engineering are required nowadays for proper training of instrumentation to the students and to enable them in getting better employable opportunities in industries. Mr. Khan said that the Bangladesh Government had decided to include the employability skills or soft skills course in the education system, as soft skills are considered as the key to workplace success. An IT Show would be held in Dhaka from 23rd to 25th March 2017. Mr. Khan requested Mr R N Lahiri and Mr Dibya Sankar Das to give a PowerPoint Presentation on Education & Skill Development and Instrumentation Course (Graduation and Diploma Course) respectively in that IT Show. Mr. Khan also requested Mr. Lahiri and Mr. Das to exchange their documents with him through email before the IT Show.

● **Meeting with Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce and Industry:**

The members of The Bengal Chamber Delegation had a meeting with Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce and Industry (MCCI) at 6 p.m. at BRAC EPL Stock Brokerage Office, Symphony, 3rd Floor, Road 142, Gulshan Avenue, Dhaka. The meeting was presided by Ms. Nihad Kabir, President of MCCI. The delegates introduced themselves briefing their sector of interest and business purpose in Bangladesh. While responding, Ms Kabir apprised that Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce is one of the oldest Chambers of Commerce in Bangladesh. It is an organization of manufacturers and from the services sectors (Banking and NBFCs). 90% of their members are big players/big investors. They are mostly into policy formulation, policy analysis, lobbying etc. It was also informed that Dr. APJ Adul Kalam visited the Chamber's 110th anniversary. MCCI Secretary General mentioned that

the country's macro economy was stable, macro indicators healthy with a GDP growth of 6.5% alongside a very vibrant private sector. The social indicators were also healthy. They also informed that the country's manufacturing standard was going through an upgradation with a booming IT sector. Skill development had a very bright opportunity. The alternative to the traffic situation in Petrapole and Benapole were barge services which needed a facelift. Pangaon port was at present a one-way traffic and economic feasibility of ocean going vessels to and fro Pangaon port needed to be looked into. Bengal was a good gateway for Bangladesh and hence talking a good talk was also to be followed by walking a good walk by the two countries. Ms. Kabir requested the delegates to share their business sectors through email for proper B2B facilitation going forward. The Delegation Leader, Mr. Ambarish Dasgupta invited the Metropolitan Chamber to The Bengal Chamber.

■ **Day 3: 17th February 2017: Dhaka**

● **Visit to Inauguration of ICT Pangaon :**

Capt. S B Mazumder, Chairman, Shipping Committee, The Bengal Chamber, with his colleague, Mr. Arup Bandhu Guha visited Pangaon Port upon invitation from the Ministry of Shipping, to be a part of the Inauguration of the International Container Terminal at Pangaon accompanied by Ms. Binti Jahan, an official from the BBIN desk of FBCCI. The ICT Pangaon is owned and built by Chittagong Port Authority. The construction was completed in 2013 and

formally inaugurated by the Prime Minister H.E. Sheikh Hasina on 7th November 2013. In the first voyage, the Coastal Vessel M.V. NOU KOLAN from Kolkata had arrived with 65 units of Import Cargo from Kolkata. After the inaugural speeches of the Ministers and other officials 'at the jetty front', the off-loading of the import loaded containers on the M.V. NOU KOLAN Vessel from Kolkata commenced. All the Ministers and Government Officials spoke on similar lines that the Government has incurred a large expenditure building the ICT Terminal and requested the Exim Trade, especially Importers and Exporters situated in and around Dhaka area, to support the ICT by using the facilities. They advised that purpose of the ICT was to reduce part of the road traffic between Chittagong Port and Dhaka, by IWT Barges undertaking a regular service between Chittagong Port and ICT Pangaon.

□ Day 4: 18th February 2017: Chittagong:

● Visit to Chittagong Port and meeting with key Port Officials:

Representatives of the Shipping sector, who were part of the Bengal Chamber delegation, visited Chittagong Port at 9.00 am on 18th February 2017. They had a drive through Chittagong port and then a detailed meeting with the Terminal Manager Mr. Golam Md. Sarwarul Islam and Assistant Terminal Manager. The key highlights of the Port visit and subsequent discussions were:

- ♦ Chittagong is a Riverine Port on the Karnaphuli River and open to Tides.
- ♦ There are only 19 berths in the Port of which 13 are reserved for Container vessels.
- ♦ Only 2 of the 13 container berths have shore crane facilities and so most container vessels calling on Chittagong have to be self-gearred vessels.
- ♦ The rise of tide is 1.5 – 2 mtrs and so ships at berth are subjected to the rise and fall of tides, in view of the Port not having Lock Gates.
- ♦ The throughput of the containers is 2.35 million Teus per annum.
- ♦ The annual increase in container throughput is high at 15-16%.
- ♦ The port has a yard capacity of 36357 Teus at any given time.
- ♦ 40% of the Imports are destuffed in Port and balance 60% is moved out to the off dock CFS.
- ♦ Container shipping being the lifeline of the port, there is generally berth congestion of average 1-2 days and at times much higher.

● B2B Meeting with The Chittagong Chamber of Commerce and Industry :

The members of The Bengal Chamber Delegation had a B2B Interaction with The Chittagong Chamber of Commerce and Industry at 11 a.m. on 18th February 2017 at WTC Building, Chittagong. At the onset of the meeting, there was a self-introduction of the delegates, followed by a video presentation by The Chittagong Chamber of Commerce and Industry showcasing the strategic location of Chittagong, its natural fundamental advantages and its unique

biodiversity. A similar video presentation of BCC&I showcasing West Bengal followed.

Mr. Md. Nurun Newaz, Senior Vice President of CCCI delivered the formal Welcome Address. He mentioned India and Bangladesh have huge potentials in bilateral trade. Local markets called Border Haats have been opened to facilitate trade between small scale industries and farmers to generate market opportunities for them. Cost of doing trade is high between Bangladesh and India mainly due to lack of trade facilitation on both sides. Almost all border crossings lack modern infrastructure. Other non-tariff barriers like regulatory measures and lack of trade services have affected the bilateral trade. The Chittagong Chamber, through BCC&I, would like to request the Indian Government to accept BSTI (Bangladesh Standards and Testing Institution) certification in case of export. Joint measures should be taken to remove other barriers so that both the countries could be benefitted. The delegation comprising consultancy, education, engineering, finance, health, IT, tourism, shipping, skilled development, logistics and transportation exchanged views with their Bangladesh counterparts to share knowledge and extend cooperation for mutual benefit. Mr. Somnath Halder, Assistant High Commissioner of India, Dhaka was present and while addressing the audience, he mentioned that Bangladesh and India share a historic relationship. Both the Governments need to work together closely to enhance the relationships and bilateral trade between the two countries. He also said that India could participate in the development of the Chittagong Port. Infrastructure development and more investments were needed to improve the tourism industry in Bangladesh. Development of Infrastructure sector had become a primary necessity in Bangladesh. Bangladesh was also trying to develop the two economic zones Mongla and Anwara. There was a great opportunity to develop healthcare in Bangladesh. Mr R.N Lahiri, Co-leader of the Delegation delivered his speech. He focused especially on Education and Skill Development and the Media Sector. Dr. Alam, Immediate Past President of CCCI, representing the Health Sector in Bangladesh, said that more investments were needed to develop the health sector in Bangladesh. Advance training should be given to the people of HR from the Health Sector. Dr. Mahmud Hasan, representing the tourism sector in Bangladesh said that development of infrastructure and the medical sector was needed to improve tourism opportunities.

India and Bangladesh enjoy a very deep-rooted bilateral relation based on mutual trust and cooperation. The two countries are closely cooperating in the fields of trade, investment, sharing of skill and transfer of technology, education, training and through people-to- people contact. There has been exchange of high-level visits between the two countries that have helped develop mutual understanding. The two countries have signed a number of agreements to institutionalize the bilateral relations. India is now investing more and more in Bangladesh in infrastructure development. This is very good news for the business community of both the countries. Both nations can become complementary to each other and be benefitted.

Day 1: London: 10th July 2017: Visit to Buckinghamshire New University for Discussions and B2B Meetings:

On 10th July 2017, the delegation members had B2B interaction with the professors, executives and departmental heads of the Buckinghamshire New University. The delegation was received Dr. Lorraine Watkins-Mathys, Dean of Faculty of Design, Media & Management and was welcomed and addressed by Professor Rebecca Bunting, Vice Chancellor of the University. Before the formal meeting, the delegation members had an informal discussion with the representatives of the University, briefing the latter about their sectors of interests and business purposes in the United Kingdom. The Formal B2B meeting was presided by the departmental heads and the faculty members. The Bengal Chamber Delegation was led by Dr. Suborno Bose, Chairman Education Committee of BCC&I, who delivered the opening remarks. Dr. Bose spoke about the close cultural and traditionalties that the two countries share and after highlighting the objectives of the trip to the UK, Dr. Bose requested the members to introduce themselves. In her closing remarks, Professor Rebecca Bunting, Vice Chancellor of the Buckinghamshire New University thanked the Bengal Chamber for bringing such a dynamic and

scholarly delegation, which led to a most stimulating and erudite discussion. Dr. Suborno Bose, along with Ms. Sukanya Bose, Deputy Director, The Bengal Chamber, thanked everyone present and expressed the interest of creating partner to partner based collaboration with the University.

Day 1: 10th July 2017: Visit to Brunel University:

On the same date, i.e., 10th July 2017, the delegation members had another interaction with the professors, executives and departmental heads of The Brunel University. The delegation was received Prof Andrew Ward, Director of Corporate Relations and was welcomed and addressed by Professor Ashley Braganza, Deputy Dean CBASS and Professor of Organizational Transformation at the University. Before the formal meeting, the delegation members had an informal discussion with the representatives of the University, briefing the latter about their sectors of interests and business purposes in the United Kingdom. The Formal B2B meeting was presided by the departmental heads and the faculty members. Dr. Suborno Bose, Chairman Education Committee of BCC&I, delivered the opening remarks.

Day 1: 10th July 2017: Meeting with Ambassador Dinesh Patnaik, Deputy High Commissioner of India at the High Commission of India in the UK, London:

The delegation was received by Shri. Saikat Sen Sharma, Counsellor Economic, High Commission of India and was welcomed by the Ambassador Dinesh Patnaik, Deputy High Commissioner of India. Shri. Patnaik congratulated the Chamber on bringing such a niche and focused delegation. He discussed about the opportunities and the demand for setting up incubation centres at different Universities especially at Cambridge University. Any Indian Company interested to open up incubation centres would be welcomed by the Universities. He also mentioned about scaling up the startups present in various universities in India, to have an ecosystem where Indian startups could tie up with the startups present in the United Kingdom, as the startup success rate now is 1:50. Universities become crucibles when startups try and test out their products or services. He also shared that India and UK are very close in all aspects. He suggested that for Masters programmes, the Universities should tie-up with the UK Universities so that the students could go through two years' course (one year in India and one year in the UK). In such cases where the VISA Application is genuine and are for studies or short stays, VISA is not a problem in the UK. He also suggested BCC&I Education Committee could communicate with the UK Universities regarding the internship programmes with a concept like KNOW INDIA, where they could send their students for unpaid internship in India for 3 to 4 months and the Chamber could coordinate appropriately. He also suggested the need for looking into FINTECH as after demonetization, he felt India should look into FINTECH more. UK is one of the best in Innovation and FINTECH. Dr. Suborno Bose thanked Shri Patnaik on behalf of the Chamber and the delegation and concluded with a Vote of Thanks to the Chair.

Day 2: London: 11th July 2017: Meeting with United Kingdom Department for International Trade

The BCC&I delegation had an excellent interaction with Ms. Caroline Plumb OBE, Prime Minister's Business Ambassador for Professional Services. She stressed on innovation and observed that there are many opportunities for the small scale industries in context of innovation.

Followed by Ms. Caroline Plumb, Mr. Phillip D'Costa, Partner, Commercial Dispute Resolution and India Group at Penningtons Law Firm made a presentation on technology transfer from the United Kingdom to international markets.

He also discussed on the trends and opportunities. The session was very useful for some of the members especially those into financial services and financing as they clarified as well as discussed various issues. Thereafter, the delegates had a most engaging session with Mr. Andrew McHallam, Head of FCO Scholarship Unit, UK Export Finance. Mr. McHallam spoke about the Chevening Scholarships programme as well as the fellowship programme. Following this the delegation met Ms. Julian Lynn, Export Finance Manager of UK Export Finance. SREI took a lead role and Mr. Dhruv Bhalla of SREI interacted with them extensively.

Day 2: London: 11th July 2017: Meeting with London Chamber of Commerce and Industry:

The Bengal Chamber officials met the officials of the London Chamber of Commerce and Industry. Dr. Suborno Bose, leader of the BCC&I delegation introduced the Chamber. The Corporate Video of the Bengal Chamber was played for Mr. Peter Bishop, Deputy Chief Executive of London Chamber of Commerce and Industry.

The **lowest employment** with **4.6%** has been reported. **41% newTech Startups** are in **New South Wales**, which makes **New South Wales number one** in the country. **AUD 80 Billion** will be spent by the Government in **Infrastructure** in the next 4 years. The focused sectors being **Transport, Health, Education** and **Water Infrastructure**. Infrastructure is the **key priority of PPP Models**. Significant investments have been made from **Middle East, Canada, Korea and Japan**. **61%** of more than **510 Fintech companies** in Australia are in **New South Wales**. **Indian presence in IT is notable**. **New South Wales** is the **most popular destination for international students including Indians**.

It was followed by focused B2B for the delegates throughout the day.

It is estimated that India would be on **top three export market** by **2035**. Australia does not have **investment led relationship** with **India**. It is based more on **economic collaborations, strategic partnership and P2P ties** being important factors. **Skill development in Mining and other sectors** was mentioned in this context. **Health Tech, Hospital Management and Education** were also mentioned.

It was followed by meeting with **Ms. Tania Constable**, CEO, **Minerals Council of Australia**. The meeting was attended by **Mr. Chandra Shekhar Ghosh**, President, The Bengal Chamber and Managing Director and CEO, Bandhan Bank Limited; **Mr. Indrajit Sen**, President Designate The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry & Managing Director, International Combustion (India) Limited and **Mr. Subhodip Ghosh**, Director General, The Bengal Chamber of Commerce

and Industry. During the meeting, it was discussed that Mining comprises of 15% of Australia’s GDP. The primary focus of the **Minerals Council of Australia** is on **Mining equipment, Technology and Services (METS)** and there are a number of areas ranging from **technology applications in Geo Sciences** to processing, extraction and looking at the proliferation of technology are some of the key aspects that the minerals council is stressing on. In the context of cooperation with overseas countries including India, the newly minted “AN INDIA ECONOMIC STRATEGY TO 2035” was referred to in-depth and the aspects of regional connectivity and negotiations on issues like **CECA and RCEP** were also discussed. The members of the council requested the Bengal Chamber for its views on various aspects of the Indian mining industry and the Chamber provided them with the insight by focusing on not only mining and minerals in India, but also on the dynamics of this sector in West Bengal and the Eastern region. Regulatory issues with respect to overseas investments were also discussed. The last day of the delegation witnessed a Campus tour of the Technical University of Berlin. TU Berlin is one of Germany's highest ranked Universities in Statistics and operations research and in Mathematics. The tour included class visit, library visit, laboratory visit and also interaction with students.

Meeting with Chamber of Commerce Dusseldorf: The Delegation visited **Chamber of Commerce Dusseldorf.** Meeting was with **Ms. Katrin Lange**, Executive, International Business Division. She briefed about Chamber of Commerce Dusseldorf which concentrates on the City of Dusseldorf which is 624 sq km. There are 85000 Member Companies. Dusseldorf has Euro 58.2 billion GDP. They have export ratio of 45%. More than 25% of Europe's top 500 companies are at Dusseldorf.

It was discussed that The Bengal Chamber and Dusseldorf Chamber of Commerce would be in contact and explore the areas of complementarity to work together. To begin with, Innovations would be the key focus. The Chamber will connect the incubates of the Chamber's Incubation Centre with Chamber of Commerce Dusseldorf to offer an enabling eco system.

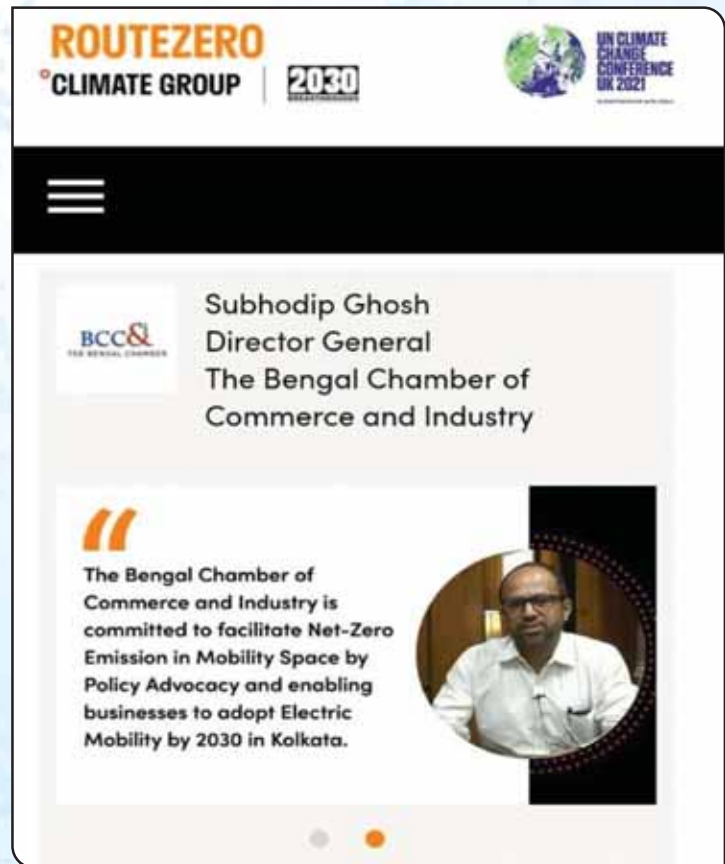

The other group visited a cement manufacturing company named Confidence Cement Ltd. This visit was facilitated by Chittagong Chamber catering to specific request from some of our delegate members. The GM of the plant gave a detailed presentation of their factory operations, import-export materials and routes, production capacity and the overall cement manufacturing ecosystem in Bangladesh.

The Assistant High Commissioner of India in Chittagong, Dr. Rajeev Ranjan, invited our delegates for a networking dinner, where Select industry leaders of Chittagong were also invited. President of Chittagong Chamber, Mr. Mahbubul Alam and Chief Operating Officer of Evercare, Mr. Samir Singh were present among others.

On 18th February 2023, The Delegation had B2B Meeting with the Members of Chittagong Chamber of Commerce and Industry where as an outcome of B2B interaction:

- To ease out flight connectivity especially from Chittagong, The Bengal Chamber has requested CCCI to send a communiqué for introduction of more flights were covered. We also discussed about Help Desk which will be hosted on The Bengal Chamber website for receiving queries on bilateral business issues. DCCI has also been requested if a similar initiative can be undertaken at their end, following which we shall circulate it amongst our membership and stakeholders.

FORGING STRONGER INTRA BRICS TRADE : EXPLORING COMPLEMENTARITIES

6TH SEPTEMBER 2016, CHAMBER PREMISES

West Bengal Industrial Development Corporation (WBIDC) and the Department of Agriculture, Government of West Bengal, in association with The Bengal Chamber of Commerce & Industry and Indian Chamber of Commerce hosted the BRICS Young Diplomats Forum during their visit to Kolkata on 6th September 2016 at the Chamber Premises at an event titled "Forging Stronger Intra BRICS Trade: Exploring Complementarities". The event was a part of the initiative of the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India's elaborate plan to publicize its foreign policy initiatives to reach out to more people, especially the youth, and a beginning was to be made at the BRICS Summit in Goa on October 15-16. The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) is planning to hold 90 events across several cities ahead of the eighth meeting of the five-nation group – Brazil, Russia, India, China, South Africa – that holds 42 % of the world's population and 25% of the global GDP.

The Speakers included:

- Shri Amarendra Khatua, IFS, Dean FSI and Secretary, Government of India.
- Dr Sanjeev Chopra, IAS, Additional Chief Secretary, Government of West Bengal.
- Shri Talleen Kumar, IAS, Principal Secretary, Department of IT&E, Government of West Bengal.
- Ms Nayantara Pal Chowdhury, Senior Member from Indian Chamber of Commerce.
- Shri P Kamlakanth, IFS, Executive Director, WBIDC.
- Shri Pradip Majumdar, Advisor, Agriculture Department, Government of West Bengal.

The Young Diplomats, for whom the session was organized, included a team of at least five to six from each of the five BRICS nations. All the Diplomats from the BRICS nations stayed in Kolkata from the 3rd to the 6th of September and the session was part of their tour programme.

Dr. Sanjeev Chopra, IAS, Additional Chief Secretary, in charge of Agriculture, Government of West Bengal presided over the Session.

Shri Amarendra Khatua, IFS, Dean FSI and Secretary, Government of India, thanked the Chambers of Commerce and the Government of West Bengal for hosting the forum at Kolkata. He felt that were a number of technical co-operation programmes open to the BRICS nations and the interactions here would surely add a lot of knowledge and experience for the participants.

Mr Sutanu Ghosh, President Designate, The Bengal Chamber of Commerce & Industry, in his welcome address expressed his happiness at Kolkata being included by the MoEF in the BRICS schedule. He stated that with a cumulative global trade of 20 percent and generating over 40 percent of global economic growth, the BRICS countries and India specifically can position themselves as a prominent global leader in trade and are poised to strengthen their relationship through intra-BRICS trade. He also stated that the Bengal Chamber of Commerce in association with

the Government of West Bengal has envisioned to reposition Kolkata as a "niche city" promoting a select skill set, like the Silicon Valley in the USA.

Shri Talleen Kumar, IAS, Principal Secretary, Department of IT&E, Government of West Bengal, in his detailed presentation on the "ICT landscape in West Bengal", distinctly elaborated on the IT sector and opportunities that exist in the State for members of the BRICS nations. Cyber security, big data analytics, designs and innovations were the areas of strength in West Bengal. He emphasized the availability of skilled manpower with presence of several renowned technical institutions in the State as well as the immense growth prospects of the State in the context of the large market it offers. An interesting round of Q&A followed Shri Kumar's presentation.

Ms Nayantara Pal Chowdhury from Indian Chamber of Commerce, stated that West Bengal was emerging as an important investment hub in the country and would provide the BRICS nations trade and investment opportunities especially in IT, agriculture, horticulture and fisheries and offered ICC's help from areas ranging from policy advocacy with the Government of India to identifying key sectors for investments by the BRIC nations.

Shri P Kamlakanth, IFS, Executive Director, WBIDC, in his presentation, emphasized the opportunities available in the State for investment in the manufacturing sector and the State's focus towards development of the industrial eco-system. The specially earmarked manufacturing belts and industrial parks, development of ports and dedicated freight corridors and skill development initiatives taken up were highlights of his presentation.

Shri Pradip Majumdar, Advisor, Agriculture Department, Government of West Bengal, presented in detail the growth story of India's agriculture in general, particularly highlighting the improvements brought about on West Bengal's agricultural front through use of IT and IT enabled services, and by addressing the problems faced by the farmers, 95% of whom are marginalized. IT support, financial support and legislative changes in the State has brought about immense improvements and today West Bengal happens to be the leading producer of rice and vegetables. 66% of land area in West Bengal is under cultivation against the Indian average of 50%. There exist immense opportunities for export of agricultural produce, including a variety of fruits from West Bengal.

The Panel Discussion which followed the opening session had Mr S Radhakrishnan, Chairman, TIE and Past President, Bengal Chamber of Commerce & Industry; Mr Kalyan Kar of Indian Chamber of Commerce and Prof Soikat Sinha Roy, Professor of Economics of Jadavpur University, who deliberated on the outcome and prospects of the cooperation in the BRICS group. Mr Snehasish Sur Moderated the session. The panel discussed a number of important issues ranging from the key economic and strategic measures to be adopted for sustained growth as well as harnessing each other's strengths through FDI flows and treaties.

INTERACTIVE SESSION WITH MR. PATRICK SANTILLO, MINISTER COUNSELOR FOR COMMERCIAL AFFAIRS, U.S. EMBASSY NEW DELHI

The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry organized an Interactive Session with Mr. Patrick Santillo, Minister Counselor for Commercial Affairs, U.S. Embassy –India, for its senior members, on 4th October 2016 from 11.00 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. in the Chamber.

Mr. Santillo was accompanied by Mr. Jonathan T. Ward, Principal Commercial Officer and Mr. Arup Mitra, Senior Commercial Specialist, US Commercial Service, US Consulate General Kolkata.

The focus areas of discussions were:

- Energy
- Health
- Infrastructure
- Information Technology
- Water

The sector focused discussions were as under:

Health

Dr. Amit Ghose initiated the discussions on Health which he mentioned as one of the booming sectors. His observations included the demography, social structure, increased affordability, emergence of insurance in healthcare sector as the factors behind growth of this sector. He also spoke about the gap between the demand and supply of quality doctors and paramedical staffers. He highlighted that the country is in apex performance in some specializations like robotics surgery. He identified e-commerce as a potential element for the healthcare industry. The increase in medical tourism in India is also another important factor for its growth.

Technology collaboration and tie-ups for medical education and training are the areas where partnerships may be explored with the US.

Energy

Mr. Deb A Mukherjee commenced the discussions on Energy speaking about India's INDC in COP 21, held in November 2016. Towards this, Mr. Mukherjee mentioned the value chain as:

- Policy
- Regulations
- Business Model
- Delivery
- Finance

He emphasized innovative financial models to make the renewable target viable.

Technology collaboration and financial tie-ups with US companies will help India achieve its INDC target.

For solar, technology for smart and efficient grid is important for availability of power for all 24*7. In this context, he also talked about creating appropriate skills to maintain the assets which are being created in solar and other renewables. Discussions in this context highlighted that the materials and processes involved in generating solar energy may be

obtained from the US.

Nuclear Power was also mentioned which would be an area of focus in the near future.

Emphasis was on clean coal. Bacteriological intervention for coalbed methane was mentioned where technology transfer from the US would help. Need for environment friendly mining equipment was also identified.

Smart grid for electricity transmission and distribution is also important.

Water

Mr. Alope Das Ghosh started the discussions on Water. He mentioned that India had mostly use of ground water in earlier days. However, the use of surface water is increasing in recent times, which is more predominant in the western part of the country. In West Bengal, though the quantity of ground water is not a challenge, but quality is a concern both in terms of health and environment. He indicated that there are opportunities for US companies in the water segment. Opportunities are also in waste water treatment. The technology from the US would be helpful in this sector.

An important observation on network management of water was made. USA may play a major role by providing technology for reduction of wastage of water during distribution.

Infrastructure

The President mentioned that a deep sea port would be very crucial for West Bengal. It is expected that the Tajpur Port project will be executed. The Chamber is in the process of preparing a Position Paper.

Information Technology

Mr. Arnab Basu addressed on IT which is one of the key export identities of India. In IT, India has several large Indian companies operating alongside foreign MNCs. The sector is going through a transition. Policies like implementation of GST which will have impact on all organizations, across all sectors, will need major technological intervention. The Government's Digital India Campaign is also a major catalyst for the sector.

With the advancement of technology, the outsourcing jobs are being reduced. Value chain is witnessing a vertical movement.

Startups constitute a key feature of India's IT eco-system. Some of the home grown IT Start Ups are becoming major players with potential competition to global ones.

There is a gradual shift towards products from services. Major IT companies are making investments in products.

Innovations and revolution around cloud are changing the eco system. Establishment of datacenters of global IT companies in India has made a positive impact on building confidence as data is not leaving the boundary.

Many conventional organizations are revamping themselves as technology organizations. Technological interventions in conventional areas like agriculture are changing the paradigm.

Internet of Things (IoT) and Cyber Security are major areas of focus.

MSME development is a focus of the Government of West Bengal. Electronics hardware industry is primarily constituted with MSMEs. In this regard, the US may share suggestions and models to create electronics hardware growth in the State.

INTERACTIVE SESSION WITH HIS EXCELLENCY NILS RAGNAR KAMSVAG, AMBASSADOR OF NORWAY TO INDIA,

18TH OCTOBER 2016, THE CHAMBER PREMISES

The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry organized an Interactive Session with His Excellency Nils Ragnar Kamsvag, Ambassador of Norway to India on 18th October 2016 in the Chamber.

The Ambassador was accompanied by his gracious wife and his colleagues, Mr. Helge Tryti, Counsellor, Commercial Affairs, Embassy of Norway in New Delhi and Director, Innovation Norway and Mr. Johan Loov, Second Secretary, Political Affairs, Embassy of Norway in New Delhi. Ms. Nayantara Palchoudhuri, Hony. Consul, Royal Norwegian Consulate, Kolkata was also present.

The Ambassador commenced his address mentioning that Kolkata would be the ideal destination, as indicated by the map, for Norway to connect with India by sea route. He spoke about the historical linkage Norway shares with Calcutta. Their first Consulate was opened in Calcutta in 1845.

He exclaimed that India and Norway share the common vision of a prosperous, sustainable and peaceful future based on international law and diplomacy. India is now one of the world's largest economies and is set to emerge as a global power. He made special emphasis on Energy and Environment and Shipping. He applauded India's forward looking attitude in the realm of Energy. He mentioned that Norway's direct and indirect investment in India would be approximately USD 13-14 billion. There is a steady increase in Norwegian companies setting up business in India.

Mr. Helge Tryti reiterated His Excellency's views on the locational advantage of West Bengal and Kolkata for Norway to do business in India. He highlighted the under mentioned sectors which Norway is focusing on:

INTERACTIVE SESSION WITH H.E. MR. ASFAW DINGAMO, AMBASSADOR, EMBASSY OF ETHIOPIA IN INDIA

25th November 2016 Chamber Premises

The Bengal Chamber of Commerce & Industry organised an interactive session with His Excellency Mr. Asfaw Dingamo, The Ethiopian Ambassador to India on Friday, 25th November at the Chamber premises.

His Excellency Mr. Dingamo was welcomed by The BCC&I President, Mr. Sutanu Ghosh, who delivered the welcome address. The Ambassador was accompanied by Mr. Kiros Hailemariam, Counsellor - I, who also delivered, a comprehensive presentation on Ethiopia and investment opportunities by Indian Industry in Ethiopia. From the Chamber, Mr. Ardhendu Mandal, Chairperson of the International Trade Cell was also present. Amongst the attendees, there were many delegates from the existing investors in Ethiopia.

His Excellency Mr. Dingamo spoke most eloquently about the history and culture of Ethiopia, from its proto-historic emergence in world history, to the reign of the Queen of the Kingdom S'aba, known in literature as Sheba, to its present day emergence as a developing power in the African vis-a-vis international perspective. He stated that Ethiopia is Africa's oldest independent country and its second largest in terms of population. Apart from a five-year occupation by Mussolini's Italy, it has never been colonised. It has a unique cultural heritage, being the home of the Ethiopian Orthodox Church - one of the oldest Christian churches - and a monarchy that ended only in the coup of 1974. It served as a symbol of African independence throughout the colonial period, and was a founder member of the United Nations and the African base for many international organizations. Ethiopia, officially known as the Federal Democratic Republic of Ethiopia is a Sovereign State located in the Horn of Africa. It shares a border with Eritrea to the north and northeast, Djibouti and Somalia to the east, Sudan and South Sudan to the west, and Kenya to the south. With nearly 100 million inhabitants, Ethiopia is the most populous landlocked country in the world, as well as the second-most populous nation on the African continent after Nigeria.

Some of the oldest evidence for anatomically modern humans has been found in Ethiopia, which is widely considered the region from which modern humans first set out for the Middle East and places beyond. According to linguists, the first Afro-asiatic-speaking populations settled in the Horn region. Tracing its roots to the 2nd millennium BC, Ethiopia was a monarchy for most of its history. During the first centuries AD, the Kingdom of Aksum maintained a unified civilization in the region, followed by the Ethiopian Empire circa 1137. Ethiopia derived prestige with its uniquely successful military resistance during the late 19th-century Scramble for Africa, becoming the only African country to defeat a European colonial power and retain its sovereignty.

It was in July 1948, India and Ethiopia first established diplomatic relations at the level of legations. The relationship was raised to ambassadorial level four years later in 1952. India maintains an embassy in Addis Ababa and Ethiopia in New Delhi. The two countries have enjoyed close and friendly relations with India supporting Ethiopian developmental efforts while Ethiopia has supported Indian interests such as its claim to a permanent seat on the United Nations Security Council. India and Ethiopia share a common understanding on such issues as cross-border international terrorism, the need and direction for reform of the United Nations, and the importance of action on Climate Change.

He stated that trade between the two countries is expected to surpass \$1 billion by 2017. Indian exports to Ethiopia consists of drugs and pharmaceuticals, steel, machinery, food items, plastic and linoleum products, paper, textiles, chemicals, transport equipment and steel.

India's imports from Ethiopia include raw hides and skins, pulses, oil seeds, spices, leather and scrap metal. India is Ethiopia's second largest source of Foreign Direct Investments with investments amounting to \$5 billion. Indian investments in Ethiopia are expected to be worth \$10 billion by 2015 with India approving investments worth \$4.78 billion in 2011.

He further stated that India and Ethiopia signed a Bilateral Investment Promotion and Protection Agreement in 2007 and a Double Taxation Avoidance Agreement in 2011 to promote mutual trade and investments. At the Second India Africa Forum Summit, the then Indian Prime Minister Manmohan Singh announced a \$300 million line of credit to help revive the Ethiopia-Djibouti rail route. The Duty Free Tariff Preference scheme that was announced at the summit allowing for imports from Least Developed Countries into India has however had a positive impact on bilateral trade with the value of Ethiopian exports to India now reaching \$120 million. The balance of trade however continues to remain in India's favour. India has also extended \$710 million in lines of credit to help in rural electrification and the revival of the sugar industry in Ethiopia.

Mr. Kiros Hailemariam, Counsellor - I, the diplomatic team member accompanying H.E. the Ambassador explained that labour costs in Ethiopia are 50% cheaper compared to India and power tariffs one-third, and it was a favoured destination because of its favourable political and economic climate. The Ethiopian government is offering attractive incentives to draw foreign investors, such as land on decades-long lease, cheap power and duty-free exports to key markets like the US and Europe. Ethiopia is emerging as a favoured low-cost destination for apparel makers on the lines of Vietnam, Bangladesh and India. It is not only Indian textile companies that are making a beeline for Ethiopia - companies from China, Korea and Turkey too are investing in this African nation.

Indian enterprises, both large and mid-sized, have taken note of the benefits and are setting up manufacturing facilities in Africa's oldest independent country. Fabric-to-apparel maker Raymond has invested \$100 million over the next two-three years for a garmenting unit in Awasa, a lake-side city, which will be one of its largest facilities. Arvind, another Indian textile major, has set up a six-million-piece garment plant in Ethiopia. Mr. Hailemariam further pointed out that, among various factors, the long-term lease for factories that the Ethiopian government offers is one of the main attractive propositions for the company's decision to invest in this east African nation. There is also single-window clearance for industrial projects. Kanoria Textiles, too, is setting up a project there. With its value proposition similar to that of Bangladesh which includes large population, cheap and young labour, Ethiopia also offers cheap power and a highly committed government. Ethiopia, without doubt, is set to be the epicentre of textiles across Africa. Mr. Hailemariam said that roads, railways, consultancy, telecommunication, power, mango plantation and water resource management are the areas where the Indian companies are jointly working with Ethiopian companies. He further stated, "We offer incentives such as tax holidays of one to five years depending on the project location, tax holidays of up to two years on income from expanded projects and unrestricted repatriation of profits, dividends, interest payments from approved projects." Investment activities eligible for income tax exemption are manufacturing or agro-industrial activities or agricultural products, and there are no stipulations

on foreign investors on re-investing profits or dividend, as long as at least 60 per cent of the output is exported, he added.

For exporters looking at longer term and a bigger picture, investing in Ethiopia is definitely an option. For Ethiopia to be able to integrate and assimilate foreign investment into its economy, the levels of technology and capital intensiveness should be appropriate for a developing economy. India's long experience in developing appropriate technology and in the promotion of small industries could be used by Ethiopia, keeping the above objective in mind. Opportunities for foreign investment in Ethiopia abound in the areas of mineral extraction, agro based industries and light manufacturing. Indian businesses can invest either individually or as a consortium in areas like infrastructure development and mineral extraction. Smaller units can be set up to tap opportunities in areas like leather & leather manufactures and food processing.

This was followed by a very proactive Q/A session, where several attendees from the industries, all of them prospective investors or existing business owners in Ethiopia, asked several questions with focus on Power, Trades, Infrastructures and similar industrial verticals forming a major percentage of the representation. The questions were noted down by HE Ambassador Dingamo, and he addressed all the issues mentioned. A gist of these solutions offered are as follows:

1. In response to the JIS Group, HE Dingamo stated The Ethiopian educational system is a good potential area for Indians. Of course the process of partnering was open to all, but he felt that it would be easy for any educational investor to expand in the country.
2. As regards transmission technology providers, in response to a query raised by the representative from Skipper, the Ambassador spoke of the UAP (Universal Electrical Access Programme) aimed at electrifying Ethiopia to 100% by 2025, and assured that there was good opportunity for investors. However, this would be a totally government owned project, he stated, as there was no private player in the Power or Transmission Sector as yet in Ethiopia.
3. Professor B.K.Chowdhury, HOD, Public Systems - IISWBM spoke of Energy systems prevalent in Ethiopia, as well as existing frameworks guiding the same. The Ambassador replied with the kinds of green initiatives that Ethiopia was taking, inclusive of its general climate conditions, which were extremely affable.
4. DCPL, a major Indian consulting firm operating in Ethiopia for more than two decades raised the issue of non-existence of foreign banks in Ethiopia, to which both Mr. Dingamo and Mr.Hailemariam commented that all the Ethiopian nationalised banks corresponded with all international banks.
5. RTS Power inquired as to whether the tax exemptions extended to existing operators in Ethiopia, to which he received a positive affirmation.
6. Mr. Indrajit Sen, Sr.VP, BCC&I inquired regarding which entity was the equivalent body to be approached to facilitate Ease of Doing Business in Ethiopia. This very relevant query was replied, and the Ethiopian Chamber of Commerce's coordinates were shared.
7. Dakshata Technical Academy and Mr.Zariwala also received affirmative responses to their queries regarding expansion opportunities in Skills domain and export of medium voltage switchgears to Ethiopia.

The programme was a great success. The high tea organised by BCC&I at the end of the programme provided excellent opportunities in the way of a networking platform for further exchanges between the overseas dignitaries and the delegates attending the programme.

A SPECIAL INTERACTIVE SESSION WITH HIS EXCELLENCY MR. PARAMASIVUM PILLAY VYAPOORY, HON'BLE VICE PRESIDENT OF REPUBLIC OF MAURITIUS

17TH APRIL 2017, CHAMBER PREMISES

The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry organized a Special Interactive Session with His Excellency, Mr. Paramasivum Pillay Vyapoory, Hon'ble Vice President of Republic of Mauritius on 17th April 2017 at The Chamber premises. The session was graced by His Excellency Mr. Paramasivum Pillay Vyapoory, Hon'ble Vice President of Republic of Mauritius and Mr. Deven Coopoosamy, Partner - Client Relationship CORPORATE, Rogers Capital, Mauritius. The audience included important stakeholders and members of the Chamber. The objective of the session was to explore bilateral business opportunities between India and Mauritius in general and building new bonds between Kolkata/West Bengal and Mauritius in particular.

It was the first ever business forum His Excellency graced in the City.

His Excellency Mr. Paramasivum Pillay Vyapoory and Mr. Deven Coopoosamy took a walk down the Calcutta Gallery accompanied by Mr. Sutanu Ghosh, President, BCC&I, Mr. Subhodip Ghosh, Director General BCC&I and Ms. Angana Guha Roy Chowdhury, Deputy Director, BCC&I, following which the interactive session commenced.

Mr. Sutanu Ghosh, in his welcome speech, highlighted the Indo-Mauritius bilateral relations and also introduced the Hon'ble Vice President to the audience. Mr. Abhishek Basu, Executive Trustee of Basu Foundation for the Arts, the cultural partner of BCC&I for this event, showcased the gamut of interesting work that The Basu Foundation had been doing on connecting people through art, through an audio visual presentation.

An Introduction of Business Opportunities along with the Ease of Doing Business in Mauritius was presented by Mr. Deven Coopoosamy with the help of an audio visual presentation.

Subsequently, His Excellency Mr. Paramasivum Pillay Vyapoory addressed the gathering by elaborating on the ideal environment for doing business in the island nation and the bilateral relationship between India and Mauritius. The Hon'ble Vice President mentioned that Mauritius had a

skilled workforce and modern infrastructure for setting up factories. He shared how Mauritius used to be a mono-crop model economy at the time of their Independence when sugar used to constitute 90% of their trade which accounted for only 1% of their GDP, and how the Government now envisions raising Mauritius to the level of a high income economy as part of the Vision 2030 exercise. His Excellency spoke of the trade links Mauritius has had with India, where he mentioned certain facts like - India has been the largest exporter of goods and services to Mauritius and how India and Mauritius have been sharing strong trade relations even in the recent past, and how the double tax avoidance convention has helped play a key role in enhancing the financial statistics.

To highlight the strong Indian influence on Mauritius, His Excellency Mr. Vyapoory named several places/monuments that were named after famous Indians including Mahatma Gandhi, Jawaharlal Nehru, Swami Vivekananda and Rabindranath Tagore. The relations between the armed forces of India and Mauritius have also been good. The famous Mauritius navy ship, Barracuda was constructed by an Indian shipbuilder, while even today India carries out patrols and surveillances with Mauritius.

India is Mauritius's leading trading partner and has been the largest exporter of goods and services to the country since 2007. His Excellency highlighted the joint operations that both the countries are carrying out presently, with a reference to the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India His Excellency Shri Narendra Modi's Mauritius visit in 2015. His Excellency complimented the Hon'ble Prime Minister for redefining the bilateral relationship between the two countries during his visit.

The proposed Indo-Mauritius Comprehensive Economic Cooperation and Partnership Agreement is expected to be signed later this year as both countries finalised the areas of exchange, he added. He said that the two sides had agreed upon the areas in which the agreement would be implemented. Areas which have been identified are financial services, ICT, health, education, R&D and construction. He said that the agreement would lead to an expansion of trade

on both sides and enhanced investment besides enhanced economic relations. Sectors which offered investment opportunities to Indian companies were ICT and BPO, banking services and insurance. He also mentioned that investments in Mauritius will give Indian companies preferential market access to USA and to Africa.

Regarding the Direct Tax Avoidance Convention (DTAC) between India and Mauritius, he said that it was due to this agreement that the cumulative equity inflow to India till April, 2015 was to the tune of USD87 bn. He said that India had extended several lines of credit to Mauritius, the last one being USD500 million announced by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in March, 2015. Mauritius is also ready to offer financial incentives to the Indian film industry, he observed. His Excellency thanked The Bengal Chamber for providing a relevant platform for exploring bilateral trade and B2B interfaces.

Mr. Sutanu Ghosh, President, introduced Mr. Bruce Bucknell, British Deputy High Commissioner in Kolkata, who represented the UK in the 13 Indian States of West Bengal, Bihar, Jharkhand, Odisha, Chattisgarh, Assam, Sikkim, Meghalaya, Manipur, Mizoram, Tripura, Nagaland, Arunachal Pradesh and the Union Territory of Andaman & Nicobar Islands. Before taking up his assignment in Kolkata, Mr. Bucknell was Her Majesty's Ambassador to the Republic of Belarus from 2012 to 2016. Earlier, he was the Deputy Head of Security in Estates and Security Directorate of the Foreign & Commonwealth Office (2009-2011) and Deputy Head of the Joint FCO and Department for International Development's Sudan Unit (2007-2009). He served as First Secretary in the British Embassy in Madrid from 2003 to 2007, and his previous postings were in Milan (1995-99) and Amman (1988-91). He studied modern history at Durham University, and takes a keen interest in the history of the places he visits.

Mr. Bruce Bucknell thanked the Chamber for inviting him over for an interactive session with its Managing Committee. He was aware that there was a business delegation from the Chamber visiting the UK next month. He stated that he would not be speaking too much on the current state of affairs in the UK because far more information was available with all from the English media. Mr. Bucknell's talk covered the following points.

- There were more than one and a half million people of Indian origin living in the UK and that means a lot insofar as Indo-British relations are concerned which has been good, especially commercial

relations. Financial trade between the UK and India has been to the extent of over 16 billion Pounds and investments from the UK has been almost 21 billion Pounds (between 2006 to 2016) to India, followed by 15.6 billion Pounds to Japan, 15.3 billion Pounds to America and 17.7 billion Pounds in Germany. UK-India bilateral investment partnership was very strong, and would get better.

- On the issue of jobs and growth, actually British Companies from former colonial India had increased the number of employees to more than 110000. Acquiring Companies in the UK was also easy.
- The issue of Brexit and the results of the latest general elections in the UK were realities to be faced. In this scenario Britain was committed to widening its economic and diplomatic relations outside EU. There were uncertainties but Britain was confident about the fundamental strengths of UK's economy and optimistic about the role it would forge by building on its strength as a trading nation.

- UK Export Finance (UKEF) would play a major role in boosting Britain's international trade. UKEF is UK's export credit agency which provides export finance and insurance that complements commercial business. It works closely in partnership with UK Trade & Investment and ensures that no viable UK export fails for want of finance or insurance. Export Finance was well recognized by the US, Japan and other international trading nations.

- The International Ease of Doing Business Index of Britain remains higher than the US. It has the lowest Corporate Tax, currently at 19% and was committed to reducing it to 17% by 2020. In Global Innovation it was above the US, for the third year in a row. UK was a very open and welcoming place to do business.

Mr. Bruce Bucknell's talk was followed by a very invigorating round of discussions which covered matters ranging from restoration of direct flights from Kolkata to London, UK's focus on Kolkata and West Bengal and its various programmes towards development, poverty alleviation and climate mitigation in this part of the country as well as challenges the UK would face post-elections. Mr. Bucknell assured that he would be looking into the prospects of restoration of flights between the UK and Kolkata. He also gave a detailed account of the climate, energy and poverty alleviation programmes that were underway in Kolkata, West Bengal and the Eastern and North Eastern States of the country.

AN INTERACTIVE SESSION WITH HIS EXCELLENCY DR. DEMETRIOS A. THEOPHYLACTOU, HIGH COMMISSIONER OF CYPRUS TO INDIA

25TH NOVEMBER 2017, CHAMBER PREMISES

The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry, in association with TAFI, organized an Interactive Session with His Excellency Dr. Demetrios A. Theophylactou, High Commissioner of Cyprus to India on 25th November, 2017 at the Tata Steel Room of The Bengal Chamber of Commerce & Industry on “Cyprus : An Exotic Tourist Destination”.

The Programme started with Mr. Deb A Mukherjee, Vice President, The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry delivering the formal welcome address. Mr. Anil Jhunjhunwala, Honorary Consul, Honorary Consulate of Cyprus introduced H.E. Dr. Demetrios A. Theophylactou to the audience.

A man of letters, the High Commissioner very aptly started by describing the geographical demographic composition of Cyprus. It was a part of the British Empire, as a military occupation from 1914 to 1925 and a Crown colony from 1925 to 1960. Cyprus became an independent nation in 1960. Cyprus joined European Union in May, 2004. He also touched upon the rich culture and heritage of the country and went on to describe the socio economic developments in the country till date. H.E. Dr. Demetrios A. Theophylactou mentioned that tourism accounts for 10.7% of GDP indicating a heavily tourism driven economy. One of the main attractions of Cyprus is the beaches. It ranks first in cleanest water in EU. To attract more tourists, the Government of Cyprus is proceeding with licensing in the development of the Integrated Casino Resort. Cyprus is also a full member of the World Tourism Organization due to the huge tourism prospects in the country.

He however mentioned that apart from tourism, situations are also conducive for the growth of other sectors like shipping, banking and healthcare. H.E Dr. Theophylactou specially harped upon the safety aspect of the country stating

that it ranks number one in the safest small country category. He also stated that India Cyprus relation is being further boosted by a recent agreement increasing maritime trade between the two countries. Of the thirteen other agreements signed, the important sectors include Education, Defence, IT and Mining. He also mentioned that Cyprus was one of the largest foreign direct investors in India following Brexit. The investments can also be attributed to the much lower tax structure.

The programme concluded with Mr. Anil Punjabi, Chairman, Tourism Committee of The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry delivering the formal vote of thanks to H. E. Dr. Demetrios A. He has lectured at several universities and was member of the external research advisory board of the faculty of Design, Engineering and Manufacturing at the Delft University of Technology. Theo Groothuizen has been invited on numerous occasions as speaker, workshop leader, jury member, moderator or curator and he organized several events to promote Dutch Design & Innovation abroad.

The objective of the interactive session in Kolkata was to explain to the participants about the HSD (Hague Security Delta) organization and to discuss how the State of West Bengal could develop a similar ecosystem like the triple helix model and a relevant innovation ecosystem. Participants included senior executives from ITC Ltd, Ericsson Global India Services, Infosec Foundation, Integral Technocom, Department of IT&E, Government of West Bengal and many more. Post the interaction the participants expressed their interest to set up an ecosystem which could offer multiple opportunities for collaboration with HSD and experts in the Netherlands on safety & security, in particular on Cyber Security. Mr. Zhanwu said that he had been in the City of Kolkata for two and a half years now and that he loved Bengal and Kolkata which he thought was indeed a city of vitality, knowledge, development, joy and a city of prosperity. He felt that with the growth and development in this part of the world, this City should rank amongst the top cities of the world in the next few years. Mr. Zhanwu stated that he greatly admired the history and heritage of the Bengal Chamber of Commerce and felt happy to be at the Chamber.

The Consul General spoke about current Chinese infrastructure and connectivity initiatives spanning continents, trade relations and prospects of trade with India and specifically Bengal, while focusing on the scope of future Chinese investments in Bengal.

He commented that China's growth story is currently transforming from 'high-speed growth' to 'high quality growth'. From an average yearly growth rate of about 9% over several years, China has come down to a growth rate of 6.9% per annum this year and it should settle at around 6.5% with its new thrust on quality and efficiency. Innovation was the new course to be adopted in place of extension of scale. The traditional ties between Bengal and China could provide further scope for expansion of business here.

The objective of the programme was to create a platform to facilitate dedicated B2B Meetings with the delegate members of IPCCI. There was a positive feedback of taking the relationship forward by organizing a return business delegation to Poland.

The session commenced with the addresses by Mr. Indrajit Sen, President Designate, The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry and Mr. J. J. Singh, President, Indo- Polish Chamber of Commerce & Industry, Poland. Ms. Kuhuk Bhushan, IAS shared insights on "West Bengal –Emerging growth engine of India". She focused on the opportunities of doing business in West Bengal.

Mr. Marek Magierowski, Hon'ble Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs of Poland addressed on Poland-India Business and Economic Relationship. Mr. Magierowski highlighted the importance of mining and its contribution to the economic growth of Poland. He showcased Silesia in Poland, famous for

its Coal and Industry, as a potential region for economic partnership with Bengal. He also mentioned that mining, coal, food processing, power, academic, medical, information and communication technologies were the potential sectors for bilateral collaboration between Poland and India.

Mr. Grzegorz Tobiszowski, Hon'ble First Deputy Minister of Energy of Poland addressed on Economic collaboration between Poland and West Bengal.

Mr. Maciej Falkowski, Deputy Joint Secretary, Department of Economic Cooperation, Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Poland addressed on "Poland and India- towards a business partnership." His address covered topics like Poland-India economic cooperation's state of play, Poland-India trade dynamics, Poland's GDP- past and present, the reasons for investment in Poland, Poland-foreign trade, Poland as an attractive investment market, Poland with a stable financial sector, sound banking system in Poland, Poland-India-perspectives for economic partnership and Poland-India-possible cooperation in the environmental protection sector.

Mr. Daniel Ozon, President, JSW presented an overview of JSW Group. He mentioned that JSW was the largest producer of high quality coking coal and the key independent producer of coke in the European Union. JSW's coking coal was used mainly to produce coke, which in turn was an important element in the steel production process. He also highlighted the investment opportunities in Poland.

Mr. Miroslaw Skowron, President, PeBeka shared his perspectives on PeBeka, one of the largest specialist construction companies in Poland. His address included, galleries and Chamber working; shaft works; infrastructure construction engineering; industrial construction engineering; surface drilling work; innovation directions- mechanical excavation of galleries in hard rock conditions, construction of mining central air conditioning system, utilization of drilling holes as alternative way of connecting surface and underground infrastructure; 22 completed international contracts- wide spectrum of operations from the comprehensive execution of Shaft Sinking through the construction of hydro technical, road and railway tunnels, to construction project in domestic areas; PeBeka's potentiality in Shaft, Tunnel and Horizontal Work.

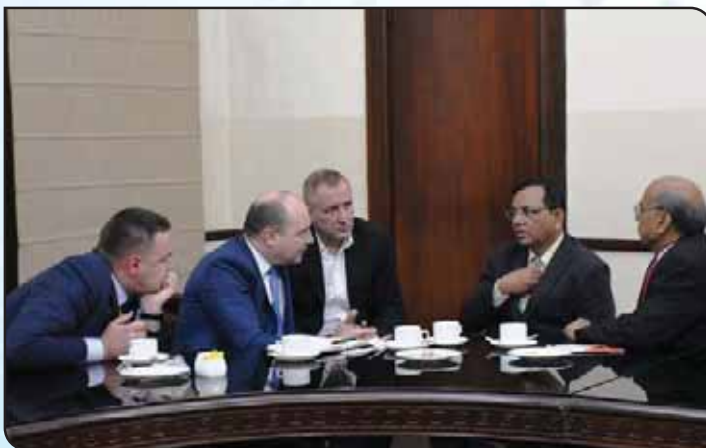

The summary of discussions is as follows: Indo-Australia relationship has three conspicuous areas of importance, which are strategic dimensions, regional connectivity and economic reforms in India. Strengthening of these three areas will lead to a greater strategic partnership and synergy between the two nations. Australia sees enormous opportunity in 10 major sectors, where both the nations can work jointly. Out of which the 4 lead sectors are:

- Education (inter disciplinary and huge opportunity as there is already inflow of students from India including West Bengal and Eastern India to Australia)
- Agriculture (particularly potato cultivation and cold chain facilities)
- Energy
- Tourism (Eco Tourism)

These sectors are followed by niche skill development in services sectors such as

- Health and IT
- Financial services and subsequently
- Infrastructure (Urban development)
- Environment management
- Defense
- Sports (Sports Management, where opportunities may be created here with Australian expertise)

West Bengal plays a key role as far as the aforesaid sectors are concerned. The State has a pivotal role in trans-national connectivity. The ports, riverine and coastal routes of the State play an extremely significant role in the Sub-ASEAN region.

MEETING WITH MR. ROBERT GARVERICK, MINISTER COUNSELOR, ECONOMIC, ENVIRONMENT, SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY AFFAIRS, EMBASSY OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA IN NEW DELHI

24TH JANUARY 2018, CHAMBER PREMISES

INTERACTIVE SESSION WITH UNITED STATES AMBASSADOR TO INDIA, H.E. KENNETH I. JUSTER

7TH FEBRUARY 2018, CHAMBER PREMISES

The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry, in association with the American Chamber of Commerce, Eastern Region chapter, and the U.S. Consulate General, Kolkata organized an Interactive session with the 25th United States Ambassador to India, His Excellency Kenneth I. Juster on 7th February 2018 at 2.30 p.m. in the Chamber premises.

Ambassador Juster was accompanied by Mr. Craig Hall, Consul General of the US Consulate General Kolkata and Mr. Jonathan T. Ward, Principal Commercial Officer, US Commercial Service, US Consulate General Kolkata.

The session was opened by Mr. B. B. Chatterjee, Senior Vice President, The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry by delivering the formal Welcome Address. Mr. Debdas Sen, Chairman, AmCham Eastern Region, moderated the session. Mr. Deb A Mukherjee, Vice President, The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry formally closed the session with Vote of Thanks to The Ambassador. Mr. Gulshan K. Sachdev, Vice Chairman, AmCham National Executive Board was also part of the Session.

The US Ambassador to India, H.E. Juster's speech primarily centered around two areas:

- (1) The US Government's Indo-Pacific Strategy and
- (2) Bilateral economic relationship – which he emphasized is the cornerstone of Indo-US strategic partnership.

He mentioned that The US Indo-Pacific strategy reflected the growing range of shared interests between the two countries and it was a natural complement to India's "Act East" Policy. It was vital that the Indo-Pacific region continued to be free and open. The US-India strategic partnership was designed to strengthen both countries and have a beneficial impact on the region. Promotion of economic connectivity through private sector-led growth, free and fair trade, use of responsible debt-financing practices, and the transparent development of infrastructure. Preserving regional stability and security, preventing proliferation of weapons of mass destruction and eliminating the scourge of terrorism were all being aimed at.

The Ambassador believes that a strong foundation for strategic partnership that can have a significant positive impact on the 21st century and beyond had been laid and it is time now to build upon this partnership, make it durable and bring about remarkable economic rise of the region. It is believed that Indo-Pacific was increasingly a place of peace, stability and growing prosperity, rather than one of disorder, conflict, and predatory economic policy. Cooperation in

defense and counter-terrorism has been a key pillar of Indo-US partnership, he said. The US sought to assist India's efforts to build up its indigenous defense capabilities, as well as enhance the inter-operability of the two forces as major defense partners in the Indo-Pacific region.

The US sought to pursue the same strategic policies on its economic relationship that it had applied to its defense relationship. While India was in the midst of an economic surge as it integrates fully in the global economy, the US trade and investment relationship with India also continues to grow. Bilateral trade has gone up from USD 20 billion in 2001 to USD 115 billion in 2016. There was plenty of room to expand these numbers by increasing flow of goods and services in both directions. He said "America First" and "Make in India" are not incompatible. Rather, investing in each other's markets will be mutually beneficial as it will increase economic interactions and volume of trade, lead to collaboration on emerging technologies and create jobs in both countries.

India could now seize the strategic opportunity through trade and investment, to become a major hub for US business in the Indo-Pacific region. Continued reforms and trade liberalization will enable India products to more readily become part of the global supply chain, thereby accelerating job creation.

The US Ambassador enumerated a number of merits that US-India bilateral relations would have in the long run – some of which are as follows:

- America is a leader in entrepreneurship and innovation, and already has extensive linkages with India in the technology sector. Opening India's market further to U.S. trade and investment will spur the collaboration on many emerging technologies that will drive and protect the two economies, including those related to advanced manufacturing and cyber security.
- Greater US trade and investment, combined with a strong environment protecting intellectual property could lead to increased flows of capital and further sharing of intellectual know-how.
- Opening India's market further to the US trade and investment will spur collaboration on many emerging technologies that will drive and protect both economies including those related to advanced manufacturing and cyber security.

- Increased flow of capital and sharing of intellectual know-how through greater US trade and investment combined with strong environment protecting intellectual property.
- Private sector investment in improved infrastructure and overall connectivity to get stimulated through increased openness to US goods and services and expanded presence of US companies in India.
- The US shall try to enhance their efforts to promote connectivity within South Asia and are coordinating with India on financing for regional infrastructure projects to develop one of the least economically integrated regions of the world.
- Increased heft in the overall economic relationship would necessarily provide a broader and deeper, long term U.S. commitment to India and the Indo-Pacific region. This will complement the growing defense and counter-terrorism partnership and thus help in moderating any policy differences that might arise along the way.

healthcare industry and environmental technology is expected to grow many fold and the US is ready to adhere to these sectors. US Technology can also help India address its food security and agricultural concerns. He also mentioned about Travel, Tourism and Education sectors which play critical role in Indo-US trade relationship.

Another important area which the Ambassador touched upon was about the US business presence in Eastern India which he considered as an important part of the overall picture. There were close to 200 American companies operating here in various sectors with companies such as Cognizant and IBM, food processing, chemicals and petrochemicals etc. US companies were also involved in engineering, automotives, life science, banking, insurance, consumer products etc. all of which were examples of enormous potential of mutually beneficial economic relationship.

The Ambassador felt that the defense sector provides ample opportunities for the two countries as India's defense needs are vast and because the US as a global leader in developing advance military technology is committed to enhancing India's security. India's digital economy, digital services and

The Ambassador stated that while both India and the US cherish their independence and sovereignty, the true value of the partnership is that it can better enable each country to positively influence global affairs and achieve their aspirations for the security and prosperity of its people.

Irrigation, and Housing. Ghana is one of the first few countries to ratify the International Solar Alliance. During the session, High Commissioner expressed his interest in extending business relationship with Bengal. He particularly mentioned about Health, Education, ICT. Contextually, he shared that Ghana also attracted Medical Tourists. However, India is working on a much larger scale in Medical Tourism. Ghana would like to collaborate with India in this area. Students from Ghana study at the top ranking global institutes. They travel at different places in Europe and US to study. India may also attract students from Ghana offering attractive scholarships for deserving ones. He acknowledged the recognition of Indian technocrats.

High Commissioner emphasized on the importance of more interactions between the two countries. He advised that his High Commission would connect the Chamber with the Chambers of Commerce in Ghana. It is important to create awareness about the opportunities offered by both the countries. He highlighted that Ghana is one of the safest countries. Indian investors and businessmen are well regarded there. He mentioned that Ghana would also look forward to compassion for its citizens during business in India.

INTERACTIVE BUSINESS SESSION WITH H. E. MR. SIDHARTO REZA SURYODIPURO, AMBASSADOR, EMBASSY OF THE REPUBLIC OF INDONESIA, NEW DELHI

The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry organized an Interactive Business Session with H.E. Mr. Sidharto Reza Suryodipuro, Ambassador, Embassy of the Republic of Indonesia, New Delhi on 11th June 2018 in the Chamber Premises.

The Ambassador was accompanied by Mr. Ferry Samuel Jacob, Trade Attache, Embassy of the Republic of Indonesia, New Delhi and Mr. Noviandri Wibowo, Third Secretary, Embassy of the Republic of Indonesia, New Delhi. Mr. Mahesh Saharia, Hony. Consul, Consulate of the Republic of Indonesia, Kolkata was also present.

Mr. Deb A Mukherjee, Vice President, The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry welcomed the Ambassador. Mr. Subhodip Ghosh, Director General, The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry was present from the Chamber.

Mr. Mahesh Saharia shared his insights on Geographical features and the Economy of Indonesia. He mentioned that Indonesia is a very unique country. It is an archipelago of 17000 islands out of which almost 6000 are inhabited. The logistics involved with the management of such a nation is massive. Indonesia extends for almost 5710 km from the Andaman and Nicobar Island up to Borneo. India has shared social, economic, religious connections with Indonesia for a very long time. Indonesia's Trade Balance with India has jumped from US\$ 2.3 billion to almost US\$ 20.3 billion. There has been an increase in the level of Intra Investment-from Indonesia to India and vice-versa. Mr. Saharia also mentioned that the tourism Industry has been considerably growing. Tourism from India to Indonesia has increased by 28% and is estimated to increase by 40% by next year. There exist vast differences between Indonesia and India in terms of geographical features, extent of population and the size of the economy. Hence, the true potential of the existing relation between these two countries are yet to be reached. With the visit of the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India to Indonesia, a number of agreements have been signed in regard to economic, education, defense, health and various other subjects. India and Indonesia has also jointly signed an agreement to construct a port that is to be used mutually. This agreement has tremendous strategic Comprehensive Partnership.

H. E. Mr. Sidharto Reza Suryodipuro, Ambassador, Embassy of the Republic of Indonesia, New Delhi shared his objectives of visiting Kolkata. He mentioned that the recent visit by the Hon'ble Prime Minister to Jakarta marked the pinnacle of collaboration between the countries. Both the countries share similar election patterns and both these countries are to enter their respective election phases in 2019. He

emphasized that the meeting between Prime Minister Modi and President Joko Widodo has been considered to be the best bureaucratic meeting between the two countries, ascertained by the body language of both the leaders and the sheer number of agreements that have been signed with regard to trade and various other subjects. In the meeting with the Indian Prime Minister, the Indonesian President envisioned the goal of reaching a trade balance of US\$ 50 Billion within the time span of next 10 Years. Trade relations with Indonesia have been driven largely due to its surplus endowment of Natural resources. About US\$ 10 billion in Trade Surplus in the previous year could be attributed to Indonesia's abundance in Coal and Palm Oil. The meeting accentuated the importance of connectivity and Infrastructure between the two countries. In terms of connectivity, more emphasis is being given to air connectivity. The number of flights from India to Indonesia and vice-versa needs to be increased. In diversifying trade on the Indonesian side, a number of products have been given access to India-red meat, pharmaceuticals, dairy, rice, sugar etc. The meeting of the two leaders also laid emphasis on the development of e-commerce. Cooperation between the two countries should be increased in the field of aeronautics. Discussions were also held with regard to Defense, Security and Maritime-cooperation in the Indo-Pacific. Indonesia is a country of 265 million people. Logistics is a major issue for the country. Focus has to be given on Infrastructure and connectivity. In terms of Gross Domestic Product(GDP), Indonesia is the 16th largest economy in the world. In terms of Purchasing Power Parity(PPP) Indonesia is the 7th largest economy in the world. India is the third largest economy in the world in terms of PPP. In terms of Logistical index, India is ahead of Indonesia. This could be attributed to the demographics of Indonesia.

Ambassador also highlighted few challenges that are to be met - a) More progress has to be achieved in terms of air connectivity b) Maritime connectivity - presently there are no direct shipping connections between India and Indonesia with the exception of coal barges and palm oil tankers. There should be provisions made for smaller ships to make direct connections with Indonesia. Agreements have also been made regarding the joint development of the Port of Sabang. Efforts need to be made in strengthening the bilateral relations between India and Indonesia. Cruise Shipping has been identified as an area of active discussion and has a lot of prospect for growth. The proximity of India and Indonesia calls for a closer relationship between the two countries. Emphasis should be laid on diversifying and improving the existing relationships between the two countries in terms of Business to Business, Government to Government, and People to People Connectivity.

JAPAN COUNTRY SESSION AT BENGAL GLOBAL BUSINESS SUMMIT (BGBS) 2019

7TH FEBRUARY 2019, BISWA BANGLA CONVENTION CENTRE, KOLKATA

The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry in association with JETRO and Japanese Consulate in Kolkata organised the Japan Country Session at the Bengal Global Business Summit (BGBS) 2019 on 7th February at the Biswa Bangla Convention Centre, Kolkata. The programme, split into three sessions, saw **Shri Debashis Sen**, IAS, Additional Chief Secretary, Information Technology & Electronics, Government of West Bengal & Chairman and Managing Director, Housing Infrastructure Development Corporation Limited, Government of West Bengal and Chairman, Nabadiganta Industrial Township Authority, deliver the opening remarks. He expressed how keen Bengal government is to build bridges with Japan and welcomed their involvement in building a robust platform for artificial intelligence and its applications, clean air and pollution free initiatives and transportation in general.

The opening session also witnessed **His Excellency Kenji Hiramatsu**, Ambassador of Japan to India deliver his Welcome Remarks. He mentioned that the number of Japanese companies in India is increasing. The number has now reached 1441. He spoke about India's promotion of the Act East Policy and Japan's renewed interest in West Bengal. Following this, the President of Kawasaki Rikuso Transportation, **Mr. Keiichi Higuchi** during his speech presented the inauguration of the KRT plant at Singur on January 1, 2019. The plant is a self-generating and charging temperature controlled warehouse. Many such small warehouses with operating space of a decent 2000 sq ft are in the plans which will be affordable and will not be far from farms. These warehouses implement Nizuri, the Japanese technique of warehousing and use Shikkui plaster to keep walls durable and humidity under control. Mr. Higuchi termed them as medium technology settlements which are easier to setup, operate and maintain. He ascertained that they will go a long way in increasing farmer's income.

The next session on Japanese Official Activities commenced as **Mr. Arnab Basu**, Chairperson, IT Committee, The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry and Partner, PricewaterhouseCoopers Private Limited, took up the role of moderator. He stressed again on the humungous number of Japanese companies in our country but however grieved that the north eastern region of India has yet to see enough interest from them.

Mr. Katsuo Matsumoto, Chief Representative, JICA India office, after gracing the stage said that JICA, a government agency of Japan that implements Official Development

Assistance (ODA), over the past 40 years, has become one of the closest development partners in West Bengal. The cooperation with Bengal has now expanded to various fields. JICA funded projects have enhanced economic growth, quality of life and business environment of the state. Since the first ODA loan provision in 1983, JICA has made commitment of ODA loan for 28 projects, which amounts to JPY 352 billion (around INR 23,000 crore). The agency has further supported prioritized areas which contribute to the sound development of the state. Currently they support areas such as Energy, Water, Waste Management, Metro, Forestry & Biodiversity and Private Partnership.

Mr. Kanzuya Nakajo, the Chief Director General of JETRO New Delhi, citing examples of success cases of Indo-Japan collaboration such as Calsonic Kansei – Larsen & Toubro and Gray Orange – Ground Inc, explained how the role of Indian companies has changed from just being an outsource partner to being a total collaborator. **Mr. Takeshi Sato**, Representative, NEDO New Delhi Office, took the discussion forward presenting New Energy and Industrial Technology Development Organization or NEDO's activities in India. Japan's largest public sector organization, established in 1980, operates to address energy and global environmental problems. NEDO has already completed 13 projects pan India and are currently working on Micro-Grid System with PV Power Generation, Smart Grid Pilot Project, EMS for Multiple Energy Sources at Steel Plant and ICT Based Green Hospital.

The seminar moved towards the last session on Showcasing Japanese Technology & Products which was moderated by Shri Debasish Sen. **Mr. N Venkatakrisnan**, Senior Vice President & CFO, Tata Hitachi Construction Machinery exhibited the 50 + year joint venture between Tata and Hitachi. Employing more than 1930 people, the organization has its facilities in Dharwad, Jamshedpur and Bangalore apart from the one in Kharagpur, established in 2009, which over the years has grown to become the India's largest State of Art CE Manufacturing Plant. Currently the facility has 20 - 45 T and Wheeled Products. **Mr. Kosuke Nakagawa**, COO, Tera Motors then introduced Tera Motors' electric vehicle business which focuses on South and South East Asian markets. He also said that the company is also venturing into the drone business. The company currently manufactures E-Rickshaws with around 2000 monthly sales. **Mr. Sanjay Mundley**, Senior Vice President – Business Development, Mistubishi Heavy Industries displayed a corporate overview of Mistubishi Hitachi Power Systems India whose product line includes

Gas Turbine Combined Power Plants, Boiler Turbine Generation Plants, Integrated coal Gasification Combined Cycle Power Plants, Geothermal Power Plants, Generators, Boilers and more. They also have complete integration of emission control systems which will help meet the criteria for the new emission norms in India. MHPS also delivers novel emission reduction technology which has been developed to meet the strict emission norms in World Bank, Japan, EU and the US. Having served all throughout the world, the company boasts an incredible order amount of 35.2 billion USD from 2017. Thereafter, **Mr. Masato Yuasa**, President & CEO, Nomura Research Institute Financial Technologies India, graced the stage to deliver on NRI

FinTech's capacity to deliver a range of reliable, scalable and adaptable IT Solutions to capital market entities around the world. NRI FinTech has 300 technical consultants focused on consulting, design, development, delivery and support who ensure a balanced skill set to optimize delivery quality. They work on I-STAR/GV, I-STAR/CS and T-STAR/GV, serving clients such as Broker Dealers, Custodians and Asset Managers.

The three-session program concluded with Mr. Subrata Majumdar's deliverance of the Vote of Thanks. He thanked the West Bengal Government for taking the initiative to host a summit of such a big stature, of which the Japan Session was a part of.

THE CHAMBER'S MANAGING COMMITTEE'S INTERACTIVE SESSION WITH DR. MICHAEL FEINER, HON'BLE CONSUL GENERAL, CONSULATE GENERAL OF THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF GERMANY, KOLKATA

17TH MAY 2019, CHAMBER PREMISES

Mr. Indrajit Sen, President welcomed Dr. Michael Feiner thanking him for accepting the Chamber's invitation for an interactive session with its Managing Committee. He also welcomed Ms. Sabina Pandey, the Regional Director of Indo German Chamber of Commerce. Historically, Germany and German Industry has been very close to India and Indian industry. The Chamber has had a very close tie with the Indo German Chamber of Commerce and is currently working on a project towards a Centre of Excellence which will add great value to the industry, particularly the MSME sector of this region through technology upgradation and skill development and this would enhance the business relationships between the State of West Bengal and this part of the country with Germany.

Dr. Michael Feiner had assumed charge as the Consul General of Germany at Kolkata in August 2017. Dr. Feiner, a doctor by training, had served all over the world, particularly in Asia, Africa and North America. One of his areas of interest and passion has been upholding of human rights. He pursued his medical studies at Wurzburg, Tubingen, Germany and Liverpool, UK. His MD thesis was on child and adolescent psychiatry from the Kennedy School. He is a Master in Public Administration from Harvard University.

Dr. Feiner presented an overview of the German economy. The country's GDP rate grew 1.5 percent in 2018, compared with 2.2 percent in 2017. However, employment figures in Germany currently stood at an all-time high. Export was improving and it was amongst the leading exporting nations in the world. Germany has very strong industrial and manufacturing belts grown over many generations. The country can boast of a highly skilled workforce and it has a tradition in developing skilled workers which had continued over centuries. Germany also has excellent professionals hailing from very respected educational and research institutes and universities. Germany is positioned in the centre and embedded in the globe's largest market of importance in the European Union. When it comes to research and development, Germany has been a pioneer for centuries. The country has a unique network of small and medium sized enterprises employing the majority of the country's workforce and also provided the highest support to the country's GDP. Amongst the SMEs, the so-called 'hidden champions' are found who are world market leaders in their respective niches, producing high quality cutting edge

products. According to recent statistics, Germany has over 1300 of such Companies compared to 320 in the US, 220 in Japan and a small number in China. These small family owned enterprises are a big strength of Germany. One would find many of these Companies present here in India.

A high proportion of contribution towards GDP in Germany comes from industrial production (23%), which was substantially higher than the US, UK or France. Service sector does not contribute much as yet to the country's GDP. The country has remained hugely invested in the old industries, automobiles, machineries and chemicals and still lagged in creative IT and innovative services. He felt that the country's investment structure helped in weathering the economic crisis in 2008 and 2009. However, their Government decision makers and corporates all agree that the country will also have to change and influence the structure of the economy in order to remain tuned to the global environment.

Dr. Feiner also spoke about the demographic challenges that Germany faces. Post the economic and demographic boom in the 50s and 60s, from 70s onwards Germany saw a gradual shrinkage in population growth which did affect its production levels. This posed a challenge to the industry and the economy and enterprises suffered owing to lack of qualified and skilled labours and engineers. Government has passed legislations for precipitating immigration of qualified labour from outside of EU which hopefully should ease the situation. Germany in contrast to the US, Australia and Canada has never been a classical immigration destination. 23.6% of people residing in Germany are from emigrational background, which means either the person himself or one of their parents were born outside Germany. In terms of foreign born residents the figure is 40.5%. For Germany the future lies in utilization of potentials and benefits that migration offers.

Dr. Feiner took a look at the changing world scenario in terms of sizes of world economies in the next 10 years as per published reports. The 10 largest economies would be China, India, USA, Indonesia, Turkey, Brazil, Egypt, Russia, Japan and Germany (in descending order), which meant that in 11 years, Germany may climb down to no.10. India will reclaim its historical place. However, in a globalised world there are no constants but a robust peaceful economic order will have to be in place. Countries like Germany would have to make adjustments to go through adaptations.

The Consul General felt that the Indo-German trade had developed well over the past years. Last year it crossed the 20 trillion Euro mark. Looking at the product range, Germany exports machinery, capital goods, electrical components etc., and India exports, textiles, garments and yarns, chemicals products, food items, leather shoes and cigarettes. He pointed out that while India is the fourth largest trading partner for Germany, India happens to be on the 28th position as far as exports from Germany was concerned and at the 24th position as far as imports from India (0.8% of Germany's total imports), leaving a lot of space to be explored. There are about 1700 German Companies operating in India, about 1600 Indo-German Federations and over 600 Indo-German joint ventures.

Dr. Feiner mentioned that of all the German economic presence in India, only about 3% was in West Bengal. He said that as far as investment of large German companies was concerned, West Bengal had some difficulties attracting large companies. Smaller companies could of course be accommodated in the State. For the State it would be a challenge to compete with other States in India which already had sizeable German presence as Companies would like to go to places where there is already a cluster along with the infrastructure. In West Bengal there are a number of German Companies who feel they are happy being here with dedicated and committed workforce and once they start functioning they feel comfortable.

Sector-wise, apart from manufacturing, the IT sector could also benefit from German companies using IT services here. Opportunities exist in areas of higher value research and development. When it comes to West Bengal's exports or collaboration with German companies, Dr. Feiner mentioned, the IGCC was here and businesses in this part of the country could also look at the 1700 Germany companies present mostly outside of the State.

Dr. Feiner felt that the Chamber's planned trip to Germany was an excellent option to explore possibilities of co-operation. He suggested the area of Healthcare where he had not seen much co-operation looked promising. The Chamber could look into the prospects of medical technologies as about 1500 companies existed in this sphere. Trade fair was one other entry point towards effective co-operations and Germany is famous for its trade fairs in different sectors. Lastly, Dr. Feiner also felt that the visiting delegation could closely look at the Indian Companies operating at Germany. The number of such companies had been increasing over the years.

Dr. Michael Feiner's talk was followed by an intense round of invigorating question answer session which covered range of interests from members like:

- Water level depletion as a result of global warming, eventually affecting riverine ports' navigation. If this was an issue in Germany.
- Interest of German Companies in taking part in the BCC&I's annual Mega Trade Fair.
- With increasing trade disputes, would Germany consider India as manufacturing hub?
- The Consul General's views on increasing investments in Bengal from German Companies.
- Brining back Lufthansa services from Kolkata.
- Income disparities and poverty issues in Germany.
- Health Tech Hub in Germany and current collaborations with Indian Companies.
- Robust education system of Germany not attracting as many students from India as the US Universities are.

The Meeting concluded with a formal Vote of Thanks on behalf of the Chamber presented by Mr. Deb A Mukherjee, Senior Vice President.

The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry organized a Special Session with Mr. K V Kumar, Founding Chairman, Indian American International Chamber of Commerce (IAICC), Washington, DC, on 20th May 2019 in The Bengal Chamber Premises. The session was followed by Networking Cocktails and Dinner.

Mr. KV Kumar had been visiting India as part of Trade Winds Business Delegation, the largest annual U.S. Government-led trade mission and the idea behind organizing this Special Session was to brainstorm with Mr. Kumar on how The Bengal Chamber and IAICC can collaborate in facilitating B2B Connects, not only between the U.S. businesses and their Indian counterparts from the East and the North East, but also, how IAICC with the help of The Bengal Chamber can jointly connect with the larger East and South East Asian markets.

Prior to the Special Session, organized in the Chamber, Mr. K V Kumar had an exclusive meeting with Shri Alapan Bandyopadhyay, IAS, Additional Chief Secretary, Department of Home & Hill Affairs, Government of West Bengal and Industry, Commerce and Enterprises Department, Government of West Bengal and Smt. Vandana Yadav, IAS, Managing Director, West Bengal Industrial Development Corporation Limited and Secretary, Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises & Textiles, Government of West Bengal on the 20th May morning at West Bengal Industrial Infrastructure Development Corporation. The meeting featured discussion on possible areas of collaboration between the Indian American International Chamber of Commerce (IAICC) and The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry and how IAICC could provide a relevant platform to the Government of West Bengal for showcasing the State's value as an investment destination and particularly as a logistics hub for the entire South-East Asian market.

The Interactive Session was graced by **Ms. Patricia Hoffman**, U.S Consul General in Kolkata; **Mr. B B Chatterjee**, President Designate, The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry; **Mr. Deb A Mukherjee**, Senior Vice President, The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry; **Mr. Ambarish Dasgupta**, Former President, The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry; **Mr. Subhodip Ghosh**, Director General, The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry along with other senior members and stakeholders of the Chamber.

During the Session, The Bengal Chamber signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with IAICC to provide business advisory services to medium and small enterprises of India and USA and to collaborate in facilitating B2B connects between American Businesses and its Indian counterparts from East and North-East Region.

Mr. KV Kumar mentioned that IAICC is very keen to open offices in Singapore, Kuala Lumpur, Manila, Dubai, Hong Kong and 30 chapters in United States itself. IAICC could set up a representative office in India in The Bengal Chamber premises and institute a Joint Council to address co-branded issues for stakeholders. Mr. Kumar also mentioned that West Bengal, being strategically placed, is ideal to act as a gateway to accessing markets in the ASEAN countries. At present, IAICC is working in four States in India where each State has made a Chamber of Commerce- a platform to create business links. IAICC works with entrepreneurs, professionals, businesses and Governments to develop entrepreneurship and commerce through training, seminars and networking opportunities.

Mr. Kumar also mentioned about IAICC Business Summit, in collaboration with NAVIKA 5th World Kannada Summit, which will be held from 30th August, 2019 to 1st September, 2019 at Duke Energy Convention Center, Cincinnati, Ohio. He said that Senior Officials of Government of West Bengal and The Bengal Chamber would be invited to participate in the Business Summit at Ohio. Especially, **Dr. Amit Mitra**, Hon'ble Minister-in-Charge, Departments of Information Technology and Electronics, Finance, MSME and Textiles and Industry, Commerce & Enterprises, Government of West Bengal would be invited as the Chief Guest. The meeting is expected to be attended by Consul Generals of India in some of the major cities of US, business leaders and Government officials.

THE CHAMBER'S MANAGING COMMITTEE'S INTERACTIVE SESSION WITH MR. ANDREW FORD, HON'BLE CONSUL GENERAL, CONSULATE GENERAL OF AUSTRALIA IN KOLKATA

24TH JULY 2019, CHAMBER PREMISES

The Bengal Chamber organized an Interactive Session with Mr Andrew Ford, Hon'ble Consul General, Consulate General of Australia in Kolkata during its Managing Committee meeting on 24th July 2019.

Mr. Andrew Ford, Hon'ble Consul General, Consulate General of Australia in Kolkata, is a career officer with the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade. He was previously Head of Mission, Australian High Commission, Tonga, a South Pacific island. He had previously served in Kuala Lumpur and Seoul in Canberra. A Bachelor of Economics (Honours) from Monash University, Mr. Ford held a range of positions, including the position of Director of the Free Trade Agreement Policy and New Issues Section. The Australian Consulate-General in Kolkata is Australia's fourth diplomatic post in India, the other three being New Delhi, Mumbai and Chennai. The Consulate-General had recently re-opened its office in Kolkata and this meeting was the Consul General's first business meeting in the State of West Bengal.

Mr. Ford thanked members for their warm welcome before his lucid presentation on 'Perspectives on Trade and Investments' between India and Australia'. He went on to explain the India Economic Strategy 2035 which is an independent report to the Government which looks at how Australia could build deep economic partnership with India over the next two decades. This strategy was written by Mr. Peter N Varghese, who was Australian High Commissioner to India from 2010 to 2014. He was also the Secretary of Foreign Affairs and Trade. He brings a very deep understanding of both Australia and India. The Strategy is an independent assessment about the current and future economic policy towards India and involved wide consultations between the two countries. The report was publicly released in July 2018. It is virtually a blue print now for conducting business between the two countries. The Australian Government also released a formal response strategy in November last year when the President of India had visited Australia which was the first visit to Australia by an Indian President.

Mr. Andrew Ford went on to explain why Australia needed an India Economic Strategy. Australia had also done another important paper in 2017 which was a Foreign Policy White Paper which placed India at the top tier amongst their international partners. With this Australia's economic policy was at par with the strategic relationship. It was felt that

there was a need to deepen the two-dimensional economic relationship between the two countries, mostly on free trade and negotiations. This strategy has been written mostly from the Australian point of view and it was equally important to build a India-literacy in Australia.

Mr. Ford went on to say that today India is Australia's sixth largest trading partner. The two-way trade has grown by over 15% a year over the past 5 years. However, there was a need to grow and make significant change to reach the desired level. Australia's trade with India represents about 3.6% of its global trade, the large trading partners being China (25.2%), Japan (10.1%) and United States (8.7%), followed by Korea and Singapore who all come under the top 10 trading nations of Australia. Australia's exports to India constitutes coal (11% of the country's total exports to India), education related travel, copper and gold. What India was exporting to Australia was primarily refined petroleum, railway vehicles, pearls and gems. He felt that there was a growing need to build the India-Australia relationship as economic relations underpinned a country's international relationship. Countries who have invested in each other do have a keen interest in each other prosperity, security and stability.

There is a need to build 'India Literacy' in Australia. The Report, he spoke about, was designed for an Australian audience. The understanding between the two countries are still not as it should be. Beyond education and resources, India current does not actually look at Australia as a preferred partner. Australia wants to try and change this. The India Economic Strategy aims at promoting long-terms relations between the two countries in the highest levels of the Australian Government and the Prime Ministers of the two countries are fully committed to this. The key conclusion of this Strategy is that over the next twenty years or so when India is poised to become the third largest economy of the world, more opportunities are likely to open up for Australia. The report covers challenges faced and provides practical road maps to Australians doing business in India. The strategy sets a number of ambitious goals which pertain to lifting India into the top three export markets, making India the third largest destination for outward investment, and bringing India into Australia's inner circle of relationships. The core of the Strategy revolves around a 'Sectors and States' framework. Ten priority sectors and 10 priority States, including West Bengal have been identified to remain

focused. The 10 priority sectors include Education, Agri-business, Resources, Tourism, Energy, Health, Financial services, Science and innovation, Infrastructure and Sport. The 10 States have been chosen because of a combination of economic depth, commitment to reforms, competitive advantage for Australia, ease of doing business etc.

Mr. Ford felt that The Chamber would be interested to know why West Bengal has been chosen as a preferred State. West Bengal was a centre of India's mining and resources sector and it is a regional hub for Australia's engagement on mining and materials. It is also a gateway to the mining resource of Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh and Orissa. Australia sees several opportunities here in energy, agriculture, education and health-care sectors. For this reason, Kolkata has been chosen as a Centre of presence of an Australian mission. The State is also a gateway to the North East. Strengths that the State and the region has in mining and minerals could open up opportunities towards India's desire to be self-sufficient in this area. Australia would have a lot to offer, particularly as a supplier of mining equipment, technology and services. The Strategy looked at thinking differently towards India over the other economic partners of Australia like North East Asia, Japan, China, Korea etc. Australia will bring in not just Australian products but expertise and knowledge as well.

The Consul General stated that Australia believed in building relationships through people to people links. They believed this could come through a very large number of Indian people who live in Australia. Education and Tourism are the two priority sectors in this Report in finally connecting people in this relationship through better understanding. Looking at migration into Australia by citizenship in 2016-2017, India was at the top. Indian migration to Australia has increased dramatically over the last decade. At almost 700,000 strong (or nearly 3% of Australian population), the Indian diaspora already makes a significant contribution to its economy and society. This diaspora can build relationships where governments cannot. It creates personal links, and sustains effort and engagement over time. The diaspora, with their

deep understanding of both countries, could help overcome difficulties. The reports indicates that the most ambitious goal of the Strategy is to have Australian investment in India rise to over \$A 100 billion from the current level of \$A 15 billion.

Finally, the Consul General said that while considering why India should really be doing business with Australia which apparently is a small market, having just reached 25 million, it should be borne in mind that population and size were obviously not the only measure of the potential of an economic relationship. Australia is a high-value market and had also been through several reforms on competition policies, privatisations etc.

The Australian Government was committed to support, in principle, recommendations of the Report. One of the recommendations of the Report was to set up a Consul General's Office in Kolkata. The focus will be around the ten sectors and 10 Indian states identified in the report. Ministerial champions would be appointed for the Strategy's major sectors. The Australian Government is very committed to make this work. The Indian Government has also responded very strongly and positively on this Report and has commissioned a similar report. CII has now been commissioned to do a similar report for the Indian Government which will be Australian Economic Strategy for India. He further stated that the idea of having a team on the ground at Kolkata from Australia was to build the right networks, build links with the Government of West Bengal as well as businesses here and to promote delegations both ways. This was a start of a long term project.

Mr. Andrew Ford's presentation was followed by a very invigorating round of questions and answers session. Mr. B B Chatterjee, President Designate, proposed a vote of thanks for a very comprehensive presentation on how India Australia relationship can be further strengthened through a clear road map for increasing India-Australia trade and areas of bilateral co-operation.

INTERACTIVE SESSION WITH MR. RAHUL TABHANE, COUNTRY HEAD -INDIA, UK EXPORT FINANCE, BRITISH DEPUTY HIGH COMMISSION, MUMBAI

25TH JULY 2019, CHAMBER PREMISES

The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry organized a Special Session with **Mr. Rahul Tabhane**, Country Head-India, UK Export Finance, British Deputy High Commission, Mumbai on 25th July 2019 at The Bengal Chamber premises.

The objective of this forum was to discuss financing support available from UK Export Finance (UKEF) for Indian companies importing from the United Kingdom and for export oriented UK subsidiaries of Indian Companies

Mr. Deb A Mukherjee, Senior Vice President, The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry welcomed **Mr. Rahul Tabhane**. **Mr. Robert Chatterton Dickson**, British High Commissioner to Bangladesh also graced the session along with **Mr. Rishikesh Chanda**, Senior Trade & Investment Adviser, UK Trade & Investment, British Deputy High Commission, Kolkata and other senior dignitaries of The Bengal Chamber.

Mr. Rahul Tabhane, during the session, mentioned that UKEF is a UK Government Department and is the operating name of the Export Credits Guarantee Department (ECGD). UKEF's primary function is to support exports from the UK and it operates within the conditions set out under the OECD Arrangement on Officially Supported Export Credits. UKEF extends its support in two broad categories: a) Products and

services that finance the overseas buyer. b) Products and services that support the UK exporter.

Mr. Tabhane emphasized that the UKEF guarantee is equivalent to the UK government guarantee which has an outstanding global credit profile. The guarantee acts as a credit enhancement instrument for Indian companies thereby substantially reducing the financing cost and helps them attract long tenor loans from banks and financial institutions. The main criteria to avail the UKEF guarantee is a minimum 20% UK origin content from UK which can be fulfilled via import of goods, services, technology or intellectual property.

He also mentioned about the financing support for UK exporters through various products such as working capital scheme, Bond support scheme, Export Insurance Policy, Bond Insurance Policy, etc and all export oriented UK entities including the UK subsidiaries of Indian companies are eligible for the same.

Mr. Tabhane took the session through few successful case studies like the Oil and Gas case study where UK Export Finance issued a guarantee in respect of a US\$1 billion line of credit to Petrobras, to support the financing of contracts involving UK suppliers which related to Petrobras's programme to expand various exploration and production

facilities and with Reliance Industries Ltd. of India, a US\$300m line of credit facility was set up to enable it to finance the purchase of goods and services from the UK for the expansion of its Petrochemicals facilities and setting up the new Petcoke Gasification and Refinery Off-Gas Cracker.

He concluded his presentation with the aspiration to work with Indian Banks while providing UKEF guarantee in Indian Rupees to finance the import purchase of Indian companies thereby saving nearly 4% per annum hedging cost which gets incurred while attracting foreign currency borrowings.

The Ambassador graced the Session along with **Mr. Masayuki Taga**, Consul General of Japan to India. **Mr. Indrajit Sen**, President, The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry; **Mr. Deb A Mukherjee**, Senior Vice President, The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry and **Mr. Subhodip Ghosh**, Director General, The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry were also present in the programme.

Mr. Masayuki Taga expressed his sincere thanks to The Bengal Chamber to invite the Ambassador in the Chamber. **Mr. Taga** mentioned that the Chamber extended its kind support to organize the Japan Session in The Bengal Global Business Summit, held in the month of February 2019. He also mentioned this was the first formal visit of the Ambassador to the Chamber. **Mr. Taga**, during his speech, stated that 19 Japanese companies and 209 Japanese establishments are here in West Bengal. Japan was keen on seeing the increase in people to people connect in this region and invited people from this region to visit Japan.

The Ambassador H. E. Kenji Hiramatsu, during his address, mentioned that Japan was keen to see increasing people-to- people connect with the Eastern Region of India and invited investors from West Bengal to Japan. He also stated that the Japanese companies operating in India were being given incentives from the Northern states and such incentives from West Bengal could encourage more companies here.

The Ambassador said that a new momentum has been added to economic partnership between Japan and India while shared security and defence cooperation is rapidly catching up with the already robust economic partnership.

The Ambassador mentioned that Skill, Waste Management and SME Sector are the possible fields for joint collaboration between the two countries for investment in West Bengal. Japan is looking for more platforms to establish business to business connects in West Bengal. He also stated that Japan is already working in Infrastructure project jointly with India in Bangladesh and has been very keen to continue the same since West Bengal is the gateway to other Eastern States and South East Asia. Japan is also looking to support the opening

of more Japanese language centres in India to the tune of 1000 in next five years in India where trained teachers would be provided from Japan that would increase Indian employment in Japanese companies.

The Ambassador said that with Japanese firm Kawasaki Rikuso Transportation Company's investment in setting up temperature controlled solar powered warehouses for Agri storage in West Bengal, there has been an increasing interest from both sides for business exchanges and alliances in the eastern part of India. The other major Japanese companies operating in West Bengal include Tata Hitachi Construction Machinery, Nippai Shalimar Feeds, Nomura Research Institute Financial Technologies.

ZOOHACKATHON 2019 - A TECH CHALLENGE TO FIND TECHNOLOGY DRIVEN SOLUTIONS FOR FIGHTING WILDLIFE

9TH & 10TH NOVEMBER 2019, CHAMBER PREMISES

On Saturday & Sunday, 9th & 10th November, 2019, Zoonhackathon 2019 - A tech challenge to find technology driven solutions for fighting wildlife crime – in Kolkata, organized by U.S. Consulate General Kolkata, TRAFFIC and WWF-India, and The Bengal Chamber of Commerce & Industry at The Bengal Chamber premises.

Sixteen teams, each having two to six members, comprising students of higher educational institutes and working professionals, demonstrated tech-based solutions to stop wildlife trafficking got five minutes to present their project before the jury panel. New Delhi was the first Indian city to host such an event in November 2017, while it is being held for the first time in the eastern metropolis. The Zoonhackathon, which had started in 2016, is a global tech challenge to find technology-driven solutions to combat wildlife trafficking and this event was part of that initiative.

The participating teams developed solutions to help detect traffickers and educate the public through mobile apps and other software. At the end of the Zoonhackathon, teams presented their solutions to the panel of jury. The Zoonhackathon, being held all over the world, aims to bring together students of higher educational institutes and wildlife enthusiasts. Each team is given 48 hours each to develop technology-based solutions to address wildlife trafficking challenges. The event is being organized in 16 cities, including Kolkata and New Delhi, across 14 different countries this year.

The team “Pineapples” which comprised a group of students from St. Thomas College of Engineering and Technology, Kolkata was named as the Champions of Zoonhackathon 2019 of Kolkata edition. “Data Sutram”, an AI-driven startup was named as the Runners-up

INTERACTIVE SESSION WITH MR NICK LOW, BRITISH DEPUTY HIGH COMMISSIONER, KOLKATA

11TH NOVEMBER 2019, 2019, CHAMBER PREMISES

The Chamber was privileged to have Mr. Nick Low, British Deputy High Commissioner, Kolkata, addressing the Managing Committee members at its Meeting on 11th November 2019. The Interactive Session commenced with the President welcoming Mr. Law to the Chamber. This was followed by an introduction of Mr. Nick Low and an audio visual presentation covering the history, heritage and activities of The Chamber.

Mr. Nick Low, the new British Deputy High Commissioner to Kolkata, joined office on 16th October 2019 and represents the UK in the 13 Indian States in the Eastern Region, North East India and the Union Territories of Andaman and Nicobar Islands.

Mr. Low has been a Counsellor at the British Embassy responsible for the United Kingdom's relations with China's Second and Third Tier Cities (2015 to 2019). He was previously the Deputy Head of the Foreign and Commonwealth Office's Crisis Management Department. From 2010 to 2014, Mr. Low was the UK's Deputy High Commissioner in Bangladesh. From 2007 to 2010 he led the FCO team developing policy to reinforce the nuclear non-proliferation regime, in particular the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons, multilateral approaches to the nuclear fuel cycle and the International Atomic Energy Agency. He has worked in South America (Santiago de Chile and Brasília) and the Maghreb (Rabat and Algiers) covering a wide range of political, aid, economic, commercial and counter-terrorist work. He was educated at Christ's College Cambridge and Bedford College London.

At the outset, Mr. Nick Low, thanked The Chamber members for inviting him for interacting with the Managing Committee Members. He mentioned that he was hopeful of being in this City for about 3 to 4 years during which time he hoped to interact with members of The Chamber more intensively.

Mr. Suborno Bose, Chairperson of The Chamber's Education Committee requested Mr. Low to speak about the introduction of the Post-Study work visa in the UK. Mr. Low felt that this was a welcome move by UK's friends and partners across the world. The current 2-year post study visa to students will open the door to their career paths. However, he felt that this will go a long way in helping aspirants coming over to the UK which has some of the best universities of the world.

Mr. Alope Mookherjea, Former President, sought the British Deputy High Commissioner's opinion on the aspects on which India should be careful about in its dealings and bilateral relations between India and the UK in view of the impending Brexit. Further, even post-Brexit it was important to understand how the bilateral relationships between India and the UK could be taken forward.

Mr. Low mentioned that what UK was concentrating presently on the global challenges the country may have from progress of the human race - challenges from climate change, microbiological resistance, rebalancing the global economy 10 years after the financial crisis, issues concerning eradication of poverty etc. He felt that none of these bigger challenges can be solved by any country on its own. UK's policy was to have the top ten large economies working together and India should be right in the middle of the ten. Speaking about Brexit, Mr. Low strongly felt that it would never mean United Kingdom turning its back to the world. Not one country in the EU derives a larger proportion of its GDP from foreign trade than what the UK does. UK has no other option but to trade. He felt that as far as relationship with India with Brexit was concerned, he could see bilateral relationship being on the upside. Many Indian Companies were looking to make Investments in the UK. Bilateral trade between the two countries was booming.

Mr. Low spoke about the 'single market' concept. Single market was a single market in manufactured goods. It is not a single market in 'services'. And this had done a great damage to the British economy which now has a structural trade deficit with the European Union. Today the country's trade deficit with the EU alone is 4% of GDP, which in the long-term is not sustainable.

Dr. Rabin Chakraborty, Chairperson, Health Committee, who had spent a considerable period of time in the United Kingdom working as a Consultant there and had returned to India, shared his experience in the healthcare sector in the UK and his experience in working in the same sector in India and sought Mr. Low's views on the subject. He also wanted to set up an exchange programme between UK and India for Trainee Doctors.

Mr. Low thanked Dr Chakraborty and the entire community of doctors from India for their immense contribution to the National Health Service in the UK. There were 19000 doctors and healthcare professionals of Indian origin or actually from India in the UK. He said that UK takes growth and

improvements in the health services very seriously. The country needs to bring in more medical professionals from overseas.

Mr. Subrata Dutta, Chairperson, Sports and Skill Development Committee, requested Mr. Low to speak about the ease of doing business in the UK by Indian entities and how could a Chamber of Commerce facilitate the same.

Having said that the UK was always very high on the ease of doing business index, being among the top 10 countries on this parameter, Mr. Low stated that if anyone wanted to set up a business or go for acquisitions or expansion of business in the UK, they have an end to end service for the same. UK welcomes foreign investments and the country continues to attract foreign investments far more than any other country in the EU.

Dr. Abhijit Sen, Former President of the Chamber, talking about the close ties between the two countries, especially with regard to trade and investment, said that these ties are specially close with The Bengal Chamber of Commerce. He drew Mr. Low's attention to the portraits of several Past Presidents of The Bengal Chamber displayed on the walls of the Hall. He also stated that the very room at which the meeting was being held viz. Williamson Magor Hall, was named after two Past Presidents, Mr. George Williamson and Mr. Richard Magor.

Mr. Low was very happy to acknowledge what Dr Sen had said. He fully agreed that the strong ties between the two countries was visible everywhere be it in sports, cuisine, in popular and classical culture, in medicine, in business, in commerce, in academia, in science and technology of which we are all very proud of. He wanted to build on this and see more UK business coming to India.

Mr. Deb A Mukherjee, President, brought the session to a close by heartily complimenting Mr. Nick Low on his very incisive in-depth analysis of the current realities. On behalf of The Chamber, Mr. Mukherjee expressed his gratitude to Mr. Low for having chosen The Bengal Chamber as the first Chamber that he had visited.

Mr. Dasgupta said that India and Mexico have striking similarities in geo-climatic conditions, biodiversity, physiognomy and people, cultural and family values, as well as European connections of the colonial era. Bengal has three main components, namely the Energy sector, MSME and deep Sea Ports that serve to link ASEAN countries. He also mentioned that most of the goods like gems and jewellery and aluminium that India exports to Mexico, are manufactured in Bengal. The vision of Bengal is to be a strong logistic hub. So there is a good potential of these sectors with regards to Mexico.

Mr. Sumit Mazumder highlighted the potential sectors for bilateral trade between India and Mexico including Auto parts; Software and IT; Pharmaceuticals, Chemicals, Engineering goods and Minerals. He stated that Trade with India has grown immensely in last few years.

His Excellency Federico Salas Lotfe mentioned that Mexico is looking to expand its economic, Political and cultural footprint in India. Apart from businesses and cultural contacts, Mexico is trying to expand People to people connect and

tourism. His Excellency emphasized that India is one of the countries that are being involved in refinery infrastructure project. In the areas of Startups and IT, Mexico is trying to bring added value with India through collaboration and look to move with greater dynamism in Innovations, Artificial Intelligence and IT. He also asserted that development of Spanish Language and its growing interest in India is a very encouraging sign. Water Technology in Mexico and so share of this knowledge with India is another common area of Interest. His Excellency mentioned that Mexico also shares clean air experience with India since it's a major area of concern in most Indian cities. Cybercrime and data theft are other areas where Mexico looks to India to share technology since both Governments share challenge of digital governance as a drive of combat corruption.

His Excellency also mentioned that The signing of the US-Mexico- Canada Agreement (USMCA) has lent "certainty" on foreign direct investment by international companies in the Latin American economy, including some 200-odd enterprises from India.

The forum included a very vibrant interactive session with the Chamber invitees.

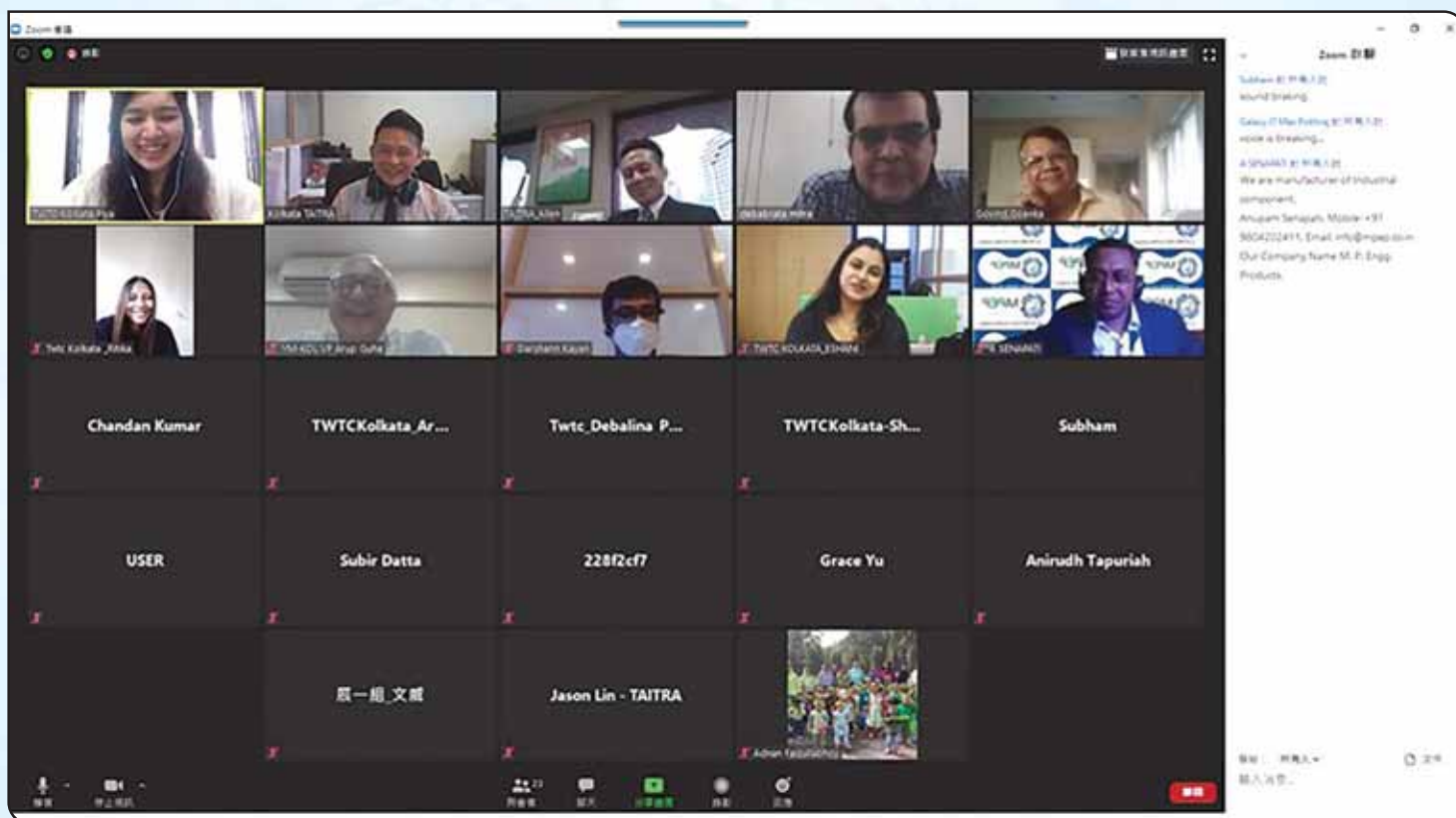

INTERACTIVE SESSION WITH HIS EXCELLENCY FREDDY SVANE, AMBASSADOR OF DENMARK TO INDIA ON “SUSTAINABLE URBAN REGENERATION MODEL PLAN FOR THE CITY OF KOLKATA AND THE STATE OF WEST BENGAL” DURING BCC&I MANAGING COMMITTEE MEETING

20TH JANUARY 2021, PHYGITAL

During The Managing Committee Meeting of The Chamber on 20th January 2021, The President Mr. Deb A Mukherjee, introduced His Excellency Freddy Svane, Ambassador of the Kingdom of Denmark to India, and also Ambassador to Bhutan, Sri Lanka, Maldives and Nepal, who participated in the meeting virtually. This was his second tenure in India and this region, the first one being in 2010-2015. Among his various roles, he was CEO of Danish Agriculture Council (2008-2010).

The President advised that The Bengal Chamber would like to set up an Urban Regeneration Lab for the City of Kolkata in association with The Danish Embassy towards sharing of best practices and learnings in civic infrastructure and development. Kolkata being a heritage city with a rich legacy, the Chamber needs to focus on its regeneration to ensure that the city grows and is a part of the global success story going forward. The Chamber would like to build this Lab keeping two fundamental principals in mind:

- (1) Sustainable Practices:- Keeping in mind the Sustainable Development Goals as envisioned by the UN as part of the SDG-17 goals for 2030. Hence, The Chamber was also embarking on an exercise of building a vision - “Vision Bengal 2030”, and
- (2) Resilient Ecosystem:- Through the Living Urban Lab that was being proposed to be created along with the Danish Embassy; The Chamber wished to build a strong and resilient urban eco-system.

The President thereafter invited His Excellency, Freddy Svane, Ambassador of Denmark to India, to address the Members present.

The following are the highlights of His Excellency Freddy Svane’s address:

Having spent his first tenure in India he has been familiar with Kolkata and Bengal. Kolkata was not just a city but a gateway to the North East; with the Bay of Bengal being the other gateway to explore opportunities in South East Asia.

Currently the Danish Embassy was working in Udaipur and Goa in the context of aiding the “Urban Living Lab”.

Towards sustainable growth and development of a future oriented city and civic amenities and infrastructure facilities, Denmark can offer and help immensely for which he was interested to meet in person to discuss in detail and take the proposed collaboration further. He was interested to look into what was being planned for “Vision Bengal 2030” for Kolkata and for Bengal and was ready to extend whatever help required. He felt that perhaps a common project could also be developed with KPIs set up to take this collaboration further.

Sustainable goals now need to be taken on at the ground level and worked upon and he would be interested in looking at the various solutions available in hand as he believed that there are plenty of opportunities to be explored.

The Session concluded with Mr. Subir Chakraborty, Senior Vice President, extending a formal Vote of Thanks to His Excellency.

The Chamber is willing to take up exchange programmes on resource efficiency and other related capacity building with the Embassy to facilitate this mission.

His Excellency, during his address, highlighted the areas in which the collaborations with India may be explored - renewable energy; water; agriculture; technology startups; health tech especially robotics; fintech and urban regeneration. He mentioned that urban living labs are early experimentation gardens, embedded in neighbourhoods and cities in which residence, Governments, private sectors and knowledge institutions interact to design, test and fine-tune social and technical interventions in real life. There has been a growing up take of the living lab method for participatory urban initiatives since, focusing on four key functions, such as experimentation; engagement; co-creation; and learning to help reverse the degeneration of urban settlements and bring about urban regeneration. The Ambassador also mentioned that only 4 percent of water is pushed into distribution network in Denmark is unaccounted due to leaks and other factors where as in most Indian cities it is about 50 per cent. Denmark would love to work with Indian cities to reduce the volume of unaccountable water. His Excellency also stated that he is willing to be associated with the Chamber's initiative of Vision Bengal 2030 wherein the Chamber looks forward to bring in expertise/technologies and skills of Denmark to implement with the scale of India.

INTERACTIVE BUSINESS SESSION WITH THE DELEGATION FROM THE EMBASSY OF THE REPUBLIC OF INDONESIA IN INDIA

9TH APRIL 2021, WILLIAMSON MAGOR HALL, THE BENGAL CHAMBER PREMISES

The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry organized an Interactive Business Session with the Delegation from The Embassy of the Republic of Indonesia in India on 9th April 2021, Friday at the Chamber.

The Delegation was led by His Excellency Ferdy Nico Yohannes Piay, The Chargé d'affaires for The Embassy of the Republic of Indonesia in India; Ms. Annie Yulianti, First Secretary (Economic), Delhi and Mr. Bona Kusuma, Trade Attache, The Embassy of the Republic of Indonesia, New Delhi. Mr. Mahesh Saharia, Honorary Consul, Consulate of the Republic of Indonesia in Kolkata also graced the Session.

Senior Members and Stakeholders of the Chamber from various sectors-agriculture, energy, health, mining, textiles participated in the Session. (MC Members present) were present among others.

His Excellency Ferdy Nico Yohannes Piay shared his objectives of visiting Kolkata. As stated by him, Indonesia has strong bilateral relationship with India. Indonesia has emerged as the second largest trading partner of India in the ASEAN. In 2018, the visit by the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India to Jakarta marked the pinnacle of collaboration between the countries. India and Indonesia have elevated their bilateral ties to Comprehensive Strategic Partnership.

His Excellency emphasized that there is further room to strengthen the trade relationship between India and Indonesia. Trade relations with Indonesia have been driven largely due to its surplus endowment of natural resources. At present, India has \$20 billion total trade of Indonesia with \$10 billion of Trade Surplus in coal and palm. His Excellency stated that India and Indonesia have agreed to join the Trade Agreement after India pulling out from RCEP. Due to the pandemic, the process has been slowed down however, the preparations are in progress. The Embassy of the Republic of Indonesia in India would like to go extra miles to support the relationship between the two countries. Indonesia would like to diversify the business portfolios. In diversifying trade on the Indonesian side, a number of products have been given access to India- red meat, pharmaceuticals, dairy, rice, sugar etc. Energy Security is very important in Indonesia. Working Groups of various sectors would facilitate progress of trade. His Excellency mentioned about Indonesia's focus on increasing business with India not only by increasing the exports but also the imports by the way of channelizing its deficits with some other countries. The Session accentuated the importance of connectivity between the two countries.

In terms of connectivity, more emphasis is being given to air connectivity. The number of flights from India to Indonesia and vice-versa needs to be increased. His Excellency is already in discussions with Port and Airport Authorities to increase the connectivity between India and Indonesia.

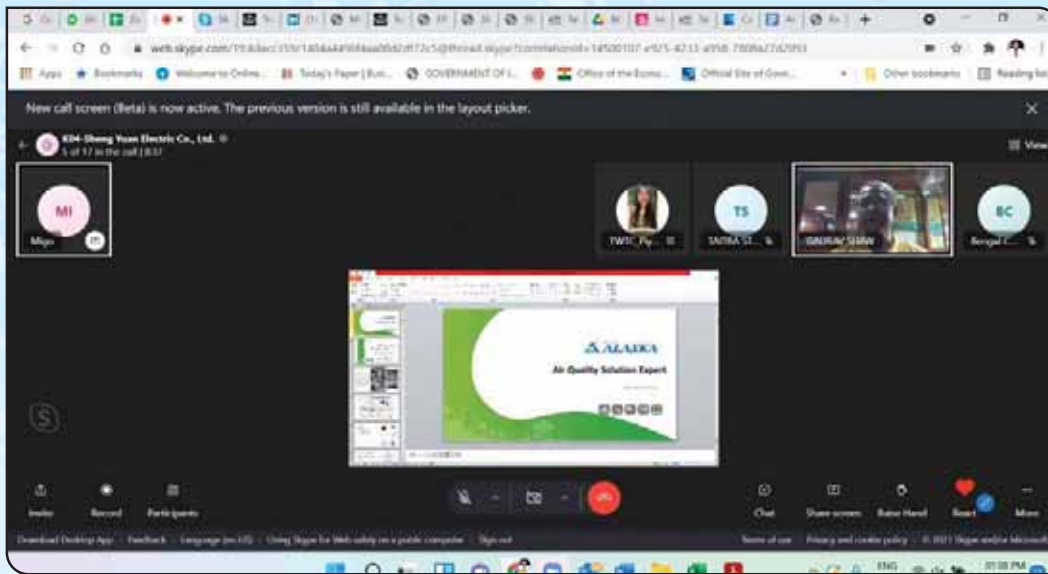

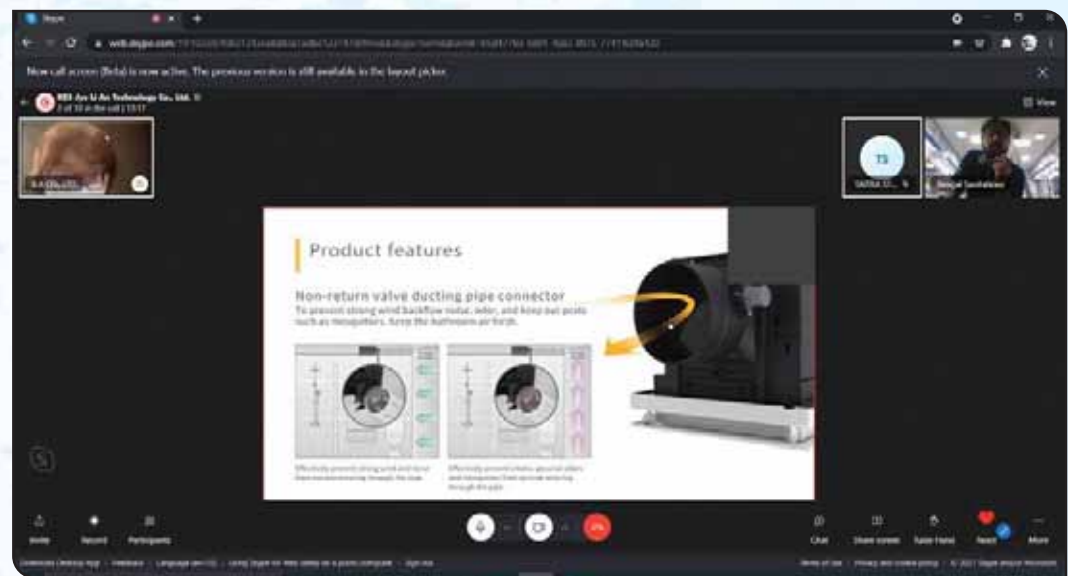

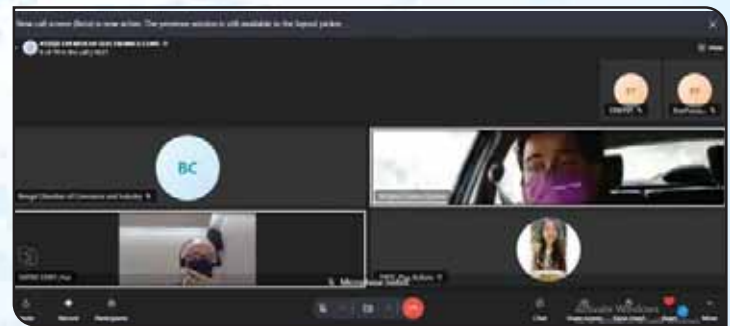

Mr. Valentin Makarov, President, St. Petersburg-based Russoft, stated that a number of Russian software companies are very keen to expand footprint and forge JVs in the BRICS nations and India appears to be the best potential partners for Russia to create and achieve technological goals. A total of 267 software companies from across Russia are part of Russoft, which was formed in 1999 with a consortium of only 10 entities. Around seven Russoft companies had 'stable partners' in India. The technology giants such as Microsoft, Intel, Dell and HP had development centres in Russia, and some of these companies had shut shop in the country after the invasion of Ukraine. **Mr. Makarov** also said that Russian IT companies can boost Indian firms with technological prowess- i.e. by including artificial intelligence (AI), automation of industrial production, cyber security, telemedicine and digital governance; by bringing AI in tax treatment, optimising traffic movement through software, economising electricity consumption and working on information systems for logistics. **Mr. Makarov** also emphasized on digital currency and a Rupee-Ruble payment mechanism to avoid dependence on U.S. dollar for international trade.

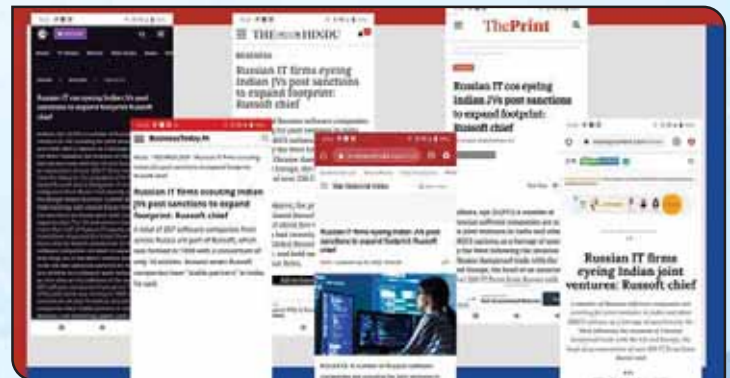

ROUND TABLE DISCUSSION ON “AUSTRALIA-INDIA ECONOMIC COOPERATION AND TRADE AGREEMENT”

25TH APRIL 2022, THE BENGAL CHAMBER PREMISES

The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry organized **Round Table Discussion on “Australia-India Economic Cooperation and Trade Agreement” on 25th April 2022 in The Bengal Chamber Premises.**

The Chamber was delighted to have **Ms. Rowan Ainsworth**, Consul General, Australian Consulate – General in Kolkata; **Mr. Hugh Boylan**, Economic and Public Affairs Counsellor, Australian High Commission, New Delhi and **Mr. Debarka Chakraborty**, Principal Consultant, MN Dastur & Company (P) Ltd. **Dr. Prabir De**, Professor, Research and Information System for Developing Countries (RIS), New Delhi graced the session virtually. **Mr. Abraham George Stephanos**, President, The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry and Managing Director, Tata Steel Downstream Products Limited and other senior members and stakeholders were also present in the programme.

The session was commenced with the formal Welcome Address by **Mr. Abraham George Stephanos**, President, The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry and Managing Director, Tata Steel Downstream Products Limited. He said that it is important for businesses to understand the opportunities unlocking from the trade agreement and the Chamber is actively acting as a facilitator.

Ms. Rowan Ainsworth, Consul General, Australian Consulate – General in Kolkata shared the overview of the Foreign Trade Agreement (FTA). Australia is the 17th largest trading partner of India and India is Australia's 9th largest trading partner. India and Australia, on 2nd April 2022, had signed an economic cooperation and trade agreement under which Canberra would provide duty-free access in its market for over 6,000 broad sectors of India, including textiles, leather, furniture, jewellery and machinery. This agreement is likely to be implemented in about four months.

Mr. Hugh Boylan, Economic and Public Affairs Counsellor, Australian High Commission, New Delhi highlighted benefits of the deal, which would help in taking the bilateral trade from \$27.5 billion at present to \$45-50 billion in the next five years. This is the first trade agreement that India has signed with a developed economy after more than a decade.

Dr. Prabir De, Professor, Research and Information System for Developing Countries (RIS), New Delhi shared his perspectives on possible impacts of FTA on industries in both Australia and India and its bilateral trade. He stated that India-Australia Economic Cooperation and Trade

Agreement is going to strengthen not only the bilateral trade between the two countries but also improve India's image in the world post-RCEP.

ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION ON “RUSSIA-UKRAINE : DYNAMICS OF GEOPOLITICS”

5TH MAY 2022, THE BENGAL CHAMBER PREMISES

The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry organized a **Roundtable Discussion on “Ukraine : Dynamics of Geopolitics”**, with **Air Chief Marshal (Rtd.) Arup Raha**, Honorary Member and Ambassadeur Extraordinaire, The Bengal Chamber and President, CENERS- K, on 5th May 2022 in The Bengal Chamber premises.

Dr. Nilanjan Ghosh, Director, Centre for New Economic Diplomacy & ORF Kolkata Centre, Observer Research Foundation moderated the discussion forum.

The following discussions on Russia-Ukraine : Dynamics of Geopolitics, were made during the session :

The Russia-Ukraine war has generated a climate of fear rooted in Cold War geopolitics of mutual “mistrust” between Russia and the West. There are apprehensions that it may even extend up to the Indo-Pacific region.

India had taken a neutral, stance, born of its historic strategic partnership with Russia. This alliance is spread over several fronts—diplomacy, nuclear energy, and — making Russia a pivotal part of India’s nation-building process.

Indian banks have small exposure to the two warring countries; but oil price surge above \$100/bbl mark could impact India’s current account deficit and inflation. A major setback for global economic growth has taken in place as Russia is one of the largest exporters of crude oil globally. India’s trade, however, comprises only 1% oil imports from Russia, but there could be a spillover impact in the form of high inflation and sluggish growth.

Reserve Bank of India is giving extra ammunition to seek dominance in the changing world order as alternate payment and settlement mechanisms are explored. Russia’s disconnect from trading partners in the world has created a void, which India would be able to fill in terms of exports.

With the increase in sanction against Russia, more opportunities are likely to open for India, for not only traditionally traded items, such as, pharmaceuticals; tea; rice etc, but also in newer areas like medical devices; software and hardware; transport, machinery; mobile and telecom devices; chemicals; textiles; leathers; ceramic and agriculture.

The proposed Rupee-Ruble payment mechanism could settle payment in non- dollar currencies among interesting jurisdictions of BRICS and SAARC Countries.

Ever-Clear has been established for more than 20 years, accumulated sufficient engineering experience and 314 engineering achievements and established standardized operation procedures. It specialises in industrial waste water treatment for removal of Bio-refractory organics. It undertakes industries including food, chemicals, optoelectronics, papermaking, textile dyeing and finishing, leather and pharmaceuticals, etc. Its technologies and services can meet the needs of wastewater treatment in various industries.

Mr Yu Jen Huang, Head of R&D Department, Ever Clear attended the session along with Mr. Steven Liu, Director, Taipei World Trade Centre Kolkata (TAITRA) and other representatives of TAITRA.

Top level representatives of the relevant members and stakeholders companies of The Bengal Chamber joined the aforementioned meeting, viz-Aquatherm Water Treatment Pvt. Ltd.; Sunanda Environmental International Pvt Ltd; Swach Environment Limited; Water Tech & Enviro Solutions. Mr Huang, during the session, showcased the market and products of Ever Clear :

The business market of Ever Clear is mainly in industrial wastewater and organic waste gas treatment:

Mr Huang also stated that Ever-clear cooperated with the Indian engineering company XH2O to build a new joint wastewater treatment plant project in the Vatva Industrial Park in Gujarat, India, with a daily processing capacity of 30,000 tons and a total amount of 47 crore INR.

The Session was interactive and thought provoking where various aspects of Wastewater Technology solutions, Industry specific problems, opportunities and challenges of the Indian Industry sector, were discussed. He was accompanied by Madam Hui-Chen Chen Ger; Ms. Estela Chen, Executive Director; Ms. Allison Chao, Assistant Representative and Mr. Andy Jian, Assistant Representative, Taipei Economic and Cultural Center in India; Mr. Steven Liu, Director, Taipei World Trade Center, Liaison Office in Kolkata and other officials of the Centre. The Bengal Chamber was also represented by other senior officials.

HE BaushanGer, Representative, Taipei Economic and Cultural Center in India, spoke about beauty of the City of Kolkata and how it has changed from past.

He mentioned that India and Taiwan need FDI to increase bilateral business. Increase of trade will, in turn, encourage Taiwanese companies to set up industries in India of which West Bengal may take the benefit by attracting investors suitably.

According to HE BaushanGer, people in Taiwan understand India. But people of both countries do not visit each other much. This can be bridged if tourism is promoted by both the countries. Tea Tourism was suggested by him. Buddhist Tourism was suggested by Mr. Abraham Stephanos. People to people connect will also help in business collaborations. Organic foods also have scope of exporting from India as Taiwan imports 30% of the food they eat.

In the other South East Asian Countries, Taiwan's investment is significant. But such investments are still not visible in India. Investments of Taiwanese Companies from some of these countries may be channelized to India for interest of both Taiwan and India. Gaming industry also has great potential.

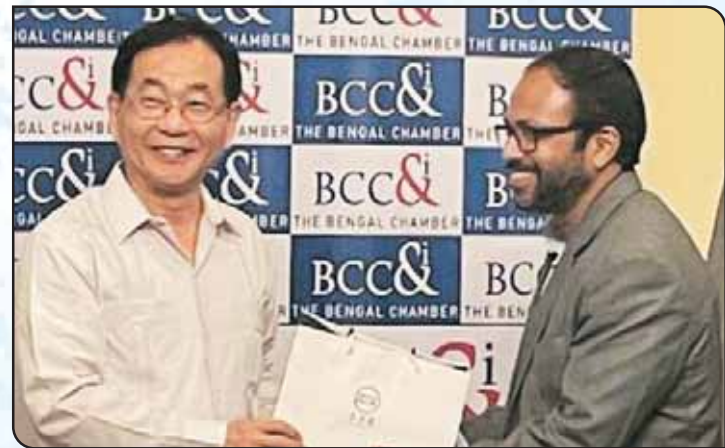
Banking Institutions from Taiwan need to come to India to encourage and facilitate Taiwanese companies operating here. Most of the Taiwanese companies are SMEs. Therefore, favourable financial support is needed by them. Currently there is only one bank operating in New Delhi and Chennai. The Bengal Chamber may also create a forum for capital financing from Taiwan.

There is a need to increase the awareness in India regarding the expertise of Taiwanese companies, though there are existing continuous B2B Meetings organized by Taiwan Liaison Office in Kolkata and The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry. Exhibitions of Taiwanese products and technologies in Eastern part of India are needed. Roadshows of Taiwanese companies may be organized in West Bengal and vice versa of Indian companies in Taiwan. The Bengal Chamber may facilitate this.

International schools in Taiwan and India can encourage students to study in Taiwan and India.

India Taiwan Industrial Summit will be held on 3rd November 2022. Discussions will be held on green energy, smart city and electric vehicles.

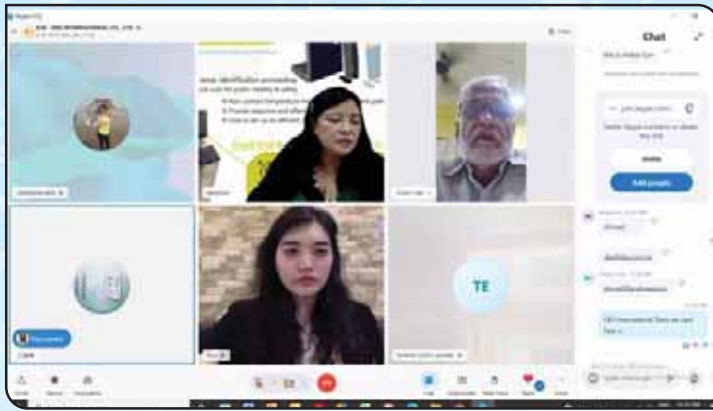

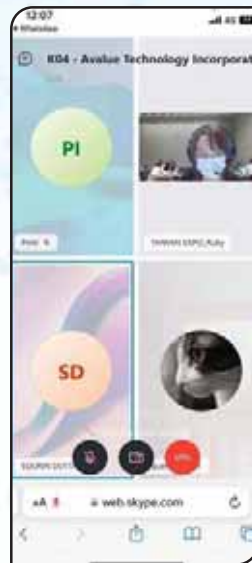

Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry is honoured and privileged to have esteemed guests and leaders from business and government from 11 nations – Australia, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Japan, Malaysia, Nepal, Republic of Korea, Taiwan, Thailand, Vietnam, and United States, apart from India. These initiatives collectively aim to promote inclusive, sustainable, and resilient economic development across the Indo-Pacific region, fostering cooperation, mutual benefit, and peace and security.

The Inaugural Session was moderated by **Mr. Ambarish Dasgupta**, Former President, BCC&I and Senior Partner, Intueri Consulting LLP. He stated a famous quote by a geopolitical scholar, Dr. Amitava Acharya, "Asia was built by the nations, Asia-Pacific was built by the economists, East Asia definition was made by the culturalists and Indo-Pacific by the strategists".

Indo-Pacific has 2 connotations : geographically and geopolitically. The geographic definition defines a vast biogeographic region which comprises the tropical waters of the Indian Ocean and Western- Central Pacific and the seas connecting the two. It comprises of the Indian sub-continent, South East Asia, Oceania, Indian Ocean and the Middle East. The geo-political definition includes many more countries. It extends from the eastern coast of Africa across the entire span of the Indian Ocean to the western reaches of the Pacific encompassing countries such as Japan and Australia.

The esteemed speakers also made discussions on women integration, climate and generic qualities, regional cooperation between the chambers of commerce, food security, service sector improvements to produce better results together.

The second half of the Inaugural Session was moderated by **Prof. Ajitava Ray Chaudhuri**, Ph.D, Professor Emeritus and Head, Department of Economics, Adamas University and Chairperson, Economic Affairs Committee, BCC&I. Some prominent pictures from the opening session are appended below.

Shri Sanjeev Sanyal, Member, Economic Advisory Council to the Prime Minister (EAC-PM) was the Guest of Honour and the expert speaker for the Inaugural Session. In his address he said:

Indo-Pacific is an important framework and we are already beginning to build the financial, physical, economic, and commercial architecture by concrete step by step measures. Indo-Pacific Framework is a maritime concept. The maritime aspect of this is absolutely critical because without taking this into account much of the conversation is meaningless but once we go into a maritime framework then the way we look at the world changes. So once we begin to think in maritime terms we begin to have a far more flexible world view than when we have a landlocked view of the world. So, he is emphasizing in this maritime aspect over and over again because in the end Indo-Pacific is a maritime concept.

He added that there is also a financial aspect to the framework. Instead of having rigid financing systems we need to have globally fluid network of financing. Indo Pacific region also has some serious finance hubs. Example Singapore, Tokyo, Mumbai. Interlinking all of these is the key. India intends to internationalize the Indian Rupee over the next decade or so for it to be much more widely used. India aspires to be like other hard currencies like Yen, Pound, Singapore Dollar, and Euro etc. The nation expects that the Indian bonds will be more widely used. India is becoming a more prominent part in the international financial network.

Dr. Devyani Uttam Khobragade, addressed the session virtually.

She stated that the indo pacific is volubly one of the most strategically important region in the world now. The importance can be underscored by the fact that the region is at the center of global trade and commerce accounting for 65% of the world’s population, 63% of the world’s GDP, 46% of world’s merchandise trade and 50% of world’s maritime trade. India was amongst the first to articulate its vision for the Indo-Pacific. She also quoted India’s vision as laid out by Honorable Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi which calls for a free open and inclusive order in the Indo-pacific based on respect for sovereignty and territorial integrity of all Nations, peaceful resolution of disputes through dialogue and adherence to international rules and laws. India’s concept of Indo-Pacific is inclusive in nature and supports an approach that respects the freedom of navigation and over flight clearances for all international seas. Further she described India’s relationship with Cambodia and stated that the relationship has achieved a multifaceted character with regular interaction at the political and official levels, exchange of bilateral visits, capacity building and cultural exchange, change of development partnership, assistance towards de-mining efforts and restoration of cultural monuments.

Further she elaborated the extend of this relationship by stating that an institutional arrangement is already in place for exploring the integration of Unified Payments Interface with Cambodia. India also wishes to establish a physical connectivity through infrastructure development with further extension of Eastward expansion of the India Myanmar trilateral highway and by negotiating with the investment treaty.

BCC&I was overwhelmed to listen an overpowering address by **Smt. Neelam Rani**, IFS, Director, Branch Secretariat, Kolkata, Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India

She stated that, this conclave is an important platform as it will serve as a unified platform for the business community from the Indo-Pacific region to deliberate upon their agendas. This Conclave will prove to be catalyst to enhance business engagements and will further connect the business community in the Indo-Pacific region. The Indo-Pacific region accounts to 63% of GDP and half of all global trade passes through the waters this region. The growing importance of this region on the global geopolitical map and the problem of economic concentration prompted us to intensify our business engagements in the region as India strives for an open free rule-based Indo-Pacific region. India stands for freedom of navigation and respect for international laws in the Indo-Pacific region. De-risking the global economy now involve reliable and resilient supply chain as well as

promoting trust and transparency in the digital domain. India Pacific region documents call for close cooperation within Indo-Pacific countries for improving connectivity in all its dimensions: - transport, digital and human.

Special Session I : The East in India’s Act East & Common Charter Development

In this session the Chamber brought together various Chambers of Commerce, Leaders representing Industry, Diplomats and Trade Agency Experts from 11 Indo-Pacific countries for the formation of Indo-Pacific Chamber of Commerce (AIPCC).

All the participating nations suggested to be more productive by working on shared principles of collaboration, innovation, pioneering, shared learning, teamwork, and trust.

A context of existing trade agreements, supply chain management, air and maritime connectivity especially addressing procedural issues to cross-border trade were some other suggestions. Financial markets, digital integration and wellness could be the other pillars.

People connect (cultural) issues like tourism, work-force training, cross-border labour mobility (including professionals and technicians with special emphasis on youth and gender), collaboration in technology, sustainable energy, creating an educational equilibrium and undertaking a gap analysis customized to the needs of the diverse challenges faced by individual nations in the Indo-Pacific can be some of the key drivers as suggested by the Nations.

Based on these suggestions and the arguments of the meeting a forum was formed titled “Association of Indo-Pacific Chambers of Commerce” (AIPCC) and a Charter was released in presence of the media.

Special Session II : Trade Creation and Market Access Dialogues

The session’s speakers highlighted on re-building of the global cooperation between the nation states, re-structuring of the supply chain and on shoring of global production networks. India has made a lot of investment for strengthening transport links within the country and also for dedicated trade corridors.

The Indo-Pacific Economic Conclave 2023 promises to be a milestone event in shaping the economic destiny of the Indo-Pacific region. It reflects the collective vision of nations in the region to create a prosperous, inclusive, and sustainable future for their people.

Day 2 : 29th September 2023

The theme for Day 2 of the Indo-Pacific Economic Conclave was “India leads- towards 3rd largest economy”

Day 2 of The Indo-Pacific Economic Conclave on 29th September 2023 witnessed the leaders of our Nation’s economic ecosystem and policy makers on a single platform.

The keynote address was delivered by **Shri T Rabi Sankar**, Hon’ble Deputy Governor, Reserve Bank of India.

Addressing the Conclave Shri T Rabi Sankar, said, Digital Payment Infrastructure (DPI) to be one of the most important drivers of the Indian Economy. He also mentioned that impact of digital payment systems on cross border payments and its impact will be felt in years to come in cross border payment. As per the world Bank research, Global cross border remittances in 2022 was estimated to be US\$ 830 billion. India was the top recipient of US\$ 111 billion. According to World Bank remittance prices Worldwide database, the global average cost of retail size of global remittance was 6.2 % in Q4 2022. For some countries this cost can be as high as 8%. Such a high cost in today’s context when data-connectivity is so cheap is simply unconscionable. I believe that given the

available technology, the present situation is not sustainable. In February this year India and Singapore enabled UPI Pay.

Now linkage to enable the citizens of both countries to make instant and cost-effective cross-border transfers. This inter linkage also aligns with the G20s financial inclusion priorities of driving faster, cheaper and more transparent cross-border payments and will be a significant milestone in the development of infrastructure for cross-border payments between India and Singapore.

The Conclave was opened to public and approximately 150 people were in the attendance. During the Conclave, the esteemed keynote speakers, Hon'ble Ministers, and other eminent industrialists shared the remarkable growth rates in various sectors of India and also came up with suggestions to lead India towards a 3rd largest economy.

A commemorative address was made by **Shri Sanjeev Sanyal**, Member, Economic Advisory Council to the Prime Minister (EAC-PM) on the day. In a compelling and visionary speech, Shri Sanyal passionately articulated a vision that promised to breathe new life into the heart of Kolkata. His Concept focused on reimagining Kolkata's river front through a detailed urban renewal plan focusing on creating a Hooghly corridor featuring a unique pedestrian precinct connect. Modernizing and Syncing tradition with millennia needs and reality was at the core.

Discussions were based on digital public infrastructure,

impact of digital payment system on cross border payments, investments to provide better housing and water connections to the people, attention towards skilling, re-skilling and vocational training, empowering women for inclusive growth, promoting technology and PLI schemes.

Shri Ajay Seth, Secretary, Department of Economic Affairs, Ministry of Finance, Govt. of India quoted "India leads towards a 3rd largest economy - is a journey not a goal. That is a means to an end and the end is well-being of our people and a well-developed India." He presented some data in this regard. Just about ten years back in 2013 India was at the 10th position and the size of the economy were 1.4 trillion. In these 9-10 years India is at the 5th position and the size of the economy is 3.7 trillion. In 1991, India was at the 16th position; the size of the economy was only 300 billion. The implications are huge. The country today has lot more wealth and resources for basic amenities, infrastructure and to facilitate business activities including industries. In the last 7-8 years India added four crore affordable houses. Today there are more than 19 crore houses who has proper water connections. Today the country can aspire and deliver on a saturation approach to basic amenities. There are almost 12 crore households under Swachh Bharat Mission where individual washrooms are there in each house. The country is moving from live to livelihood. Today 50 crore people under various schemes such as PM Suraksha Viman, PM Jibon Jyoti Yojna has insurance cover of the one form or the other. India has been able to achieve a very strong growth rate and a potential to grow faster in the coming years. India contributes to almost 15% of global growth in each year and creates opportunities for global investors and global companies. It also generates a virtual cycle of higher growth leading to higher savings, higher investment, more employment and again coming back to more growth. India's GST system has led to huge productivity gains and the goods can move with much better efficiency and check post facilities. He listed four sectors which requires attention – energy, skilling and re-skilling, urban infrastructure, and private sectors. A creative re-development of our cities and an orderly transformation to urbanization. He mentioned in this aspect the role of state government is very import for creating reforms in health, education and fiscal consolidation both as expenditure orientation and stepping up the tax efforts. The role of the chambers of commerce as stakeholders are important for India's development.

Shri Suneet Mehta, Dy. Chief of Mission, HCI, Canberra, Australia in his address expressed that India and Australia are really coming closer as the India-Australian partnership from June 2020 has created an unprecedented

momentum and the business environment is growing more collusive with each passing day. It is already anchored in both the nations desire to increase engagement in the Indo-Pacific, to realize a shared vision for an open free trade prosperous rules-based region that respects sovereignty in terms of mutual commitment. India and Australia are working together to create more diverse and resilient supply chains. Going by the lines of Honourable Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, Mr. Mehta also emphasized the development on the 3 T's i.e., trade, technology, and tourism. In order increase the bilateral trade strategies three strategies are being followed: tariff reductions, expanding market access and diversifying the trade basket.

Shri Mayank Joshi, Deputy Chief of Mission, Embassy of India, Tokyo, Japan expressed that to become an "Atma Nirvar Bharat" by 2047 the vision should be development on economic infrastructure, demography, democracy, supply chains and energy. Japan has been an important partner for economic development of India. He mainly focused on India- Japan partnership for creating better technological and infrastructure development in India. The two countries are focused to reform multilateralism and are working together closely in important constructs like the United Nations, the QUAD, the CDRI and also the Indo-Pacific framework. As per the information with regard to the Indian government's production linked incentive scheme, application of 26 Japanese companies with a commitment investment worth of 1.8 billion dollars has been approved.

Speaking about India's growth story post COVID at the Indo-Pacific Economic Conclave 2023, Dr. V. Anantha Nageswaran, Chief Economic Adviser, Government of India said that the response and recovery phase is over and now it is all about consolidation. India poised for good and steady growth for the rest of this decade. Our goal should not be only to become the third-largest economy in aggregate size but also in per capita terms, becoming a middle-income or upper middle-income country, for that we need to make sure that the aspiring middle class is not only able to get the kind of goods and services that they need but they are also in a position to contribute and this is not just a task for the public sector but also the private sector. To prepare the Indian demographic dividend we need right skilling, right education and right attitudes. If MSMEs get paid on time, India will have a vibrant economy and that will eventually be a win for large corporations.

Shri Rajeev Chandrasekhar, Hon'ble Minister of State, Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship and Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, Government of India said, that as per him, we certainly

seem to be living in very interesting and exciting times from a global perspective. He stated "almost everyday history is being made, milestones are being crossed. For the first time ever in the history of independent India we have a new parliament, which is a great moment and occasion to celebrate. Two days after the new parliament was released, a law enacted by which historical women's reservation bill was passed, which will absolutely transform the landscape of opportunities for women and young girls. Two days post that event, iphone 15 was globally launched and at the same day Indian people could also walk in to buy the same phones. The Indian consumers got the "Made in India Iphone 15", manufactured in India. A \$3 billion unit, first ever semiconductor plant, the ground breaking ceremony for that was held in Sanand, Gujrat. India is the fastest growing economy in the world. A country in 2014 who was importing 82% of its mobile phones, had no electronics manufacturing of any kind, is now manufacturing 100% of what it consumes and exported 1 lakh crore Apple and Samsung phones last year. "India is seeing almost 30 startups in semi-conductor device design. We were in the fragile five and here we are now at the top five economies of the world and our Prime Minister has guaranteed that we will move from the top 5 to the top 3 in the next three years. We will cross Japan and Germany and we will be in the league with the US and China amongst the top three economies in the world. Year after year the GST number shows that how the economic growth is not just a statistic, it is creating more and more resources for the Government to invest in infrastructure, in poverty of India to make them move out of poverty, giving them more opportunities. In India there were always lack of modern infrastructure, and here we are today, one of the largest spending nations in world in building modern infrastructure, from rail to roads, to ports to logistics, networks. We are spending 13 lakh crores in this financial year in creating modern infrastructure. The deep transformation changes that has happened for the past 9 years has provided an enabling framework for today's and future growth."

Experts' Roundtable on: A Discussion on "India Leads- Three Pillars of Success (Agriculture, Manufacturing & Services)"

The industrialist panel provided suggestions on three major sectors – **agriculture, manufacturing, and service sectors**. The suggestions were to allocate more resources to agricultural research and development to develop new crop varieties, technologies, and farming practices that increases productivity and resilience to climate change; to promote technological education, differential literacy, and STEM (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) in school; to focus on demand side management and also on

food processing system in case of the manufacturing sector.

Mr. Vijay Deshwal discussed how we have seen the services industry evolve over the last two to three decades and where we see it going forward. According to him, there are now there are other services like healthcare, education centres, etc, which can still be at the forefront and where we see a large opportunity coming through.

Mr. Manish Kumar Agarwal in his address talked about how India has come a long way since Independence on the

agricultural front development, and productivity, and this rapid advancement in technology is also helping Indian industry but still India faces a lot of challenges in the agriculture sector contributing to the agricultural economy.

Mr. Simarpreet Singh conveyed the message that, education in India is slowly adopting technology and the rate is much slower than other sectors like banking and agriculture.

Mr. Ujjwal Kanti Bhattacharya in his address said that, the manufacturing sector has dwindled and it must come up if we need to have sustainable service, agriculture, and manufacturing-driven export-oriented economic growth which ultimately adds to the pathway of India becoming a developed country by 2047.

Mr. Abhijit Banerjee said that, over the last few years, we have seen substantial investments coming in on the back of the PLI Schemes, which we believe that the government should continue and that would eventually have a rebounding effect on the economy. And in terms of scaling, we need to ensure that our biggest asset i.e. our population

German scholars have played a pivotal role in introducing Indian art, culture, literature, and philosophy to Germany and the wider world. In June 2019, The Bengal Chamber organized a Business Delegation's visit to Germany, including stops in Stuttgart, Utingen, Dusseldorf/Cologne, and Berlin. Germany acknowledges India's achievements in the IT sector and the availability of well-trained engineers but emphasizes the need for vocational training. There's a growing interest from German businesses to invest in India, particularly in research and development and manufacturing sectors. India is increasingly seen as an attractive destination for German investments.

AUSTRALIAN PARLIAMENTARY VISIT

11TH DECEMBER 2023, THE BENGAL CHAMBER PREMISES

The Australian Joint Standing Committee on Treaties, comprising of 5 Members of the Australian Parliament visited Kolkata and requested for a Meeting with Senior Members/Executives of The Bengal Chamber of Commerce & Industry at 3:15 pm on Monday, 11th December 2023. The roundtable was organized to understand more on outcomes of the Australia-India Economic Cooperation and Trade Agreement (in case any Member has benefitted from it) and gain insights on the business environment in the Eastern part of India.

A brief note on Australia-India Economic Cooperation and Trade Agreement :-

The coming into force of Ind – Aus ECTA brings together two major economies of the world - India the 5th largest economy and Australia the 14th largest economy. Since the trade between the two countries is hugely complementary, this offers opportunities on both sides and will pave the way for a win-win solution for both India and Australia. The India Australia-ECTA is expected to further grow the existing trade in sectors like minerals, cosmetics and wine and give a big boost to several other sectors of the Indian economy especially textiles, gems, jewellery and pharmaceuticals. Australia will provide zero-duty access to India for 100 percent of its tariff lines. India will provide zero-duty access immediately on 40.3 percent of its tariff lines and the remaining 30 percent in a phased manner over a period of three, five, seven, and 10 years. This also includes 125 tariff lines where duties will be reduced rather than eliminated.

President, Mr. Gautam Ray, rightly pointed out in his opening remarks that, the Australia-India ECTA in the years to come will help expand the trade vision between India and Australia and shall strive new horizons of business among the two countries.

According to him, the ECTA should bolster services trade between the two countries, particularly due to commitments in the agreement covering the movement of natural persons under Mode 4 of the General Agreement on Trade Services and in the category of professional services. The agreement on professional services should support Mode 4 access, particularly as a result of the decision to develop systems for 'recognising professional qualifications and experience, registration and licensing of professionals, including through mutual recognition or similar arrangements'.

The Consul General, Ms. Ainsworth said that, "The trade relation has never been better among India and Australia. The Audio-Visual Co-operation agreement is one such example. ECTA has eliminated most of tariffs that gives a frontload approach to the businesses who are benefitted right away. Since the ECTA is devised Indian textile exports to Australia has gone up to 28%. Additionally, CECA once operational, will provide a more comprehensive sets of benefits to the countries.

MP, Mr. Josh Wilson, MP, Federal Parliament, Australia & chair of the board of the drafting committee of ECTA has pointed out during the meeting that, "the bilateral relation when in draft form was addressed as one of the most dynamic treaty with a vibrant outlook on trade affairs".

Since the ECTA is still at a very nascent stage of its function, the roundtable also featured a discussion on the unrealized benefits of the agreement. The senior members and stakeholders from The Bengal Chamber of Commerce & Industry were requested to identify few of the unrealized benefits of the ECTA as per their opinion.

One of the objectives for the discussion was identifying the benefits of Australia-India ECTA so far experienced by the Indian industry since its implication on 29th December 2022. Since the effect of the ECTA, Exide business has gone up by 2.45% due to customs reduction by 5%. The aim for the organization next year is reaching the 5% growth. Which can be further accelerated if their dependence on Chinese raw material is could be reduced.

Although exports of minerals and textiles have increased significantly since implementation of ECTA, Ms. Ainsworth additionally gave an overview on the expectations from Comprehensive Economic Cooperation Agreement (CECA) which is set to be signed by December 2023. According to the feedback, Australia-India CECA will provide more comprehensive sets of benefits for both the countries once operational.

Some important identification of probable areas of collaboration among India and Myanmar by Dr. Charlie Than, Union Minister, Ministry of Industry, Government of Myanmar is given below :

There is a growth of investments in the MSME sectors of Myanmar over the years. Following which industrial training institutions and industrial parks are being opened in order to engage the large available workforce. Factories are being privatized to invite international investments in the nation.

The future prospects those are closer than it seems such as- technology transfer, knowledge sharing, trade facilitation, market linkage as necessary infrastructure and policy level support would be provided by the Government of Myanmar for ease of doing business.

According to Dr. Khine, pharmaceutical industry in Myanmar such as, HIV, Oncology etc., are experiencing maximum development compared to last decade both in terms of research and production. In order to scale up and make prominence in the international market Myanmar is welcoming investments in the Pharmaceutical industry.

Dr. Sai Myo Thurein, Lecturer, University of Pharmacy (Mandalay) apprised the representatives from academia that Ministry of Health, Government of Myanmar is open to collaborate with pharmaceutical research institutes in the neighboring countries.

The tone of the meeting with delegation was set by Mr. Dutta, the brief notion of which is appended below :

According to Mr. Debashis Dutta, "In coming years, the overall relationship between India and Myanmar will continue to grow and has the potential to assume greater prominence. The prospects for bilateral relationship are recognized in both countries as strategically useful, economically productive and aligned with each other's new agenda. India is looking forward to better protection of borders, long-term involvement with key projects, diversity in investments and a non-condescending approach to its neighbor."

Mr. Mayank Jain, Senior Manager, International Business, NTPC Limited informed the hon'ble Union Minister and other dignitaries of the meeting that, NTPC shall be interested in conducting small scale programmes in order to contribute to development in the EV ecosystem in Myanmar. Subsequently, NTPC is also preparing solarization report for many ISA countries, hence, owing to that Myanmar could also experience the same and therefore planning the utility of solar power given the data procured from the report.

According to Mr. Jain, this if implemented properly could also accelerate innovation in the power generation sector, therefore making way for participation in Industry 5.0.

Indo-Dutch business relations date back to more than 400 years. In 1604, the Dutch East India Company (Vereenigde Oost-Indische Compagnie, the VOC) began trading in India, first establishing itself in Dutch Coromandel, notably Pulicat, looking for textiles to exchange with the spices they traded in the East Indies. Diplomatic relations between India and the Netherlands were established in 1947. While Dutch colonial rule in Bengal was relatively short-lived, their presence left a mark. Dutch architecture and cultural influences can still be found in places like Chinsurah. The historical trade connection between the Netherlands and Bengal highlights the global importance of Bengal's textile industry and the fierce competition for Asian trade routes in the colonial era.

The Netherlands is the fifth largest foreign investor in India during F.Y. 2022-2023 with FDI equity inflows of USD 2.498 billion (INR 19,855 crores). From April 2000 to June 2023, the Netherlands was the fourth largest investor into India comprising 7% of overall investment with cumulative FDI equity inflow of USD 45.288 billion (INR 296,000 crores).

The two countries enjoy strong economic ties with high bilateral trade and significant Dutch foreign direct investment (FDI) in India. They are working together to facilitate trade and investment through initiatives like the India-Netherlands Fast-Track Mechanism (FTM) established in September 2022. This mechanism aims to streamline the process for Dutch companies investing in India.

Shri Rajeev Kumar, IPS Additional Chief Secretary, Department of Information Technology & Electronics, Government of West Bengal, emphasized the importance of not only focusing on technology but also on goodness.. The Prisoner's Dilemma from game theory was introduced to illustrate the significance of cooperation. It was noted that while intelligence and smartness are often valued, cooperation plays a crucial role in human success.

The discussion extended to the realm of AI, particularly large language models (LLMs), with differing opinions on their potential to surpass human intelligence.

The current demographic advantage of India was acknowledged, with a call to leverage it effectively. The unique challenges faced by the Indian tech industry were discussed, including the need for improved logistics and aggregation systems.

Mr. Gopala Ramanan, Vice President & JAPAC Controller, Oracle India, addressed the role of finance in the IT industry, starting with an introduction to his background and experience. He explained how he worked with customers, primarily CFOs and CIOs, to understand their requirements and implement best practices into the Fusion system. He highlighted the challenges of the ever-changing business world, noting that businesses need systems that can sustain long-term and do more with less. He elaborated on how Oracle Fusion addresses these challenges with its comprehensive systems and innovative solutions. Over the past 20 years, Oracle has acquired over 150 companies, integrating their best-in-class industry verticals into the Fusion system. Mr. Ramanan mentioned notable acquisitions like PeopleSoft and described how these integrations have strengthened Oracle's ERP, supply chain management, human capital management, and customer experience applications.

Mr. Ramanan discussed the advancements in automation within Oracle's financial operations, such as global journal entries and cash predictiveness tools. He explained how automation has reduced manual intervention, improved efficiency, and enabled faster financial closing processes. He also highlighted the role of AI and machine learning in enhancing Oracle's systems, particularly in areas like digital assistants and predictive analysis.

He shared examples of how Oracle has streamlined processes, such as auto-reconciliation of bank statements and automated order processing, to reduce errors and

improve efficiency. Mr. Ramanan emphasized Oracle's commitment to innovation and continuous improvement, noting the integration of acquired technologies into the Fusion system to benefit all customers.

Session : *Role of Cyber Security in ESG*

The discussion was led by :

Mr. Sudeep Das, Head SE, India & SAARC, Tenable India.

Mr. Sudeep Das, addressed the role of cyber security in Environmental Social Governance (ESG) initiatives, starting with an introduction to ESG basics and their importance to businesses. He highlighted examples of ESG practices, such as shifting to renewable energy and using reusable materials, and emphasized how these efforts contribute to environmental preservation and societal improvement. He underscored the need for businesses to understand their environmental impact to implement effective ESG programs. He connected ESG with business success, noting that ESG initiatives often lead to increased profitability and efficiency. He then transitioned to the role of cyber security, arguing that data and technology are crucial for any ESG program's success, and thus, cyber security becomes imperative. He stressed on the need for visibility, risk understanding and communication in cyber security to protect digital assets and ensure the smooth operation of ESG programs. Mr. Das concluded by asserting that cyber security should be integral to any business initiative involving technology and data, reinforcing that secure, well-governed systems are foundational to the success of ESG and other business programs.

Fireside Chat Session : *"Empowering Digital Transformation: Leveraging Technology for Impact"*

The discussions were led by :

Mr. Kasturirangan highlighted that the network industry is undergoing significant changes due to the growing adoption of artificial intelligence and the shift towards diverse network conditions post-COVID.

He noted three major trends: enhanced customer experience, integrated security and automation. Customer experience now emphasizes seamless network access and intelligent issue resolution, while security has shifted to a zero-trust model. Automation and orchestration are

becoming critical as networks grow in complexity, enabling rapid deployment and reducing error rates.

Mr. Sengupta elaborated on the evolving landscape, where data is increasingly scattered across multiple data centers due to cloud and SaaS adoption, leading to a reliance on internet access over traditional MPLS networks. He pointed out the significance of 5G in revolutionizing connectivity, although its adoption in corporate segments remains limited due to cost and endpoint support issues.

The discussion then turned to the role of generative AI in network management. Mr. Kasturirangan explained how AI is being used to automate troubleshooting, providing network administrators with real-time insights and diagnostics to quickly resolve issues.

Session : *"Connected Enterprise to Execute Strategies at Pace and Scale"*

Mr. Rajesh Goel, delivered a comprehensive overview of the challenges posed by disparate systems within organizations and the transformative potential of Oracle ERP (Enterprise Resource Planning) Cloud. He highlighted how fragmented applications across HR, finance and procurement often lead to operational inefficiencies and hinder growth. These inefficiencies include complex processes for reconciliation and reporting due to data scattered across multiple platforms. Such challenges not only impede agility but also pose barriers to scaling operations effectively.

Mr. Goel mentioned Oracle ERP Cloud as a solution that integrates these disparate systems into a unified platform. This integration allows for streamlined processes such as procure-to-pay and hire-to-retain, facilitating smoother operations and faster decision-making. Moreover, Oracle's ERP Cloud offers real-time insights and analytics, enabling organizations to make informed decisions promptly. He highlighted Oracle's commitment to innovation, with regular updates and enhancements delivered through Oracle Cloud Infrastructure (OCI), ensuring that businesses can stay ahead in a rapidly evolving digital landscape.

Session : *Digital Sustainability : Driving Profit with Purpose.*

In this session the importance of linking digital and sustainable transformation for future business success was highlighted. The challenges technology leaders face in this process and emphasized the need for strategic questions about maintaining innovation and building a sustainable future was also acknowledged. HP offers sustainable IT solutions from Edge to Cloud, aiding organizations in modernizing their IT strategies through pathways like HP Green Lake. These solutions focus on enhancing operational efficiency, reducing energy consumption and costs, and ensuring full asset life cycle management. HP's long history in sustainability was emphasized, including their early adoption of CSR and commitment to environmental responsibility since the 1940s. Mr. Dasgupta detailed HP's multiple solutions for sustainability tailored to the Indian market, such as frameworks for climate disclosure and reporting. He underscored HP's unique selling proposition (USP) of providing comprehensive ESG solutions, including training, tools for identifying sustainable partners and achieving Net Zero targets. Additionally, HP's commitment to sustainability extends across their product lifecycle, from manufacturing with sustainable energy to recycling and upcycling. The HP Green Lake platform was highlighted as a key solution for reducing over-provisioning and lowering operational costs, making sustainability both achievable and profitable. Finally, Mr. Dasgupta addressed the needs of MSMEs, explaining that HP offers affordable ESG solutions tailored to different sectors, ensuring even small and medium-sized enterprises can benefit from sustainable practices.

Session : Digital innovations towards "Technology for Good" - driven by experience + engineering + engagement continuum.

The session focused on the main drivers behind the current wave of digital disruption and highlighted changes in consumer behaviour. People now prefer the convenience of online shopping, personalized experiences, and digital-first services. The younger, digitally native generation also demands digital experiences. Additionally, growing concerns about sustainability are forcing companies to adopt eco-friendly solutions.

These trends are transforming industries across the board. For example, over 20% of global retail sales now happen online through platforms like Amazon, which has a \$2.1

trillion market capitalization. Similarly, over 40% of TV consumption is now through streaming services like Netflix. The rise of ride-sharing apps like Uber, which does 28 million trips per day, is another example of digital disruption.

To succeed in this era of digital disruption, companies need to focus on several key areas. First, they must design digital experiences that cater to diverse user preferences, rather than just digitizing existing processes. Second, they need to leverage data and analytics to personalize offerings. Third, they should leverage cloud and micro services architectures to rapidly innovate. Finally, driving enterprise-wide digital transformation, with buy-in from all departments, is critical for success.

The focus of the discussion was on the transformative era of technological innovation, where AI and generative models are reshaping industries at an unprecedented pace. This discussion aimed to offer valuable insights on leveraging these technologies to enhance efficiency and drive innovation in organizations.

The discussion delved into the rapid integration of generative AI into various sectors, highlighting both excitement and ethical concerns. Panellists provide insights into real-world applications and responsible usage.

Mr. Kalra discussed how AI and the 4D methodology are revolutionizing the banking sector.

Mr. Majumder talked about how AI is driving the digital and content creation revolution, particularly in Bengali media.

Mr. Guha explained how embedding generative AI into products enhances business processes, emphasizing built-in AI capabilities.

Mr. Nama, highlighted the importance of digital infrastructure and AI operations in democratizing AI initiatives.

Mr. Raj He emphasized the importance of understanding both the "what" and "how" of democratization. He highlighted that large issues like supply chain and ESG involve vast unstructured data, which generative AI now combines with structured data, offering new perspectives. The rapid success of Chat GPT, with 100 million users in two months, exemplifies democratization—no longer do users need to be data scientists to leverage technology. Generative AI compresses global information into one accessible file, empowering everyone to build their models and businesses, marking unprecedented democratization. Mr. Kalra discussed how banks have adopted AI for financial intelligence and process automation. Generative AI promises improvements in productivity and customer experience, but data confidentiality and compliance are critical. Internally, banks create data lakes for easy access and processing, while externally, they partner with service providers to help clients leverage AI for business insights, all while maintaining data privacy.

During the audience Q&A, Mr. Guha addressed data security with generative AI, ensuring that Oracle does not access or use customer data for training or inferencing, keeping data private and secure. On the issue of hallucinations in AI models, prompt engineering was recommended to make questions more specific and contextual, with human oversight being crucial. Another point raised was the use of other AI techniques beyond large language models (LLMs), such as smaller, more targeted models tailored to specific business needs, to minimize computational and environmental costs.

The panellists closed by emphasizing the importance of balancing democratization with data governance, security, and human-centric adoption processes. They stressed starting small, ensuring data privacy, and gradually scaling up AI initiatives across the organization.

Track 1 :

Session on Indo-Bangladesh Collaboration Opportunities in E-Commerce presented by MSTC.

In the session, it was conveyed that businesses today face increasing challenges due to digital transformation and economic volatility. AeroD, a global professional services organization, was introduced as a solution, offering 360° IT and management solutions through various products to help businesses improve their operations.

Mr. Roy provided an overview of MSTC, a central government PSU under the Ministry of Steel, which specializes in e-commerce services like e-auction, e-procurement, and custom software development. It was highlighted that MSTC has been involved in various sectors, including mining, telecom, power, and agriculture.

Mr. Sohel explained BASIS's role as the apex body for software and information services in Bangladesh, focusing on policy making, market development, and capacity building. He emphasized the collaboration opportunities with MSTC and the benefits of leveraging existing solutions rather than redeveloping them.

The discussion concluded with a focus on the future steps for collaboration. It was mentioned that MSTC and BASIS are exploring opportunities to work together, with expectations for formal outcomes and progress to be made within the year. The session ended with an invitation for questions from the audience, indicating ongoing optimism for successful collaboration.

Track 2 :

Benefits of Channel Automation : presented by Tally Solutions Pvt Ltd.

In the session, it was shared that Tally Solutions, established 40 years ago, had significantly transformed operations for small and medium enterprises by moving from manual to computerized systems. The narrative focused on how Tally had evolved to address challenges faced by businesses, including financial and inventory management. About six years ago, Tally had expanded into the government sector and enterprise solutions, aiming to assist large enterprises and their channel partners with stock and sales visibility.

The benefits of Tally's solutions, such as automated order processing and price control, were discussed. Tally had been instrumental in helping various industries, including cement, tire, and fast-moving consumer goods. Emphasis was placed on the integration of Tally with other systems through APIs and its recent transition to a cloud-based platform with AWS for improved efficiency.

The session highlighted Tally's role in enabling data accessibility and real-time insights for both channel partners and principal companies. It was mentioned that Tally was involved in pilot projects exploring new solutions and would soon introduce its first AI product to further enhance business insights. The founder's quote was shared, stating that there are businesses using Tally and those that will use Tally in the future.

Track 3 :

"Security as a Design" - a mandatory paradigm shift for SMEs.

Mr. Charly Graf, emphasized the importance of data privacy and governance, noting that smaller organizations often overlook these aspects, assuming they are only relevant for larger entities or regulated industries. Mr. Graf advocated for proactive measures in cyber security, highlighting that any action is better than inaction.

He discussed key compliance obligations under India's Digital Personal Data Protection Act of 2023, which includes requirements for explicit consent, data breach notifications, and data localization. He also compared these with European standards and emphasized the importance of integrating privacy and security into organizational design.

A Q&A session followed, during which Mr. Graf addressed questions on sustainability solutions and the availability of open-source software for corporate responsibility. He acknowledged the challenges and commercial aspects of such tools and advocated for a conceptual shift towards valuing and protecting data as a critical asset. The session concluded with a formal acknowledgment of Mr. Graf's contributions.

The session's focus was on enhancing opportunities in Kolkata, emphasizing the city's potential as a major IT hub. Despite some clichés, the discussion highlighted Kolkata's strengths: a vibrant talent pool, state-of-the-art infrastructure, and a favorable cost of living. The optimism for Kolkata as the next big IT destination was palpable, with predictions of significant growth in the coming decade.

Mr. Shantanu Ghosh, provided an overview of Kolkata's real estate market. He noted a growth from 1 billion square feet to an anticipated 1.67 million square feet by the end of 2024. Despite comparing favorably with other cities like Pune and Chennai, Kolkata still faces challenges, including perception issues and a shortage of Global Capability Centers (GCCs). He emphasized the need to change perceptions and leverage the city's strengths.

Mr. Chandrakirti Roy highlighted the company's significant presence in Kolkata with over 7,000 employees. He discussed the challenges of overcoming negative perceptions and emphasized that Kolkata remains an attractive location due to its talent pool and supportive government initiatives. Tele performance plans to continue its expansion, reflecting confidence in the city's growth.

Mr. Amit Srivastava discussed the company's growth in Kolkata from 3,000 to 4,000 employees. He noted Kolkata's competitive advantages, including talent, cost efficiency, and property costs. However, he called for more proactive efforts from both corporate and government to improve the city's image and capitalize on the growth potential. Amit emphasized the need for policy development and enhanced outreach to attract more GCCs.

The discussion also touched upon the exit of major companies like Tata from Kolkata, which has left a significant impact. The need for an image makeover and collaboration between the Chamber of Commerce and real estate sectors was highlighted as essential to address these challenges.

The session concluded with a call for collaboration and continued efforts to showcase Kolkata's strengths and potential.

The Conclave attracted CXO-level executives such as CEOs, CFOs,

COOs, and CTOs from leading organizations across various industries, including technology, finance and manufacturing. Dr. Amit Mitra, Hon'ble Principal Chief Advisor to the Hon'ble Chief Minister of West Bengal and Finance Department (in Cabinet Minister Rank), Government of West Bengal delivered the Inaugural Address on Day 1 : 26th September 2024.

He focused on the impact of emerging technologies on Indo-Pacific relations, presenting the broader regional picture before highlighting West Bengal's technological advancements. West Bengal was showcased as a case study, particularly with the establishment of a 200-acre Silicon Valley Hub, which attracted 41 companies, including major players in the telecom and data center sectors. A significant investment of ₹ 7,500 crores in telecom infrastructure followed the state's broadband policy introduced in 2020. By 2024, 11 data centers were established, with 7 already operational, from companies such as Jio, Airtel, and Tata Tele Data Center.

In 2021, the introduction of a data center policy helped enhance West Bengal's digital infrastructure, further supporting collaborations with the 14 Indo-Pacific countries. The Digha cable landing station, the first of its kind in Eastern India, improved digital connectivity, linking West Bengal to global hubs in Singapore, the Middle East, and Europe, positioning the state as a significant digital gateway. Additionally, the partnership with Fujisoft from Japan established a Centre of Excellence for 3D manufacturing and printing, upgrading MSMEs' technological capabilities and providing training to thousands of students across the state.

Global firms like Calsoft and Persistence Systems also

invested in the Silicon Valley Hub, strengthening the region's technological capabilities. Persistence Systems, with its focus on cloud computing, IoT, and big data analytics, brought over 23,000 employees and generated \$1.2 billion in revenue, drawing ancillary businesses to West Bengal. Similarly, TCS expanded its presence in Kolkata, employing 50,000 professionals, with plans to increase this number to 66,000 due to the city's low attrition rate and availability of skilled human capital. These developments underscored West Bengal's growing importance as a digital and economic hub within the Indo-Pacific region.

Concerns were raised about India's trade deficit with ASEAN, as imports from the region doubled compared to exports, partially due to the 2010 free trade agreement. The misuse of the ASEAN framework by companies incorporating within the region to evade tariffs was highlighted as a potential risk, emphasizing the need for careful collaboration with Indo-Pacific countries to avoid similar issues in future agreements.

Ms. Paramita Tripathi, Joint Secretary, Indo-Pacific and Oceania Division, Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India recognized the Indo-Pacific region as a vital region for global economic growth, housing 65% of the world's population and contributing over 60% of global GDP. It also serves as a hub for half of global trade, with crucial trade routes like the Malacca Strait, the Suez Canal, and the Strait of Hormuz acting as lifelines for global commerce. However, the region faced challenges such as geopolitical uncertainties from territorial disputes and shifting power dynamics, threatening supply chains and the overconcentration of production in manufacturing.

India's engagement in the Indo-Pacific reflected its own growth trajectory, emerging as the fifth-largest economy globally. Initiatives like Make in India, Digital India, and Skill India advanced India's infrastructure and economic capacity. Prime Minister Modi's vision of Sagar, promoting security and growth for all in the region, guided India's approach, while the Indo-Pacific Oceans Initiative (IPOI) fostered maritime safety, environmental conservation, and trade connectivity.

India's leadership in digital transformation was highlighted through innovations like India Stack and UPI, which revolutionized digital governance and financial inclusion. With a projected digital economy of \$1 trillion by 2025, India supported regional growth through funds like the ASEAN India Fund for Digital Future and the ASEAN India Science and Technology Fund. Trade with ASEAN surpassed \$131 billion in 2022-23, emphasizing India's strong economic ties with the region.

Technologies such as blockchain, smart port solutions, and regional data-sharing were identified as essential for the future of trade, while sustainable energy-based transportation was prioritized. The need for sustainable financing in infrastructure projects was emphasized, with initiatives like the International Solar Alliance and the Coalition for Disaster-Resilient Infrastructure helping to ensure regional economic stability.

India's commitment to regional cooperation was demonstrated through its leadership in forums like BIMSTEC, IORA, and the Quad, reinforcing the importance of resilient supply chains and secure, transparent trade. Through innovation and sustainability, the Indo-Pacific's challenges were seen as opportunities for growth, with a shared focus on ensuring peace, prosperity, and progress for all stakeholders.

Mr. Nakagawa Koichi, Consul General, Consulate General of Japan Kolkata emphasized on Japan's position in the Pacific region and its strong relationship with India were expected to remain stable and continue to strengthen. Japan and India shared a special strategic and global partnership, which marked its 10th anniversary this year. The relationship between the two nations had evolved steadily over the years, with significant collaboration confirmed during Prime Minister Kishida's visit to the U.S. for the Japan-Australia and U.S. Summit meeting on September 21st. During this visit, Kishida and Prime Minister Modi reaffirmed their commitment to ongoing joint initiatives.

Japan played a crucial role in India's economic transformation, having committed US\$34 billion in public and private investment and financing between 2020 and 2027. At the G20 New Delhi Summit, Kishida announced Japan's mobilization of over US\$75 billion for Indo-Pacific infrastructure projects by 2030. Bilateral trade between Japan and India reached approximately US\$23 billion in the previous fiscal year, with Japanese exports accounting for US\$18 billion and imports from India around US\$5 billion.

Japan's commitment to developing an industrial value chain in the Bay of Bengal region, particularly in northeast India and Bangladesh, was reflected through the Japan-India Act East Forum. This initiative, along with Japan's ongoing support for creating multi-layered connectivity, highlighted the importance of investment and logistics for both nations. The economic relationship between Japan and India remained firmly rooted in a foundation of multi-dimensional cooperation.

As one of India's key investors, Japan ranked fifth in terms of foreign direct investment (FDI), with cumulative FDI totaling US\$42 billion from 2000 to 2024. In the most recent fiscal year, from April to December, Japanese FDI in India was nearly US\$3 billion. Japan had been a consistent development partner since 1958, providing official development assistance that facilitated infrastructure growth in India's priority sectors.

Several high-profile projects were developed with Japanese cooperation, including the Mumbai-Ahmedabad high-speed railway, the Western Dedicated Freight Corridor, and the Delhi-Mumbai Industrial Corridor. Japanese companies, such as Tata Steel-Nippon Steel and Air Water India, were also actively contributing to Indian society across various sectors, from manufacturing to healthcare and agriculture.

Mr. Kevin Goh, Deputy Consul General, Australian Consulate General Kolkata states the relationship between India and Australia had long been strong and built on deep historical connections. While most Indians were more familiar with cities on Australia's eastern coast, such as Sydney and Melbourne, the speaker hailed from Perth on the west coast, which had ancient geological ties with eastern India. Both nations recognized the importance of diversifying their economic and strategic relationships, making India a crucial partner for Australia. This partnership aimed to benefit the entire Indo-Pacific region by advancing shared economic, strategic, and people-to-people interests, ensuring peace and prosperity.

In recent years, the economic collaboration between the two countries gained momentum. An Economic Cooperation and Trade Agreement (ECTA) had been concluded 18 months earlier, facilitating nearly 30 billion Australian dollars' worth of exports to India at zero or reduced tariffs. Negotiations for a more comprehensive economic agreement were underway, which would include a digital trade chapter to boost the benefits of the digital economy for businesses in both nations. Australia had also demonstrated its commitment to strengthening bilateral relations through initiatives like establishing the Centre for Australia-India Relations, opening a new consulate in Bengaluru, and launching a roadmap for further economic engagement with India.

Technological collaboration between India and Australia also flourished, with a focus on addressing global challenges such as climate change and sustainable development. The Clean Energy Supply Chain Diversification Program was one such initiative aimed at advancing clean energy solutions across the Indo-Pacific. Australia acknowledged India's growing tech ecosystem

and sought partnerships in areas such as blockchain, fintech, and quantum computing. Furthermore, the Australia-India Cyber and Critical Technology Partnership, established in 2020, had funded numerous projects to enhance cooperation in cyberspace and critical technologies, with artificial intelligence being identified as a key area for further innovation and governance.

Plenary Session

In this session, **Dr. Rupa Chanda**, Director, Trade, Investment and Innovation Division, UNESCAP (United Nation Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific) focused on the emerging technologies such as AI, blockchain, and IoT had increasingly become integrated into daily life, bringing both opportunities and challenges. These advancements created a heightened need for regulatory cooperation, particularly across regions like the Indo-Pacific. Without sufficient collaboration, the rapid growth of these technologies could have resulted in chaotic development. Technological innovations played a key role in fostering regional integration, especially for MSMEs, by enhancing their participation in global value chains. However, the successful adoption of these technologies required solid regulatory and infrastructural foundations, as Dr. Amit Mitra had highlighted.

Blockchain and AI were already transforming trade facilitation and promoting regulatory harmonization. The ASEAN Global E-Trade Service Platform, which utilized blockchain for greater transparency and efficiency, exemplified this transformation. Meanwhile, 5G and IoT had emerged as critical components in building smart infrastructure, improving connectivity, and enhancing trade efficiency. Technologies such as FinTech and cloud computing had empowered MSMEs by providing access to digital services that were previously out of reach. Nonetheless, the success of these technologies depended heavily on key prerequisites like high-speed broadband, 5G networks, and digital literacy, which were vital for their effective deployment.

Efforts to harmonize regulations across the Asia-Pacific region had proven challenging due to significant variations in regulatory maturity. Countries across the

region, including ASEAN members, exhibited different approaches to data privacy, cross-border data flows, and cybersecurity. This fragmentation had created barriers to seamless trade and digital technology adoption. ESCAP had been working to assess these regulatory gaps and develop tools, including a regional digital trade integration index, to evaluate countries' preparedness for digital transformation. However, the Asia-Pacific region's regulatory heterogeneity remained a critical obstacle, making convergence and cooperation essential for advancing regional interoperability and harnessing the full potential of emerging technologies in trade.

The session featured diverse insights from experts regarding the integration of technology into trade facilitation and the development of resilient supply chains in the Indo-Pacific region. Dr. Pralok Gupta highlighted his experience as a trade negotiator, noting a shift from just-in-time to just-in-case inventory practices following COVID-19. He emphasized the need for Indian firms to enhance their participation in global value chains, particularly in manufacturing. Key trade agreements, such as the WTO Trade Facilitation Agreement, were discussed as vital mechanisms for reducing tariffs and streamlining import and export processes.

Dr. Gupta also underscored the importance of technological advancements in improving supply chain visibility and efficiency, illustrated by the significant reduction in truck crossing times at the West Bengal-Bangladesh border through digital authorizations.

Mr. Abhijit Banerjee shared Linde India's digitalization

journey, aimed at enhancing customer service and inventory management in the localized gas industry. He discussed how the company adopted digital solutions, including Power BI, to track packaging safety documents and improve operational efficiency in response to growing demand in the photovoltaic cell market.

Ambassador (retd.) Sumith Nakandala reinforced the necessity of regional cooperation, advocating for affordable broadband access and enhanced connectivity via submarine optical fiber cables to facilitate digital platforms. He pointed out the lack of an international treaty for cable maintenance, highlighting the need for a legal framework, potentially developed by UNSCAP. Nakandala discussed the significance of regional organizations like SAARC and BIMSTEC in fostering collaboration, emphasizing a sustainable policy framework linking national and regional strategies. He also addressed the ethical considerations and risks associated with technological advancements, particularly in artificial intelligence, stressing the importance of ensuring technology serves human development.

Mr. Jitendra Kumar from Exide Industries elaborated on the company's extensive digital transformation efforts over the past seven years. He noted that Exide is leveraging Industry 4.0 technologies for real-time insights across operations, enhancing logistics, and ensuring data-driven decision-making. Kumar acknowledged the challenges of rapid technological adoption and emphasized the importance of a robust policy framework to manage risks associated with cybersecurity and data protection.

Dr. Priyadarshi Dash examined the transformative potential of blockchain technology in international trade and financial transactions. He highlighted its capacity to streamline processes, enhance transparency, and facilitate financial inclusion, particularly in developing countries. Dash pointed out the growing significance of FinTech applications, emphasizing their role in improving access to credit and the operational efficiency of underserved segments of the population. He noted the Indian government's supportive policies for digital technology in financial services, recognizing the gradual evolution of regulations since 2014.

Session Moderator, Dr. Shiladitya Chatterjee concluded that the session highlighted the critical role of technology in enhancing trade facilitation, promoting regional cooperation and developing resilient supply chains in the Indo-Pacific. The discussions also emphasized on the need for a balanced approach that addresses the ethical implications and challenges of rapid

technological adoption while leveraging the potential of digital advancements to foster economic growth and inclusion.

Special Session II - Roundtable Dialogue of the Association of Indo-Pacific Chambers of Commerce (AIPCC)

In this session **Mr. Vivek Jalan**, reflected on the evolution of AIPCC over the past year. Notable engagement from the Bengal and other chambers coincided with the upcoming 29th anniversary of the WTO, leading to extensive discussions on various preferential trade agreements (PTAs). Four primary types of PTAs were identified: Free Trade Agreements (FTAs) focusing on tariff rationalization, customs unions that combine tariff rationalization with centralized economic tariffs, common markets that allow for the movement of production factors, and economic unions that encompass all previous types alongside political and socio-economic integration. The session underscored the success of various PTAs, such as the ASEAN Plus 6 arrangement and specific trade successes from countries like Ecuador and Malaysia. The BCCI is actively working to advance trade facilitation through a trade facilitation agreement among 11 chambers, emphasizing the importance of continued collaboration to enhance regional trade and cooperation.

Mr. Subhodip Ghosh, discussed the Bengal Chamber's recognition of the potential for Indian chambers to support members in Export-Import businesses and franchise setups with tech transfer agreements. He highlighted how chamber membership facilitates connections, market discovery, and government engagement, enhancing business setups and collaborations. The Chamber aims to establish partnerships with foreign chambers that have historical ties to the region, leading to broader business connectivity. Initial outreach efforts included engagement with various consulates and agencies, resulting in the participation of several ASEAN chambers and the establishment of a network of chambers in the Indo-Pacific region. Subsequent meetings, including an

Entrepreneur's Summit in Bangkok, are paving the way for the formalization of this collaborative network. **Mr. Indronil Sengupta**, emphasized the BCCI's significant role in facilitating educational delegations and signing six MOUs during visits to Vietnam. Future plans aim to strengthen bilateral relations, particularly in the healthcare sector. He noted the success of the recent session in Bangkok regarding entrepreneurship but stressed the need for greater formalization of the collaborative framework to engage interested chambers fully.

Dato' Ramesh Kodammal, highlighted the initiative's significance in the current geopolitical landscape of increasing economic alliances. He acknowledged various regional frameworks, emphasizing the need for unity and cooperation to enhance economic relationships within the Indo-Pacific region. Dato' stressed the importance of registering the platform and obtaining government mandates, particularly from India, to facilitate collaboration. He pointed out the critical role of small and medium enterprises (SMEs) in driving business growth and called for chambers to provide mentorship and connections to these foundational entities. Dato' encouraged the establishment of a committee focusing on the legal aspects necessary for the platform's launch and sustainability, reinforcing a commitment to continuous improvement and progress essential for the platform's success.

Day 2 : 27th September 2024

Theme: Strengthening Indo-Pacific Partnerships through Technology Collaboration Inaugural Session

Dr. V. Anantha Nageswaran, Chief Economic Adviser to the Government of India, delivered insights into the complexities of the Indo-Pacific region, which comprises advanced, developing, and transitioning economies. He

noted that, despite recent stock market surges, global economic conditions had revealed medium-term uncertainties. A downward trend in global trade volume growth was evident, significantly impacted by notable spikes and contractions in the years 2008 and 2020. Additionally, he highlighted a decline in global industrial production, indicating shifts in manufacturing hubs towards the East and, to a lesser extent, Mexico. This period also witnessed a trend of de-industrialization, exemplified by companies like Volkswagen considering factory closures in Germany, alongside increased global trade restrictions driven by climate change, geopolitical tensions, and strategic competitiveness.

He emphasized a notable shift from cooperation to competitiveness, suggesting that the balance had tilted towards the latter in recent years. Supply chain management evolved from a "just in time" to a "just in case" model, reflecting concerns over security and geopolitical challenges. He asserted that the current global context differed significantly from the relative stability experienced between 1980 and 2015, suggesting that the world might be on the brink of a new phase of globalization characterized by increased competition, trade restrictions, and active industrial policies.

Dr. Nageswaran concluded by discussing the importance of improving educational quality and learning outcomes, noting the significant increases in enrollment rates in rural India. However, he also acknowledged persistent restrictions on women's participation in the workforce and the need for safety measures and legal reforms to enhance their involvement. The advent of artificial intelligence was recognized for its potential benefits, but caution was urged regarding job displacement and the impact on labor income.

India's macroeconomic prospects were cautiously optimistic, with growth rates projected between 6.5% and 7%, bolstered by recent initiatives such as financial inclusion, GST, and improved ease of doing business. By addressing key challenges in agriculture, SMEs, deregulation, and energy transition, India could potentially enhance its growth rate to between 7.5% and 8%. The path forward required careful navigation of complexities and uncertainties, balancing confidence with caution in decision-making.

India's post-COVID recovery was described as strong, with projected growth rates of 8.2% for FY24, following 7% and 9.7% growth in previous years. The government's effective management of COVID-19 was critical to this recovery, involving a combination of health and economic responses. Calibrated fiscal and monetary stimulus measures were implemented and withdrawn timely,

contributing to macroeconomic stability and sustained growth. Economic stability enhanced corporate earnings and capital market performance, with consumption growth remaining stable and capital formation rising from 27.3% in FY21 to 30.8%. Export growth improved from 18.7% to 21.4%, though future growth could face challenges due to stagnant global trade volumes.

He highlighted India's robust external financial position, with low vulnerabilities stemming from minimal foreign currency debt. The domestic banking system showed improvement, with increased lending activity and a diminishing negative credit gap. Fiscal expenditures shifted towards a more balanced 50-50 ratio between revenue and capital spending, enhancing long-term growth prospects. He drew attention to the UK's approach to infrastructure spending, which could serve as a model for India in showcasing capital expenditure without negatively affecting fiscal deficit calculations.

Dr. Nageswaran pointed out that India had performed well in managing inflation, maintaining interest rates below 6.5% and government bond yields under 7%. He attributed lower borrowing costs for housing and corporate loans to prudent monetary and fiscal policies. His analysis suggested that a more massive fiscal stimulus during the COVID-19 pandemic could have deteriorated India's macroeconomic position. Significant improvements in infrastructure, such as increased national highway length, the introduction of Vande Bharat trains, and enhanced turnaround times at Indian ports, had notably bolstered India's supply-side capabilities.

To sustain a growth rate of 6.5% to 7% or more, India needed to focus on domestic sources of growth and productive employment. Addressing the skill gap was deemed essential for improving employability and generating job opportunities. The agricultural sector was identified as crucial for food security and a potential driver for entrepreneurship and job creation. Nageswaran stressed the need to simplify regulatory requirements for micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs) to enhance their role as job creators.

He also noted that India's energy mix must transition gradually towards non-fossil fuels to support sustainable growth, amidst competitive pressures from China in both low-tech and high-tech manufacturing. He advocated for leveraging China's achievements while addressing the challenges posed by its manufacturing capabilities. The need for deepening the corporate bond market was emphasized, along with developing both the bond market and banking sector to effectively support growth and energy transitions.

He further underscored the importance of land consolidation in agriculture to improve productivity, highlighting the fragmented land holdings as a barrier to agricultural yields. Significant job creation was necessary, with an estimate of 8 million jobs required annually over the next decade, necessitating growth in SMEs alongside large enterprises. Deregulation was identified as crucial to encourage SMEs to scale effectively beyond micro and nano sizes.

Ms. Kathy Giles-Diaz highlighted the Indo-Pacific as a dynamic and rapidly growing region crucial for America's future security and prosperity, noting that it is home to over half of the world's population and accounts for 60% of global GDP. During her speech, she outlined the Biden Administration's Indo-Pacific Strategy, which aimed to strengthen relationships with allies and partners to advance a vision of a free, open, connected, prosperous, resilient, and secure Indo-Pacific region.

She discussed the Indo-Pacific Economic Framework for Prosperity (IPEF), which combined the markets of 14 countries, representing nearly 40% of the world's GDP, and offered significant opportunities for collaboration. She highlighted recent achievements in supply chains, including the signing of the IPEF Supply Chain Agreement, which focused on cybersecurity, cargo risk assessment, workforce development, and simulations for supply chain disruptions. Additionally, she mentioned the inaugural Clean Energy Investor Forum under the IPEF Clean Economy Agreement, which resulted in \$23 billion in investment opportunities for sustainable infrastructure and climate technology projects. Furthermore, the IPEF Catalytic Capital Fund was launched to support clean economy infrastructure projects through concessional funding, technical assistance, and capacity-building.

Ms. Giles-Diaz emphasized the importance of the Quad Leaders' Summit and the cooperation on diverse topics such as maritime security, technology, humanitarian assistance, and climate change. She noted that new announcements were made following the summit held on September 21st. Under the Health Security Partnership, the Quad launched the historic Quad Cancer Moonshot initiative aimed at reducing cancer deaths in the Indo-Pacific, initially focusing on cervical cancer. Additionally, the Global Maritime Initiative for Training in the Indo-Pacific (MAITRI) was introduced to enhance partners' abilities to monitor and secure waters and deter unlawful behavior, while the Indo-Pacific Logistics Network pilot project was launched to improve airlift capacity among Quad nations for natural disaster response.

She also discussed the Quad Fellowship, which would

award 50 scholarships worth \$500,000 to Indo-Pacific students for a four-year undergraduate engineering program at Indian technical institutions. She highlighted the affirmation of the U.S.-India Comprehensive Global and Strategic Partnership as a defining partnership of the 21st century during President Biden's meeting with Prime Minister Modi on September 21st. Both leaders emphasized technology innovation as a crucial aspect of this partnership, welcoming the U.S.-India roadmap to build safe and secure global clean energy supply chains, aiming to unlock \$1 billion in multilateral financing for renewable energy projects. They also highlighted the success of the initiative on critical and emerging technologies (ISET), which expanded cooperation across sectors like space, semiconductors, and telecommunications.

The announcement of the creation of the Global Foundries GF Kolkata Power Center was also made, which was expected to bring jobs and foster resilient and secure communities. Ultimately, the U.S.-India partnership aimed to translate shared values into a peaceful, secure, and prosperous future, emphasizing that both nations benefitted from working together. Ms. Giles-Diaz concluded her address by expressing appreciation to the audience for their contributions and efforts.

Ms. Mikiko Tanaka, speaking on behalf of the UN Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific, addressed a distinguished group of business leaders. She referenced UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres' remarks on the world entering an era of epic transformation, facing challenges requiring global solutions. The Summit of the Future led to the adoption of the Pact for Sustainable Development, Peace, Security, and Human Rights, which emphasized the role of digital and emerging technologies, like AI, as enablers of sustainable development.

Ms. Tanaka highlighted that innovations must be affordable and accessible, especially to billions in developing countries without access to critical technologies. She stressed the importance of responsibly managing technological risks to avoid deepening inequalities, including the gender gap. The recent Asia Pacific Ministerial Conference on Digital Inclusion and Transformation had underscored the need for comprehensive digital transformation, with a focus on creating an inclusive digital society.

Ms. Tanaka noted the Asia-Pacific region's vulnerability to climate-related disasters, its contribution to global greenhouse gas emissions, and how smart technologies were both reducing carbon footprints and increasing

emissions through the demand for digital devices. She emphasized the need for balanced management of technology to support sustainable development. She provided examples of innovative technologies addressing climate-induced disasters, such as the AI-powered early warning system developed by Comunidad in the Philippines, which included the Curbeat platform that provided emergency alerts in local languages and via SMS, even to basic phone users. The World Bank's data on nearly half a billion people living below the poverty line in South Asia, East Asia, and the Pacific in 2022 highlighted the persistent digital divide, which businesses could help bridge with both high-tech and low-tech solutions.

Regional cooperation, she noted, was essential for expanding technology access, and she cited Indonesia's Kopernik as an example of a successful research and development lab addressing socioeconomic and environmental challenges through simple, affordable technology. A 2011 collaboration with DripTech India helped transfer low-cost drip irrigation technology to small farmers in Odisha.

Ms. Tanaka emphasized the need for cooperation across sectors—public, private, and research—to connect communities with essential technologies. She encouraged chambers of commerce to facilitate inclusive technology cooperation, and noted ESCAP's Asia-Pacific information superhighway initiative, which aimed to close the digital divide. She also mentioned the Asia-Pacific Center for Transfer of Technology's role in fostering environmentally sound technology partnerships.

Interactive Session: Fintech Innovation and Standardization for Seamless Trade and Payments in the Indo-Pacific

In the session, the speakers shared their insights on the transformative role of technology in financial inclusion and economic growth. **Mr. Balaji Rajagopalan**, emphasized the crucial link between identity, access to banking, and economic empowerment. He highlighted that acquiring an identity enables individuals to open bank accounts, which are vital for accessing loans and credit. He pointed out that the digital payment infrastructure in India has created an identity layer that supports low-cost banking operations and facilitates secure data sharing. Mr. Rajagopalan also discussed the importance of seamless integration among various stakeholders in trade, suggesting that the current documentation processes pose challenges that could be mitigated through technology, including enhanced cybersecurity measures.

Mr. Ratan Kumar Kesh, reflected on the theme of empowerment, particularly for women at the bottom of the pyramid. He shared a compelling story of a woman from Nodia district who, through small financial support, achieved remarkable success. He stressed that financial inclusion is about more than opening accounts; it requires empowering individuals, especially micro-entrepreneurs. He noted that while the mobile revolution has increased access, many still face barriers to empowerment. Mr. Kesh advocated for the use of blockchain technology to enhance trust and efficiency in trade, positioning the Indo-Pacific region as a leader in leveraging this innovation.

Mr. Raj Jain, provided a macro perspective on the strategic importance of digital transformation. He acknowledged India's digital payment achievements, particularly the Unified Payments Interface (UPI), developed by RS Software, which has set a global benchmark. He stressed the importance of collaboration between fintechs and banks, noting that while fintech funding has surged, many startups still face challenges in scaling. Mr. Jain called for clarity in partnerships and highlighted the potential of Calcutta and West Bengal as a hub for fintech innovation.

Mr. Sidharth Prashar, discussed the critical role of small and medium enterprises (SMEs) in job creation and economic growth. He explained how Tally assists SMEs with financial management and compliance, particularly in navigating loan documentation challenges. His insights emphasized the need for integration with banks and fintechs to streamline operations and empower SMEs through standardized reporting.

Dr. Raj Rajesh outlined the growth of India's digital economy, projecting a rise from 10% to 20% of GDP by

2026. He highlighted key initiatives, including the Unified Payments Interface (UPI) and the Public Tech Platform for Frictionless Credit, which aim to enhance financial inclusion. However, he also acknowledged challenges such as financial literacy and the digital divide, stressing the RBI's commitment to consumer protection and education in the digital banking landscape.

Finally, **Mr. Karthik Srinivasan**, discussed the launch of his FinTech in India, focusing on cross-border payments and QR code-based systems. He underscored the need for collaboration among various stakeholders, including regulators and traditional banks, to build a financial bridge between Australia and India. His insights highlighted the complexities of establishing effective cross-border frameworks and the potential for replication across different markets. The session collectively emphasized the vital intersection of technology, empowerment, and collaboration in driving economic growth and financial inclusion.

Experts' Roundtable on : Digital Transformation in Indo-Pacific Trade and Connectivity

The session brought together industry leaders to discuss the evolution of trade, digital transformation, and infrastructure development in the Indo-Pacific region, emphasizing the need for innovation and collaboration to enhance India's role in the global economy. In the session, **Mr. C N Raghupathi**, emphasized his extensive experience in government infrastructure projects, particularly GST and MCA21, while highlighting ongoing discussions around information warfare as they relate to Indo-Pacific trade. He provided a comprehensive overview of global trade, noting that it amounts to approximately \$60 to \$70 trillion. Mr. Raghupathi traced the evolution of trade routes, pointing out that while the Atlantic route dominated global trade until 1980, the rise of China has shifted some focus to the Pacific route, though growth on this side remained limited.

He stressed two crucial aspects of trade: the pivotal role of technologists and the increasing digitization of services, with 20 to 30 percent of global services now being digital. Mr. Raghupathi called for India to enhance its position in the digital services sector and eliminate friction in trade, citing advancements from the GST implementation and proposing the use of emerging technologies such as 5G, generative AI, and blockchain to streamline operations and reduce trade barriers. He concluded by asserting the need for reforms to elevate India's share in global trade, which currently stands at one to two percent.

Mr. Kamal Nath, shared insights on the evolution of SIFY, which began as India's first private internet service provider in 1995. He highlighted the company's pivotal role in establishing secure enterprise networks and co-location data centers, which are integral to India's interbanking infrastructure. Nath discussed SIFY's partnerships aimed at financial inclusion, reaching remote areas, and noted the company's plans to expand its data center capacity significantly by 2025. He illustrated SIFY's global importance by mentioning that the top three hyperscalers host their services within its data centers. Furthermore, he spoke about SIFY's contributions to submarine cable routes across the Indo-Pacific region, emphasizing India's potential to lead in creating unique use cases in digital technology and assist less developed nations through technological advancements.

Mr. Anirban Banerjee, addressed the fundamental themes of regulations, policies, and infrastructure as critical elements for future opportunities. He noted that despite technological evolution, core business challenges remain largely unchanged globally. Banerjee emphasized Wipro's unwavering commitment to solving complex problems, underscoring a significant investment in generative AI and a strong focus on research and development. He highlighted the company's extensive presence in Asia and its collaborations with academic institutions to enhance innovative capabilities. He concluded by reaffirming Wipro's preparedness to tackle the next generation of global challenges through continued investment in emerging technologies and talent.

Mr. Balaji Doraiswamy, discussed South Asia's digitization progress, highlighting the region's shift from basic customer management to more integrated operations across various sectors. He pointed out the emergence of smart cities, with Kolkata being a focal point for Oracle's growth. Doraiswamy stressed the importance of last-mile connectivity for accessible digitized services and highlighted the necessity of building talent pools for developing required technologies. He addressed the sustainability challenges faced by large corporations and

emphasized the need for collaborations between big and small firms to meet future demands. Doraiswamy concluded by emphasizing the significance of standardization and mutual respect among countries for collaborative growth.

Finally, **Mr. Jay Doshi**, focused on the critical need to eliminate friction in digital transformation. He highlighted the importance of digital inclusion, emphasizing digital literacy, infrastructure, and talent accessibility. Doshi stressed the significance of empowering women and girls through corporate social responsibility initiatives to foster greater digital adoption. He described the challenges of building infrastructure in remote areas and the potential for collaboration with startups. Doshi elaborated on British Telecom's utilization of Indian talent for critical functions and projected significant economic value from these initiatives, including the creation of new jobs. He concluded by reaffirming the necessity of supportive government policies and the entrepreneurial spirit within the region for advancing digital transformation.

Conclusion

The Indo-Pacific Economic Conclave highlighted several key areas for strengthening regional trade and economic collaboration among Indo-Pacific nations. A significant step forward is the formal establishment of the Asia-Indo-Pacific Chamber of Commerce (AIPCC), which aims to streamline trade and foster economic ties, particularly addressing India's trade imbalances with ASEAN countries through fairer agreements. By promoting access to broader markets, the AIPCC can significantly contribute to economic growth in the region.

West Bengal has the potential to emerge as a leading digital and technological hub, showcased by the presence of major tech companies like TCS and Jio. Marketing the Silicon Valley Hub and the Cable Landing Station in Digha will attract global investments in digital infrastructure and data centers, enhancing India's position in the digital trade landscape. Collaborative efforts in emerging technologies, such as AI, fintech, and IoT, can further strengthen technological capacities across the region. Hosting global events like a VLSI Conference would reinforce West Bengal's reputation as a semiconductor hub, driving innovation and partnerships.

Furthermore, the Conclave emphasized the importance of fostering the growth of Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) through technology. Initiatives like Fujisoft's 3D manufacturing training center can empower MSMEs in the Indo-Pacific by facilitating joint ventures and technology sharing. By scaling such programs regionally, BCC&I can foster cross-border MSME collaboration and support their development through technological advancements.

A critical aspect of this collaboration is enhancing digital infrastructure and cyber security. BCC&I should advocate for standardized cyber security frameworks and promote the integration of block chain and AI in trade to ensure efficiency and transparency. Moreover, ensuring inclusive digital transformation by addressing gaps in digital literacy, particularly among marginalized communities, will enhance regional participation. Scaling Fujisoft's training programs to various districts in West Bengal can ensure a steady supply of skilled workers, promoting broader access to digital opportunities.

Sustainability remains a core focus, with BCC&I emphasizing the need for sustainable development initiatives across the Indo-Pacific, particularly in clean energy and green technologies. Leveraging global commitments, such as Japan's \$75 billion Indo-Pacific infrastructure initiative, will further enhance India's role in promoting sustainable and inclusive growth in the region. By cultivating partnerships in technology and innovation, BCC&I can address pressing challenges like climate action and economic development.

To foster sustainable development through technological cooperation, BCC&I should support B2B platforms connecting innovators across Indo-Pacific nations, facilitating technology transfer for inclusive economic growth. Enhancing cross-sector collaboration between governments, the private sector, and research institutions will ensure that technological innovations are responsive to local needs, scalable, and effective in addressing challenges like poverty and energy access.

By diversifying global trade partnerships and exploring new trade agreements, BCC&I can counter declines in global trade volumes and reduce reliance on single-country supply chains. Supporting domestic manufacturing and agricultural reforms will further strengthen India's competitiveness and enhance global export opportunities. Finally, prioritizing financial empowerment and digital literacy through micro-loan programs and educational campaigns will enhance financial inclusion, particularly in rural areas.

The Indo-Pacific Economic Conclave 2024 received substantial coverage in both print and social media.
